As you know, the controversial One Paseo project has been vigorously debated in the community for the past several years. Thousands of local residents and tens of thousands of San Diegans have raised serious concerns about the project. Four community planning boards rejected One Paseo and now more are speaking out about the dangerous precedent its approval set for development in the City.

By ignoring the Carmel Valley, Del Mar Mesa, Torrey Pines and Torrey Hills community planning boards, the City Council sent a message that the feedback from planning groups has a negligible impact on land use decisions, and thus community planning groups have no important role to play in future development of their neighborhoods. I could not disagree more.
