Budget Talks~ On April 12th, the City Council unanimously passed a resolution of our top fiscal priorities and key budget-saving ideas by offering up \$30 million in proposed budget solutions. Measures included recovery fees for false fire alarms, reducing/eliminating cell phones for nonemergency personnel, putting printing and fleet services up for competitive bid, and mandatory furlough days for city workers.

Last month, Mayor Sanders released his proposed budget for fiscal year 2012, which begins this July 1, 2011. The budget's current form includes measures to address the backlog of deferred capital projects, restores the Fire-Rescue browned out fire engines, closes the projected General Fund budget deficit of \$56.7 million and fully funds the City's annual pension payment.

However, the Mayor's budget includes major hits to park and recreation and libraries. Including the reduction of recreation center hours from 40 to 20 hours per week beginning in September, slashing pool hours, elimination of after school programs at five centers, removal of the fire pits from city beaches, reductions in brush removal and less trail and turf maintenance at parks with the elimination of 77 positions. Libraries will also be hit with a loss of 77 positions and a reduction of hours at branch libraries from 36 to 18.5 hours per week. Each branch would be open for two days per week and alternate Saturdays.

While some of the City Council's budget suggestions were included in the Mayor's proposed budget, other options were left out. I applaud the Mayor for restoring cuts made to public safety but have great concern about the drastic cuts to other departments. I'm committed to working with my colleagues on the City Council to pass a budget that will benefit all of the communities I represent.
