CS-1 *Johnneisha Kemper v. County of San Diego, et al.*

San Diego Superior Court Case No. 37-2010-00094707-CR-CU-CTL

This case arises from an incident which occurred on May 24, 2008. On that date, City of San Diego police officers took Johnneisha Kemper's seven-day-old daughter into protective custody. Ms. Kemper alleges the officers did not possess sufficient reasonable cause, thereby violating her civil rights under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. The City Attorney's Office will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.

CS-2 *Guadalupe Pomposo v. City of San Diego*
