COUNCIL ACTIONS:

On Monday, May 12, 2008 the San Diego City Council did not approve a late night, last minute proposal by the Mayor's Labor Negotiating Team to change the Pension Plan for city employees. Unfortunately, certain newspapers and local talk radio show host are giving the public the impression that the Council may have been wrong in their decision to not support the proposal. However, my decision to not support the proposal was based on several factors including: (A). the public and the Council was informed that the issue we would be considering was the Mayor's "Last Best and Final Offer" to the Unions and neither side could reach agreement and therefore the Council was to accept the proposal or reject it without any changes. (B). The Independent Budget Analyst (IBA) had presented (5) different pension options, some of which would save the tax payers more money than the pension plan that was offered by the Mayor's team. (C). A member of the Mayor's team admitted to the Council that one of the pension options would save the taxpayers more money that what was proposed by them. (D). At approximately 10:00 p.m. at night, the Mayor's Labor Negotiating Team presented the Council with a different pension



proposal and asked the Council to vote on it immediately without the benefit of public input or further analysis.

I am very aware that past decisions by other Councils regarding pension plans helped create an unprecedented fiscal crisis for this city. They too had information presented to them in such a manner that resulted in decisions that proved detrimental to the citizens of San Diego. I did not support making a last minute decision, in the middle of the night, on information hastily prepared and presented to us by the Mayor's negotiating team.

Selecting a pension plan for the City's employees is a very important decision we will make. It will impact this city's finances for decades to come and it will impact the well being of our employees and their families for decades to come. This is a decision that requires careful, thoughtful, analytical and prudent consideration, and the involvement and cooperation from all parties. It is my hope and desire that the Mayor's negotiating team and the Unions go back to the table and carefully consider options presented by the IBA, as well as other potential options, with the goal in mind of together creating and agreeing upon a quality, cost effective retirement plan, this city can be proud of.
