Containers must be clean and contain no metal, food waste or trash, and must be separated from other recyclables. No styrofoam or clamshell plastics are accepted. These containers are taken as a donation. By collecting these plastic materials, this will help us in deciding whether to add plastic tubs to the curbside recycling program in the future.
