ITEM-S400: Approval of Ordinances Placing Barrio Logan Community Plan Referendum Measures on the June 3, 2014, Municipal Special Election Ballot, and Related Resolutions.

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Request that the City Council adopt the ordinances in Subitems A and C, to place on the June 3, 2014 Municipal Special Election ballot and adopt the resolutions in Subitems B and D, directing the preparation of related ballot materials.

CITY CLERK'S RECOMMENDATION:

Introduce and adopt the ordinances in Subitems A and C; and adopt the resolutions in Subitems B and D:

Subitem-A: (O-2014-84)

Introduction and adoption of an Ordinance submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego, for their approval or rejection at the Municipal Special Election, consolidated with the California State Primary Election to be held on June 3, 2014, Ordinance No. O-20312, amending the San Diego Municipal Code relating to the Barrio Logan Community Plan Update; and Ordinance No. O-20313, changing the zoning of 999.61 acres located within the Barrio Logan Community Plan Area.

NOTE: Subitem A is not subject to the Mayor's veto.

Subitem-B: (R-2014-438)

ITEM-S402: **Notice** of Pending Final Map Approval - The Village at Pacific Highlands Ranch Units 2 and 3.

Notice is hereby given that the City Engineer has reviewed and will approve on the date of this City Council meeting that certain final map entitled "The Village at Pacific Highlands Ranch Units 2 and 3" (V.T.M. No. 1113594, PTS No. 335209) located on the northeast corner of "Carmel Valley Road and Village Center Loop Road", in the CC-1-2 zone, within the Pacific Highlands Ranch District 1, a copy of which is available for public viewing at the office of the San Diego City Clerk. Specifically, the City Engineer has caused the map to be examined and has made the following findings:

- (1) The map substantially conforms to the approved tentative map, and any approved alterations thereof and any conditions of approval imposed with said tentative map.
- (2) The map complies with the provisions of the Subdivision Map Act and any local ordinances applicable at the time of approval of the tentative map.
- (3) The map is technically correct.

Said map will be finalized and recorded unless a valid appeal is filed. Interested parties will have 10 calendar days from the date of this Council hearing to appeal the above findings of the City Engineer to the City Council. A valid appeal must be filed with the City Clerk no later than 2:00 PM, 10 calendar days from the date of this City Council meeting stating briefly which of the above findings made by the City Engineer was improper or incorrect and the basis for that conclusion.
