NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS INVITED TO LEARN HOW TO APPLY TO THE CITY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012 ARTS AND CULTURE FUNDING

The City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission) will host workshops in September and October to assist with the application and review processes for FY 2012 funding for arts and culture programs. The City supports art and culture through two programs that provide funding to non-profit organizations through a competitive review process – the Organizational Support Program (OSP) and the Creative Communities San Diego Program (CCSD). Workshop topics will include eligibility requirements, eligible programs and services, how to apply, funding restrictions, and matching requirements. Funding is for projects and programming that occur between July 1, 2011 and June 30, 2012.
