## **LOCATION #1:** Along Sixth Avenue between Laurel and Quince streets

- 1. Concern re emergency vehicle access under Concept plan with median and 2 lanes plus parking on Sixth Ave.
- 2. Is it possible to add traffic signal so cars don't have the distance to speed up?
- 3. Radar speed indicators are already proposed and funded separate of this project.
- 4. Add trees to proposed street medians.
- 5. Crossing intersections are spaced too far apart to allow for "more convenient" access to and from Balboa Avenue across 6<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- 6. No right turn at Quince [from Sixth into the Park] prevents slower traffic from using Balboa Drive.
- 7. Countdown timer on pedestrian crossing.
- 8. Cobblestone or decorative crosswalk surface.
- Pedestrian bridge over 6<sup>th</sup> Ave is safest approach to park and establishes a monumental entry to park.
- 10. Alternative to signals, if not warranted.

#### Yes 3 - Some problems:

- Consistent w/ the Canyonlands concept, have a greenway to link canyon beyond Quince to Balboa Park.
- 2. Obstacles like parking blocks in an area where the pedestrian way and parking lot are "blurred".
- 3. Development of Quince between 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> should not impair visibility.
- 4. Create a Greenway between canyon and Park, instead of more parking with one lane of travel.
- 5. Add traffic signals at 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> at Quince to slow traffic.

## **LOCATION #3:** Along Nutmeg Street between Fourth and Fifth avenues
