Infrastructure Projects Get Fast Tracked

Tired of waiting 10 years for a traffic signal? Five years for a stop sign? Or, how about watching your streets and sidewalks crumble under your feet while you raise your kids and send them off to college??? Well, we're tired of it, too!

That's why my City Council colleagues and I pushed through a new plan to cut the red tape and get capital improvement (CIP) projects done faster. Our city has a whopping \$898 million backlog in long-delayed maintenance projects, plus another billion or so, sitting on shelves with no funding or tangled in bureaucratic red tape. But no more!

San Diego's Public Works team now plans to fix roads, sidewalks and sewers; parks, street lights and yes, traffic signals, and complete them much faster than before. We will work closely and transparently with community groups, do all our environmental reviews and will speed up the process. It's a rare win-win in government: creating jobs, saving tax dollars and improving our neighborhoods services.

A new website will have access to information about upcoming projects, private contracts to build them, and the repair schedules . The CIP website is scheduled to go live sometime in May.

This new effort to streamline capital projects is a direct result of your suggestions. We are listening to your concerns and making the changes necessary at the City of San Diego to help you create the quality of life you want for your communities.

Safety Speaks

In early 2011 the City implemented an ordinance that requires pedicab operators to have a valid California driver's license. At last month's Public Safety & Neighborhood Services (PS&NS) Committee, we heard from City transportation staff and the Police Department regarding an update of the

code. The police department reported that it is now easier to carry out background checks on pedicab operators and that pedicab operators have been breaking fewer traffic laws and receiving fewer citations.

The Committee also discussed a new U.S. State Department policy that prohibits individuals approved to participate in the work-and-study-based - exchange visitor programs from being pedicab drivers. The pedicab industry has a history for attracting J1 Visa Student sponsor programs and has earned a reputation for taking advantage of foreign students. As committee Chair, Councilmember Emerald requested the City Attorney's Office research and report back ways in which the city can support and enforce the new federal guideline.

Playground Project Gets Final Approval

For the past 3 years a small group of community members envisioned a new playground for the Lake Murray Community Park. They were able to raise nearly \$185,000, along with the



\$212,000 in Navajo Development Impact Fees. The City of San Diego's Park and Recreation Department will assist the group with demolition of the existing playground, new walkways, rubberized surfacing and some play equipment. The community will be purchasing most of the play equipment which include play structures for ages 2-5 and 5-12, along with ADA equipment so that every child can come and enjoy this recreation area.

However, there is still time for supporters of this project to put their mark on this playground. Individuals or families can purchase a personalized paver that will be placed at the playground which includes a personal message.
