

Basic Fire Escape Planning for you and your family:

- Gather everyone in your household to make an evacuation plan; make sure everyone fully understands the plan.
- Walk through the plan with your household and ensure there are no obstructions.
- If there are infants, elderly or mobility-challenged members, ensure there is another member who can safely assist with the evacuation.
- If there are security doors or windows, ensure that they have a quick release mechanism that is operable.
- Choose an offsite meeting site for everyone to meet after evacuating.
- Ensure any guests are aware of and understand the plan.
- Ensure every room has a working smoke alarm.
- Be prepared for a real fire; when the smoke alarm sounds, evacuate immediately,
- Call 9-1-1 and do not go back in under any circumstances.

Recently, two community cleanups were held in the community of Skyline:

On March 17, 2010, EDS along with the community of Skyline conducted a community cleanup. A total of 1.59 tons of waste was collected of which 1.53 tons consisted of non-recyclables and 0.06 tons of recyclables.

On March 24, 2010, ESD along with the community of Skyline conducted a mini-community cleanup. A total of 0.12 tons of recyclable waste consisting of metals and appliances was collected.
