SCS-1 Jane Doe v. City of San Diego, et al.

United States District Court Case No. 12-cv-0689-MMA (DHB)

This case arises from alleged misconduct by former San Diego Police Officer Anthony Arevalos. The City Attorney’s Office will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.

This Closed Session item relates to litigation concerning the validity of the Convention Center Facilities District formation, landowner election, and special tax to facilitate funding of the expansion of the convention center. SCS-3 *San Diegans for Open Government v. City of San Diego, et al.*

This case arises from San Diegans for Open Government's demand to inspect and then obtain copies of each and every email, text-message and voice mail communication (regardless of whether the account used was public or private) between Council President Gloria and his staff with any other person (regardless of the number of authors or recipients in the communication, but excluding communications strictly between Council President Gloria and his staff), concerning any item that appeared on any City Council agenda (excluding "proclamations/ceremonial items" and "consent items") between January 1, 2013, and April 24, 2013. Representatives from the City Attorney's Office will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.

SCS-4 *San Diegans for Open Government v. Jan Goldsmith, et al.*

San Diego Superior Court Case No. 37-2014-0000217-CU-MC-CTL

DCA Assigned: C. Richardson; and Jacqueline Vinaccia, Lounsbery Ferguson Altona & Peak LLP

This case arises from San Diegans for Open Government's allegations that the City Attorney is conducting official City of San Diego business from his personal e-mail account in violation of the California Public Records Act, the California Constitution, and San Diego Charter (Charter), and is wasting taxpayer money by, among other things, communicating with the media and exercising his duties and obligations under Charter Section 40. Representatives from the City Attorney's Office and outside counsel will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.
