Serving up Restaurant relief

A side order of music may now be served at many family restaurants in San Diego, as the City Council voted recently to ease the restrictions of a local entertainment permit. Family restaurants, defined as establishments that close by 11 p.m., don't charge admission, don't have drink minimums and don't encourage customer dancing, will no longer need the \$3,000 annual entertainment permit in order to have minimal live music like a piano player, singer or small jazz group. Current rules make it difficult and expensive for restaurants to offer live entertainment, a



key factor that helps attract customers and strengthens our local business. The new rules go into effect in about a month. Prior to the Nov. 8 council vote, Council President, Councilmembers Lorie Zapf, Kevin Faulconer and David Alvarez joined Corvette Diner restaurant owner Lesley Cohn and executive leaders of the California Restaurant Association at a press conference prior to speak out in support of the municipal code amendments that will aid family restaurants by rolling back requirements.

CHOLLAS VIEW COMMUNITY CLEAN UP

Each year the City of San Diego's Environmental Services Department conducts a number of special community clean-up events in neighborhoods throughout the region.
