



Scripps Health has begun a \$1 billion expansion in San Diego County, and Bruce Rainey is helping ensure it all goes smoothly. As Corporate Vice President for Facilities Design and Construction, he is responsible for all OSHPD projects on a corporation-wide basis, as well as all projects that exceed \$250,000 in value. This can mean managing upward of 100 projects at any one time – with project values of \$100,000 to \$500,000,000.

Another key responsibility is moving the organization forward along its full 10 year expansion and facility replacement plan – with annual spends exceeding \$150 million. This includes managing the entitlement processes at all five Scripps hospital campuses and 19 outpatient center campuses which plays a central role in Scripps' master planning. Thus far, there have been five conditional use permits completed with another in process.

When Mr. Rainey came to Scripps nearly eight years ago, the organization was in a far different place. In the final stages of a complete financial turnaround, Scripps' campuses had seen little growth over the previous decade, but had laid the groundwork with bold plans for the decade ahead. Mr. Rainey's experience in health care construction (OSHPD), health care facility operations, and not-for-profit organizations, coupled with his familiarity with land-use, local jurisdiction permitting, entitlement processes and contract negotiations has ensured these plans moved forward as scheduled. Scripps is now building new facilities on four of its five hospital campuses, including one hospital campus that has not seen new construction in more than 20 years.

Perhaps what sets Mr. Rainey apart most is his ability to work collaboratively among diverse groups within the health care setting, and the community. From working with marketing to incorporate "the customer" in design and construction, to collaborating with administrative and clinical care staff on site development projects such as replacement facilities and parking structures, he works with others to find effective and reasonable solutions.

He is as comfortable in the boardroom as he is on a construction site, and this makes him an excellent ambassador for the organization. He speaks knowledgeably about Scripps' construction projects, communicates issues effectively, and represents the Scripps' position in numerous city and community forums. Mr. Rainey's simple approach to sharing his knowledge, speaking directly and providing leadership facilitates group consensus.

Mr. Rainey came to Scripps from Hoag Hospital, where he was Director of Facilities Design and Construction with direct oversight of a new patient tower and cogeneration facility. Prior to that, he was Vice President of Facilities Support with Community Medical Centers where he was involved in major campus upgrades and build-outs. He also served for two years as Associate Administrator of Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, where he had previously been a Hospital Engineering Specialist, working on a 373 bed, 930,000 square foot replacement hospital.

He has a Master's Degree in Health Administration from Chapman University and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering, and a minor in Engineering Science and Mechanics from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.




