One Paseo will add 24,000 new car trips daily on our roads, further deterring residents from biking and walking in the community. Expanding Del Mar Heights Road to nine lanes (wider than most freeways) will mean faster-moving cars and dangerous conditions for both cyclists and pedestrians. The proposed "cycletrack" will offer inadequate protection to those cycling in the area, as it will run for just a few hundred yards on one side of Del Mar Heights Road.
