


SKYLINE HILLS BRANCH LIBRARY PUBLIC ART PROJECT

BY ACTUAL SIZE ARTWORKS (GAIL SIMPSON & ARISTOTLE GEORGIADES)




The proposed artwork consists of two sculptures to be sited on the outdoor wall space on both sides of the entrance, and for two suspended sculptures inside the entry. The interior sculptures will be visible through the glass, creating a sense of connection between outside and inside. The sculptures are based on clusters of flying creatures that resemble birds, butterflies and moths.





The light dancing off the silver surface will change depending on the time of day and season.



Three additional sculptures appear inside the library's reading room beneath three of the interior lights, like moths around a light bulb. This is a reference to the way the library will attract and draw in the residents, eager to use the library for research, reading, or as a gathering place.



The sculptures embody the sense of curiosity the artists' associate with the library.



The artwork is scaled to hold its own visually in the context of the library architecture – they will feel substantial to the viewer but not overwhelming in the space. Each cluster is proposed to be approximately 5'-6' in its longest dimension.
