#### **Community Gardens Coming to a Neighborhood Near You**

Last year, I had the pleasure of attending an event with First Lady Michelle Obama as she toured and praised the International Rescue Committee's New Roots Community Farm located in City Heights. The 2.3 acre garden is located on city-owned land with plots that are tended by local refugee and immigrant community members. It was a pleasure to celebrate their second anniversary this year.

Last month, I along with my Council colleagues unanimously approved new regulations to allow residents to start community gardens without having to obtain an expensive permit. Those with a green thumb can start to establish a garden in all commercial and residential zones. However, the California Coastal Commission still needs to approve the city's new regulations for those properties located within the coastal communities.

The community garden's movement is spreading throughout the county of San Diego with gardens ranging in various sizes. These gardens allow residents to share their love and knowledge of gardening with others while composting left-overs to create nutrient rich soil that can be replanted. **Safety Speaks** ~ As Chair of the City of San Diego's Public Safety and Neighborhood Services (PS&NS) Committee, we are hearing reports and passing new legislation every month that addresses core City services. In future issues of Emerald News, you can look forward to upcoming public safety events, reading new pieces of legislation and hearing from San Diego's Public Safety Department Directors.

Last month, the City Council approved a two year contract with Rural Metro Inc, the City's ambulance service provider. The contract included a \$5.5 million cash payment to the City of San Diego and annual revenues of \$9 million in FY2012 and \$10 million in FY2013, \$1.3M above what was projected in the Mayor's Five Year Financial Outlook.

As Chair of PS&NS, I indicated the only way I could support the contract was if the ratepayer's fees were spent on providing the public with additional public safety services. In tight budgetary times, it is critical that ratepayer's dollars are spent where they will provide the greatest impact. Specifically I asked that the surplus generated be used to complete the next recommendations from the Citygate Working Group 5 Year Plan, a plan based on a comprehensive study that outlined severe deficiencies in our Fire-Rescue department. ## Mini Make-Overs for a street in Colina Park-

Team Emerald joined San Diego Community Housing Works last month for their Summer 2011 Face-Lift event. FaceLift is a spruce-up-a-block-in-a-day event that is accomplished through the help of hundreds of community volunteers, neighborhood associations, local business leaders and homeowners to build pride in ownership while improving the exterior conditions of several homes. This year a dozen homes on Trojan Avenue in the Colina Park neighborhood of City Heights were spruced up. FaceLift gives priority to senior citizens, disabled persons and low income families that need assistance and provides homeowners with painting, major landscaping, and the removal trash and debris from the entire area.
