SUBJECT: Stop Signs and Cross walks at East Ocean Air Drive and Fairport Way in Torrey Hills

In accordance with Council Policy 200-08, I request the immediate installation of stop signs at the following intersection in order to make it an all-way stop:

East Ocean Air Drive and Fairport Way

Additionally, I am requesting painted pedestrian cross walks at East Ocean Air and Fairport Way adjacent to the Ocean Air Elementary School.

After receiving a petition with nearly 200 signatures from the community, the Torrey Hills Community Planning Board held a publicly noticed hearing on the installation of these stop signs at its regularly meeting on September 21, 2010. After hearing public testimony, the Board voted unanimously to support the installation. Attached please find a letter from the Chair of the Torrey Hills Community Planning Board requesting that my office expedite this process.
