One Paseo to be Heard in Council Chambers on February 23rd

The proposed One Paseo development project in Carmel Valley will be heard on Monday, February 23, 2015 at 2:00 p.m. in Council Chambers at the City Administration Building, 202 C Street, 12th Floor, 92101.

Members of the public are encouraged to provide their input, either in advance to sherrilightner@sandiego.gov or in person at the hearing.

Everyone wishing to speak at the hearing will be given the opportunity to speak before the Council. Individuals will be

given 1 minute per person. Due to the expected attendance, Council Chambers will be open at 12:30 p.m., and seating is on a first come, first serve basis. Seats may not be reserved.

An overflow room will be set up in the rooms above Golden Hall next to City Hall. A live streaming of the proceedings will be available at that location.

The hearing will also be broadcast live on CityTV, Channel 24, and online at www.sandiego.gov.

Torrey Pines Corridor Improvement Project Has Begun

Construction on the first phase of the Torrey Pines Corridor Project has started.

The Torrey Pines Corridor Project will provide a series of innovative traffic calming concepts to enhance circulation of vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic.

The first phase will involve clearing obstructions, repairing sunken or damaged


sidewalks, and constructing new ADA-accessible curb ramps on the north and west sides (ocean sides) of Torrey Pines Road.

Additionally, a new section of sidewalk is being installed on the south and east sides (inland side) of Torrey Pines Road between Roseland Dr. and Calle Juela.

Charter Committee Updates and Upcoming Agenda Items

In February, the Charter Review Committee voted to clean up several charter sections that simply needed to be removed. For instance, Section 76, Limit of Tax Levy, has been superseded by Proposition 13 and so the Committee recommended its removal. The Committee referred other sections to various city departments for more information before making a decision. The Committee's March 5

agenda includes the Grand Jury's suggestions regarding salary setting for the City's elected officials, changes to redistricting, a preamble to the Charter and a prohibition on regressive taxes. The People's Ordinance (trash pick-up), referendum and recall process, zoo tax and Citizen's Review Board on Police Practices will be considered in the coming months. The Charter Review Commit-

tee meets on Thursdays at 2:00 p.m. at the City Administration Building (CAB) Committee Room, 12th Floor, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The next two meetings will be on March 5, 2015 and April 16, 2015. Please see the [Charter Review Committee webpage](#) for additional meeting dates. District One Pools Open Early This Year

Both the Carmel Valley Pool and Swanson Pool in University City will open early this year due to additional funding from the Council District One office Community Projects, Programs and Services (CPPS) budget.

Swanson Pool will open to the public in March, offering both classes and recreational swim. The Carmel Valley Pool was scheduled to open

in early February, but unfortunately, a leak was discovered. Park & Recreation staff have announced that repairs will take approximately 2 weeks, allowing the pool to be open by the end of February 2015.

Both pools offer safety classes, swim lessons, competitive swim, and water polo. The Carmel Valley Pool also has two water slides.

New Parks in District 1: UC Tot Lot and Solana Ranch



UC Village Park on the corner of Florey and Gullstrand will get a new Tot Lot in 2015.

The **University Village Park** will soon be getting a long-awaited Tot-Lot. The Tot Lot is a project that our office has been working on since 2012. We were able to secure \$300,000 in funding from developer fees. Additional funding was going to come from an infrastructure bond. As of January 2015, the City was able to proceed with issuing

the bond. The project is planned to install play equipment, a drinking fountain, benches and a picnic table at the park.

Solana Ranch Park (formerly Gonzales Canyon Park) is now open in Pacific Highlands Ranch. The new park boasts new playing fields, basketball courts, a children's play area, a picnic

shelter and a new comfort station. Amenities include new picnic tables and BBQs.
