**BALLOT PROPOSITIONS
FORWARDED TO CITY COUNCIL**

The Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations Committee has voted to forward for further discussion, without a Committee recommendation, a proposal that could result in a ballot proposition on the November 4, 2014 ballot.

The proposed measure will be discussed by the Council, with consideration of the options to vote to place it on the ballot, or to consider its enactment as a Council ordinance. The Committee also requested City staff to take all necessary steps to comply with the City's obligations as a public agency employer related to the proposed ordinance or ballot measure, including compliance with the Meyers-Milias Brown Act and San Diego Charter section 70.2. The measure is:

ONE PROPOSITION AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE, BY ADDING DIVISION 46, SECTIONS 22.4601 THROUGH 22.4617, RELATING TO THE EARNED SICK LEAVE AND MINIMUM WAGE TO BE PROVIDED TO EMPLOYEES WORKING IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Consideration of this proposal by the Council will be noticed in the Council docket. A hearing regarding the City's obligations as a public agency employer related to the measure is scheduled for June 16, 2014, as noticed in the Council agenda.
