Dear Councilmember Lightner:

The City of San Diego is at a critical juncture in determining its future and how it will accommodate its projected population and employment growth. Will we continue to cave to each and every community that opposes more dense mixed-use development where people can live, walk to retail and dining, and work? If we do so, then we most certainly set the stage for increased shortages in housing supply, declining opportunity for job growth, and loss of young talent and knowledge-based business to those cities that have created vibrant, walkable, mixed-use districts. The One Paseo project in Carmel Valley exemplifies the type of mixed-use development that our city should be encouraging throughout the region. If our city had initially grown with the type of development as proposed in One Paseo, our freeways wouldn't be as congested, our air not as polluted, and our worker productivity not as wasted by spending hours per week in traffic. The One Paseo project introduces San Diego to a departure from the isolated Orwellian office parks of the last century where social interaction is absent and cars are needed to eat lunch, run errands, and commute to and from work each and every day.

As a consultant to many other cities throughout the western United States, I can testify first-hand that the vast majority of my clients would welcome with open arms a project like One Paseo in their city. The One Paseo project is the precise type of district where many businesses, young professionals, and local retailers and restaurateurs want to live, work, and operate.

Many of the critics of One Paseo have compared its proposed density to that of downtown San Diego. Quite the alarmist hyperbole! Simply put, this project does **not** bring downtown densities to Carmel Valley. One Paseo's Floor Area Ratio ("FAR") of 1.4:1 is far below the FAR found downtown. Most of downtown requires a minimum density of 3.0:1 or greater with maximum FAR ranging from 6:1 to 20:1. To have comparable density at the One Paseo site, it would need to have between 5.8 million and 18.9 million square feet! At 1.4 million square feet, One Paseo is not even close to downtown density.

The 246,500 square feet of retail space will provide entry-level jobs, shopping and dining in a main street-style setting, while the 484,000 square feet of office commercial will provide state-of-the-art office space for high-wage jobs. Together, these two uses will create 1,590 permanent jobs, generate \$154 million in annual wages, contribute \$1 million in new revenue to the City of San Diego every single year, and lead to \$630 million in new economic activity. Furthermore, with 608 units of housing planned, One Paseo will provide residences ranging from 750 to 1,400 square feet in size, with an average size of 1,129 square feet. This means that One Paseo will offer moderately-priced workforce housing in Carmel Valley,

where single family homes typically sell for between \$1 million to \$2 million.

When the City of Villages strategy was adopted in 2008, One Paseo was exactly the type of density and diversity of uses envisioned by the plan for communities all over San Diego. This site in Carmel Valley is extremely well-suited for this project, because it is close to I-5 and is situated on a route formerly served by transit. Transit is scheduled to be reinstated in the future, and this project could serve as a catalyst.

On top of all these benefits, the project is going to be one of the most environmentally sustainable developments in the city's history. One Paseo will be the Gold Standard for City of Villages-type development for many years to come. We shouldn't let false rhetoric stand in the way of embracing a great project.

If we continue to allow the vocal minority in each of our neighborhoods to stifle new well-designed mixed-use development, then I ask you how we will economically grow as a city and compete with other cities that are surpassing San Diego in smart growth land use patterns. I respectfully urge the City Council to approve the One Paseo project.

I am especially concerned about the impacts to traffic congestion in the area, given that One Paseo will increase traffic by 370 percent and add nearly 24,000 daily car trips to our roads. All of this will lead to gridlock, especially given that the effectiveness of the proposed traffic light synchronization system has not been proven, nor has Caltrans or the City committed to its implementation. In fact, the project's Environmental Impact Report shows significant, unmitigated impacts to eight intersections and road segments. Furthermore, traffic relief near the project site depends on new freeway connectors that will not be built until 2030, if ever.

The majority of our community believes that THIS One Paseo is too large for the neighborhood. The Carmel Valley, Torrey Pines, Torrey Hills and Del Mar Mesa Community Planning Boards, as well as the San Diego Planning Commission, have already rejected One Paseo. I'm standing with more than 6,000 members of my community to oppose the project and urge you to reject it.

Please don't consign Carmel Valley to a future of extreme congestion and hair-pulling traffic jams. Reject One Paseo and ask Kilroy to work with the community to propose an appropriately sized project.

Although it has been marketed as smart growth, an honest examination of the project shows that One Paseo is not the type of bikeable, walkable, transit-oriented development San Diego deserves.

One Paseo will add 24,000 new car trips daily on our roads, further deterring residents from biking and walking in the community. Expanding Del Mar Heights Road to nine lanes will mean faster-moving cars and dangerous conditions for both cyclists and pedestrians. The proposed "cycletrack" will offer inadequate protection to those cycling in the area, as it will run for just a few hundred yards on one side of Del Mar Heights Road. Bike San Diego, the group working to transform San Diego into the world's best city for bicycling, has called One Paseo "bad for bicycling."
