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City Receives Pilot Village Applications

Applicants represent San Diego's diverse neighborhoods.

SAN DIEGO – Eight applications have been received as part of the City's Pilot Village program. The submittals represent a broad spectrum of groups including: business associations, developers, non-profits, civic associations, and community coalitions. Most of the applications involve a collaborative effort between two or more groups, a key goal of the program. The eight proposed pilot villages are dispersed geographically throughout the City. All applications will now be considered for participation in the program.

The Pilot Village program will serve as a catalyst for implementing the City of Villages strategy adopted by the City Council in October 2002. This program is designed to help existing communities create a village atmosphere, where housing, jobs, schools, public facilities, and neighborhood services come together in one location. The City hopes to use the pilot villages as a learning experience on how to implement the City of Villages strategy throughout San Diego.

"We are thrilled with the enthusiastic response generated by the Pilot Village Program," said Planning Director Gail Goldberg. "Hundreds of volunteer hours and a tremendous amount of community outreach went into each submittal. Pilot villages can bridge the gap between the grand vision and reality, as well as address Mayor Murphy's challenge to 'create neighborhoods we can be proud of.' The pilot villages selected will truly model the possibilities that exist in every community in San Diego."

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Applications will be reviewed against a set of criteria and a short-list determined by summer of 2003. Short-listed applicants will be invited to develop more detailed project proposals. Final pilot village selection by the City Council is anticipated in early 2004.

The eight applications received by the March 14, 2003 deadline include:
