At this meeting, the artists will be showing images of their past work and will ask for your input about:

- Prominent images, geography or landmarks in your neighborhood
- The history and character of your neighborhood
- Notable local folks and their personal histories
- Legends, folklore and anecdotes about your neighborhood
- What your neighborhood is most known for
- Anything else you think is important!

Since this is the very first step in developing a new public artwork for the East Village Park which will run along 14th Street, between Island and J Streets, we hope you can attend this meeting. But if you can't, the artists will be accepting input through **Friday, August 11, 2006**.
