COUNCIL ACTIONS:

On Tuesday, July 13, 2010, the San Diego City Council approved over \$10.5 million in funding for paving various streets throughout the 4th District. This action by the Council continues my efforts to ensure we have street and road improvement projects throughout communities in the 4th District.

On Tuesday, July 13, 2010, the San Diego City Council authorized an application for \$2.8 million in Statewide Park Program Grant Funds for the 4th District's Home Avenue Neighborhood Park. I commend and thank my fellow Council members for supporting my efforts to continue improving the quality of life of residents in the 4th District with an additional park for youth and families to enjoy.
