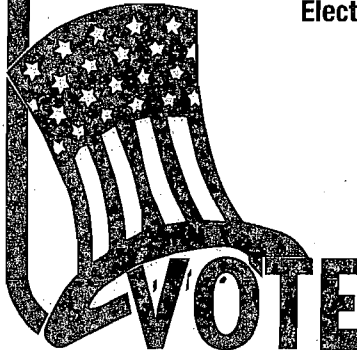

OPPOSE new taxes – city politician's wasteful spending is the real problem.

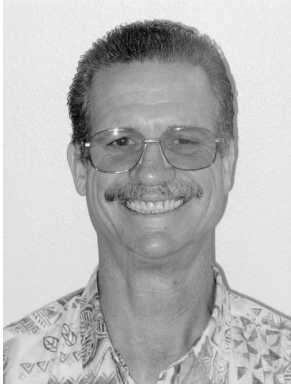
