ITEM-203: Hotel Churchill (827 C Street) - Owner Participation Agreement. (East Village Neighborhood of the Downtown Community Plan Area. District 3.)

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Hotel Churchill is a 94-unit Single Room Occupancy hotel, which was acquired by the San Diego Housing Commission (SDHC), in 2011 through a judicial foreclosure proceeding. The seven-story structure (over a basement), is approximately 100 years old and is a locally-designated historic building. The property has been vacant since 2005, and is in significant disrepair. The Project requires substantial rehabilitation to make it habitable. SDHC selected Housing Development Partners (HDP), a subsidiary of SDHC, as the developer for the rehabilitation project. The property is owned by SDHC, and will be leased to the Developer through a 65-year lease.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the following resolution:

(R-2015-249)

Finding and determining that all recitals set forth in this Resolution a true and correct and fully incorporated herein by this reference;

Declaring the environmental effects of the Project were adequately addressed in the 2006 Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR), and the Addenda, and the Project is within the scope of the development program described therein;

Adopting the following findings and determinations with respect to the environmental effects of the Project:

- (a) No substantial changes are proposed in the Centre City Redevelopment Project, or with respect, to the circumstances under which the Centre City Redevelopment Project is to be undertaken, as a result of the Project, which will require important or major revisions in the 2006 Final EIR or the Addenda; and
- (b) No new information or substantial importance to the Centre City Redevelopment Project has become available, which was not known or could not have been known at the time the 2006 Final EIR was certified as complete, and which shows that the Project will have any significant effects not discussed previously in the 2006 Final EIR or the Addenda, or that any significant effects previously examined will be substantially more severe than shown in the 2006 Final EIR or the Addenda, or that any mitigation measures, or alternatives previously found not to be feasible, or not previously considered would substantially reduce or lessen any significant effects on the environment; and

(c) No negative declaration, subsequent Environmental Impact Report, or Supplement or further Addendum to the 2006 Final EIR is necessary or required; and

(d) The Project will have no significant effect on the environment, except as identified and considered in the 2006 Final EIR and the Addenda, and no new or additional project-specific mitigation measures are required in connection with the Project; and

(e) The Project would not have any new effects that were not adequately covered in the 2006 Final EIR or the Addenda, and therefore, the Project is within the scope of the Development Program approved under the 2006 Final EIR and the Addenda;

Determining that pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Sections 15162 and 15168, that no further Environmental Documentation is required to address the potential environmental effects of the Project.

Approving the Agreement, including all attachments and exhibits thereto;

Declaring that contingent upon the City Comptroller first issuing a certificate stating that the funds are available, the Council authorizes the Chief Financial Officer, as delegated, to encumber and expend an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000, including \$769,484.34 derived from Housing Bond Proceeds and \$2,230,515.66 derived from the Housing Asset Fund to provide the City Loan in accordance with the Agreement;

Authorizing, and directing the Mayor, or designee, to execute the Agreement, including all Attachments and Exhibits thereto requiring the City's signature;

Authorizing and directing the Mayor, or designee, to sign all documents necessary and appropriate to carry out and implement the Agreement and to administer the City's obligations, responsibilities, and duties to be performed under the Agreement, including all attachments and exhibits thereto.
