SEPTEMBER 10, 2009 WEEKLY UPDATE



The San Diego City Council passed a balanced budget for fiscal year 2009-2010. Now the State has balanced its budget on the back of San Diego. The State's action has seriously impacted our ability to keep a balanced budget. We are facing a new budget deficit of over \$60 million. As Chairman of the Budget and Finance Committee, I requested the Mayor to coordinate strategies in response to this latest State budget take-away with the Council, City Attorney, County of San Diego, and Mayors of other cities in San Diego and through the League of Cities. I will be convening special meetings of the Budget and Finance Committee, as necessary, to expedite any decisions that need Council discussion and action. If we have to re-open the City's budget process to effect changes, we will unfortunately have to do so. Again, as we were last year, we are facing extraordinary budget problems caused by economic conditions and now a proposed State budget that is threatening to take hundreds of millions of dollars from our City and County. We must take extraordinary steps to address this problem and as we did in the past, with the valuable and needed input of the citizens of San Diego, we will successfully address it.

COUNCIL ACTIONS:

On Tuesday September 8, 2009, the San Diego City Council approved notifying all residents who receive water bills of a proposal to increase their water bills. The City Council will hold a public hearing on November 18, 2009 to consider the water rate increase that was approved by the County Water Authority and effective September 2009. Unfortunately, the City is forced to pass on these water rate increases unless a majority of the water customers formally protest the increases. The Notice being sent will also inform water customers how to register a protest against these rate increases. If adopted, the adjusted fees and rates would become effective January 1, 2010. Single family home owners could see a monthly water rate increase ranging from \$0.12 cents to \$4.73.

On Tuesday September 8, 2009, the San Diego City Council approved changing the September 14, 2009 City Council meeting start time from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The meeting location will remain unchanged. In our efforts to encourage public participation at City Council meetings, we adopted an ordinance specifying that evening meetings be scheduled throughout the year. The Council President has made arrangements to hold the first of these Council meetings on the evening of Monday, September 14, 2009. The meeting will take place in Council Chambers at 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101 and will begin at 6:00 p.m. I look forward to seeing you on Monday evening. Issues we will be discussing include the Homeless Winter Shelter Program.



During the month of August San Diego County released a health report and update on the H1N1 Virus commonly known as the Swine Flu. Over 1,000 cases of H1N1 were recorded in San Diego County and unfortunately 18 people have died. With the start of the new school year and the start of a new flu season, I cannot emphasize how important it is for all San Diegans to educate themselves and their families as much as possible.

Some things you can do if you catch the flu include:

- Stay home;
- Cover your cough, use a tissue and put it in the trash;
- Use your upper sleeve if no tissue is available;
- Wash your hands;
- Stay at least six feet away from others;
- Get plenty of bed rest;
- Drink a lot of liquids;
- Seek medical advice for severe symptoms.

Please note that at the time of this writing, steps to manufacture and distribute the pandemic H1N1 influenza vaccine are being made, and decisions about its use, distribution or other details are being made by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
