Restore and enhance the historical and scenic integrity of Route 163. The project is to enhance this section of the highway corridor in Balboa Park. Work will include: replace existing fencing, soil treatment to prevent weeds at barrier rail, highway planting, irrigation, plant establishment, retaining features, pruning, and accent lighting. Existing Square Feet: 30.9 acres

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: This project would enhance the historic Highway 163 with new plantings, fencing, irrigation, and weed prevention.

<u>Applicant Presentation</u>: We would like to give you an update with what we are doing on Highway 163. This is a \$4 million Transportation Enhancement Project. Everything we are doing in corridor is consistent with the Management Plan. All of the plant material is consistent with Management Plan. We are trying to preserve many of the mature trees and vegetation that are existing. We will be cleaning up the dead material. Our project is centered on landscaping and adding irrigation. Within in the historic district, we will be working on the median area. We are hoping to put sod in the entire median area if the money permits. We are investing in infrastructure that should last for the next 20 years. We are also adding some fairly large trees. We will be pruning approximately 300 trees and taking down dead trees. We hope to start construction in December 2013 and then have plant establishment in November 2014.
