CS-1 *Brian Hernandez & Kevin Hernandez v. City of San Diego, et al.*
United States District Court Case No. 14cv0591 GPC (JLB)

This case arises from an incident in the Mid-City area, near 50th Street and Trojan Avenue. Plaintiffs Brian and Kevin Hernandez allege that they were falsely arrested and the use of force in the arrest was unreasonable. The City Attorney's Office will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.

CS-2 *City of San Diego, et al. v. Michael Cohen, et al.*
Sacramento Superior Court Case No. 34-2013-80001410

This case arises from the decision in connection with ROPS 3 by the California Department of Finance to invalidate the Long Term Debt Agreement between the City of San Diego and the Redevelopment Agency. The City Attorney's Office will update the Mayor and City Council on the status of the litigation and seek direction.

This item will be discussed with the San Diego City Council in its capacity as: (i) the legislative body of the City of San Diego, and (ii) the board of the local redevelopment successor agency, officially known as the City of San Diego, solely in its capacity as the designated successor agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego, a former public body, corporate and politic (Successor Agency).
