**I. Call to Order & Welcome New Members**

**III. Presentation – Reprise of Public Art Five in Five from the 2011 Public Art Preconference**

On behalf of Jessica Hanson York, Dana Springs presented “Modern Love.” Sherri Brueggemann called in from Albuquerque to remotely present “The Fermi Paradox.” Vernon Franck’s presentation was postponed to a later meeting.

Members of the PAC shared details of their experiences at the Public Art Preconference and the Annual Americans for the Arts Convention.

**VI. Chair’s Report**

1. Commission News – Reed reported that the Commission’s budget for FY12 remained flat.
2. Other Reports – Reed reported that Commission Executive Director, Victoria Hamilton, received the Ray Hanley Innovation Award from the United States Urban Arts Federation in recognition of her outstanding individual contribution to arts and culture in an American city.

**VII. Presentation – Selections from the Civic Art Collection**

Springs presented information about prints by Ando Hiroshige and etchings by William Hogarth.

**VIII. Staff Reports**

1. City Heights Square Mini Park – Springs reported that the artist, Wendell Kling, held a meeting with members of the community to gather input prior to beginning work on a schematic art proposal.
2. Southcrest Trails Park – Springs reported that Commission staff is collaborating with the artist team, Ingram Ober and Marisol Rendon, to set a date and time for a community meeting to gather input prior to beginning work on a schematic art proposal.
3. Aztec Brewery Collection Conservation Project – Springs reported that the City has been awarded Community Development Block Grant funds to implement the conservation project. The project will span July 1, 2011 to December 31, 2012.
4. City Heights Documentation Project – Springs reported that the Executive Director of the Commission considered the feedback from the PAC and decided to proceed such that the City will own the resultant artwork and loan it to the La Maestra Family Clinic.
5. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative Art Project – Springs reported that an extension to the cooperative agreement between Caltrans and the City has been negotiated and an artwork is scheduled to be installed by the end of 2011.
6. Professional Development Opportunities for Artists – Springs reported that *Becoming a Facebook Ninja for Beginners*, a hands-on workshop held in March, served 12 artists. Springs reported that the free educational webinars screened in April (Artist Contracts) and in May (Green Building) served 15 and 6 artists, respectively. Springs reported that the next scheduled professional development

opportunity for San Diego artists is *Internet for Artists*, a curriculum developed and presented by Creative Capital, to be held December 2-4, 2011 at the offices of The San Diego Foundation. Commission staff will conduct a competitive selection process to enter 24 regional, diverse, multi-disciplinary artists in the course.
