Coming Home to Stay Project Manager

PAYRATE: 40,000 - \$45,000 per year plus competitive benefits package

CLASSIFICATION: Exempt, full-time; Coming Home to Stay is a community-based pilot project in City Heights and southeastern San Diego, designed by formerly incarcerated residents and providers to reduce the number of residents returning to prison. The Project is anchored in creating a "community of caring" to prepare, transition, and sustain residents who are coming home. An alliance of providers works together to assess and refer participants to the appropriate program and services. Peer mentors serve as role models and coaches and a network of quality community resources assures access and support in six areas: 1) Assessment and Life Plan; 2) Legal and Vital Documents; 3) Housing and Finance; 4) Education, Training and Employment; 5) Health and Medical; and 6) Family and Relationships. Because of regulations governing programs working with people who were incarcerated, the Project will begin its work with recently released individuals, but recognizes the importance of ultimately beginning work with individuals during their incarceration. The Project Manager reports to the project's Advisory Council comprised of people who were formerly incarcerated, service providers, and public agency staff.
