CITY COUNCIL NOTES:

On Monday, April 8 the San Diego City Council approved the advisory boards, FY2014 budget reports and annual levy assessments for citywide Business Improvement Districts (BIDs), including District 4's newly reformed southeastern San Diego Diamond BID.

On Tuesday, April 9 the San Diego City Council



voted to approve a resolution to support a reasonable, bi-partisan and comprehensive approach to reforming the currently broken immigration system in a way that

provides a legal pathway to U.S. citizenship.

CONNECT2Careers San Diego (C2C-SD), formerly known as Hire-A-Youth, is an important initiative designed to address San Diego's ongoing job skills gap and to provide meaningful work experiences that will prepare young adults for in-demand jobs. C2C-SD

focuses on aligning the career aspirations and educational backgrounds of young adults with employers who are committed to developing our emerging workforce by providing internship opportunities. For C2C-SD to be successful, participation from the business community is vital.


