COUNCIL ACTIONS:

On Tuesday, July 28, 2009 the San Diego City Council approved my recommendation to fund street realignment and road way improvements in the Southcrest Community of the 4th District. This major \$10 million project will improve pedestrian access, traffic flow, landscaping, and other infrastructure improvements along the streets of 43rd, Logan, San Pasqual, and National Avenue. I commend and thank the members of the Southeastern San Diego Planning Group and the many residents of the 4th District who helped coordinate and support this project for years. I thank my fellow Council members for supporting my efforts to get it funded.

On Tuesday, July 28, 2009 the San Diego City Council confirmed the appointment and re-appointment of several members to the Commission on Gang Prevention and Intervention. I commend and thank 4th District members Reverend Harry Cooper Jr. and Eugene Johnson, as well as Jose Cervantes, Alicia DeLeon-Torres, Scott Silverman, Fred Sotello and Christopher Yanov for their outstanding commitment to dedicate their time and efforts to help improve the quality of life of youth and families impacted by gangs.



On Tuesday, July 28, 2009 the San Diego City Council approved my recommendation to fund the installation of a multiple-purpose building at the 4th District's North Chollas Community Park. This \$2.9 million project, funded with redevelopment money from the Crossroads Redevelopment Project, will enhance use of the park by adding concession stands for the little league organizations using the field, meeting space for organizations, needed men's/women's and family rest rooms, and other amenities.

The Crossroads Redevelopment Plan which covers both District 4 and District 7, identifies various redevelopment priorities including providing funding for improvements at North Chollas Community Park. Neighboring community groups including Chollas Lake Recreation Council, Oak Park Community Council and Oak Park Little League identified the construction of a Multi-Purpose Building as a priority.

I commend and thank the members of the community and the community organizations of the 4th and 7th Districts who helped coordinate and support this project. I thank my fellow Council members, especially Councilwoman Marti Emerald for supporting my efforts to get this project funded.

On Tuesday, July 28, 2009 in response to numerous complaints and concerns from the public about the Pedicab industry and its operations in San Diego, the Council also unanimously approved tightening Pedicab regulations to encourage safer operations and improve accountability. As a result of this action, Pedicab drivers must now post fares along with the company name and phone number, and carry proof of insurance. They must also ensure their passengers are wearing the required seat belts. Operators are prohibited from driving on streets with speed limits greater than 25 mph, and will be cited for parking on sidewalks and in metered spaces.

On Tuesday, July 28, 2009 Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed a State Budget that will take away over \$90 million from the City's budget. This take-away includes over \$60 million in redevelopment monies used to fund community projects and affordable housing in low and moderate income communities of the City. It also includes taking away over \$30 million in property taxes used to fund parks, libraries, public safety and street improvements.

My fellow Councilmember's and I have joined the Mayor and local elected officials from throughout the State in protesting this ill-conceived budget that takes funds from local government. As Chairman of the Budget and Finance Committee, I requested the Mayor to coordinate strategies in response to this approved State budget proposal with the Council (through this Budget Committee), City Attorney, County of San Diego, and Mayors of other cities in San Diego and through the League of Cities.



We are working with the League of Cities to clarify just what the Governor has done and ensuring that cities have a way of recovering as much as possible, the funds the State is taking away. Again, as we were last year, we are facing extraordinary budget problems caused by economic conditions and now a State budget that is taking hundreds of millions of dollars from our City and County. We must take extraordinary steps to address this problem and we will do so in a manner that minimizes as much as possible, the impact on City services and programs.

The City Council will be in recess for the summer.
