That is all about to change!

As it stands today, Holly Drive is On Tuesday, July 16, 2013, I led the effort to take the necessary actions to begin the Holly Drive Street Improvements Project. The property owners along Holly Drive will realize an immediate benefit when the street and right-of-way are brought up to City standards. The City will install the much-needed infrastruc-

ture--to include curbs, gutters, sidewalks, street pavement, retaining walls, street lights, fences, curbs ramps, driveways, on and off-site drainage, parkway street trees, and traffic calming speed bumps, along Holly Drive between South Willie James Jones Avenue and South Euclid Avenue. These improvements will enhance pedestrian safety and provide a safe route to school for students who attend nearby schools.

I'm proud to do my part to make this \$2 million investment in our District a reality. The City will advertise the project this Fall and begin construction in early 2014. You sent me to City Hall because you want safe and livable neighborhoods. I intend to deliver just that!

The Southeastern San Diego Community Plan (adopted June 4, 1987) is one of the older plans in San Diego. The City of San Diego is currently in the process of updating the Southeastern San Diego Community Plan - one of over 40 such plans in the City-through an in-depth, community-based planning process that will engage the broadest possible range of stakeholders. The current community plan will be divided into two separate community plans - one for Southeastern and one for the Encanto Neighborhoods.

Why is this important? Community Plans serve as community-specific "Land Use Constitutions" and establish the vision for long-term growth. As we continue to grapple with the elimination of redevelopment agencies, this effort is critical in order to attract investment and appropriate infrastructure and development to our neighborhoods. The updated Community Plans will convey community goals, objectives and recommendations with an emphasis on sustainable design principles and policies, all of which will be clearly outlined in an illustrative, graphically based, action oriented planning document.

The focus of this upcoming public workshop is to gather feedback, educate and inform the public on research and data collected, and discuss and incorporate the community's input into the plan update. The workshop is open to the public and is meant to be inclusive and transparent. I encourage you all to attend and participate.

Ang Kaligtasan ng Publiko at Imprastraktura ay aking simbuyo ng damdamin

Sa lahat ng mga balita na pumapalibot sa City Hall, ako'y pananatiling nakatutok sa mga paggawa ng mga pagpapabuti sa mga kalye at bangketa sa Konseho ng Distrito Four. Nakikipagtulungan sa marami sa inyo at ang mga grupo ng komunidad ng distrito, kami ay nakatali para magawa ang isang bilang ng aming mga priority. Gusto kong samantalahin ang pagkakataong ito upang i-highlight ang aming pinakahuling katuparan: pagpapabuti ng kaley ng Holly Drive.

Sa Martes, Hulyo 16, 2013, ako pinangunahan sa pagsisikap na gawin ang mga kinakailangang aksyon upang simulan ang proyekto ng pagbubuti ng kalye ng Holly Drive. Ang may-ari ng ari-arian sa kahabaan ng Holly Drive ay mauunawaan nang mabilis na pakinabang kapag ang kalye at karapatan ng daanan sa ibang bansa ay dinadala ng hanggang Lungsod ng pamantayan. Ang City ay i-install ang mahigit na kinakailan-gang imprastraktura - upang kasama ang mga curbs, gutters, bangketa, aspaltong kalye, napananatili ang mga pader, tinatawirang kalye, mga ilaw, pader, curb ramps, kanal, at trapiko sa pagpapatahimik ng bilis ng mga nagmamaneho, sa kalye ng Holly Drive sa pagitan ng South Willie James Jones Avenue at South Euclid Avenue. Ito ay mga pagpapabuti sa kaligtasan ng mga taong tumatawid at magbigay ng isang ligtas na ruta sa paaralan para sa mga estudyante na pumapasok sa Lincoln High School. Ang City ay mag a-advertise ng proyektong ito ngayong Taglagas at simulan ang konstruksyon sa unang bahagi ng 2014.

Kayo ang nagpadala sa akin sa City Hall dahil gusto ninyo na ang mga matitirahan at kapitbahayan ay ligtas at madaling pakisamahan. Binabalak kong ihatid lahat ito sa inyo!

Mi pasión por la Seguridad Pública e Infraestructura

Con todas las noticias que rodean este Ayuntamiento, me voy a concentrar en mejorar las calles y banquetas en el Cuarto Distrito. Trabajando con muchos de ustedes, y los grupos de la comunidad del barrio, estamos obligados a cumplir una serie de prioridades. Quiero aprovechar esta oportunidad para reflejar nuestro logro más reciente-la mejora de la Calle Holly.

Tal como está hoy, la Calle Holly es una carretera sin mejorar, banquetas ausentes y el drenaje adecuado. Los alumnos, padres y nietos que viajan hacia y desde la Escuela Secundaria Lincoln no han tenido más remedio que caminar por caminos de tierra sin pavimentar. También se utiliza como un acceso directo para los conductores que quieren evitar el tráfico en la concurrida Avenida Imperial.

El martes 16 de julio del 2013, tome el esfuerzo necesario para iniciar el Proyecto de Mejorar la Calle Holly. Los dueños de propiedades a lo largo de la Calle Holly se darán cuenta de un beneficio inmediato cuando las calles sean presentadas a la altura de la ciudad. El Ayuntamiento instalará la infraestructura necesaria para incluir los bordillos, cunetas, banquetas, pavimento de las calles, muros de contención, luces en las calles, cercos, rampas de bordillos, entrada de coches, drenaje, reductores de velocidad, esto sucederá entre el Sur de Avenida Willie James Jones y el Sur de la Avenida Euclid. Estos mejoramientos aumentarán la seguridad de los peatones y proporcionar una ruta segura a la escuela para los estudiantes que asisten a la Escuela Secundaria Lincoln.

Estoy orgullosa de mi parte para hacer esta inversión de \$2 millones en nuestro distrito una realidad.

La Ciudad anunciara el proyecto este otoño e iniciar la construcción a principios del año 2014. Ustedes me enviaron al Ayuntamiento porque quieren vecindarios seguros y habitables. Tengo la intención de ofrecer exactamente eso!
