## March's Community Meeting Big Turnout by Government Representatives

Thanks to all the government representatives who came to the March community meeting!

Seventh District Council Member, Marti Emerald, was there, along with a substantial group of police officers from the Mid-City Division. They came in response to complaints about weekend noise and other disturbances around El Cajon Boulevard and Dayton Street. Along with Council Member Emerald, Division Captain Lawrence McKinney, Lieutenant Charles Community Relations Officer Dean Thomas, and Sergeant Ben McCurry answered residents' questions and presented a response to the problems. Since this meeting, residents on Dayton Street and Gilbert Drive have reported a reduction in disturbances. This turnout demonstrated the willingness of the police and our City Council representative to respond to community concerns.

ECCC Board of Directors Elections - March is the month for the El Cerrito Community Council's annual Board of Directors elections. Seven candidates were elected by acclimation, in accordance with the ECCC Bylaws, for an election with nine candidates or fewer. Six sitting Board members were reelected: Carl Luster, Jan Riley, Scott Lewis, John Stende, Teri Nystrom, and B.J. Nystrom. Maurize Rios was elected for his first term.

#### Changing of the Guard

husband for their years of community service, and thanks to Maurize Rios for volunteering his time and effort.

### Greetings and Farewell for the ECCC Board of Directors

The El Cerrito Community Council elected 7 members to the Board of Directors at the March 18 community meeting. With that election, the Board greets one new member, Maurize Rios. Maurize has been very active among residents on Dayton, Berting, and Gilbert Streets, and he is taking on the role of block captain for this neighborhood. Already taking an active role on the ECCC Board, Maurize will be looking into setting up a *MySpace* or *FaceBook* page for the ECCC.

Since the March election, Treasurer, Teri Nystrom, has resigned in response to the demands of a new job. Many thanks to Teri for keeping the accounts during the past year. She has also managed the advertising insert that's delivered with this newsletter, giving local businesses a connection to residents and adding to the income that comes from donations. Veteran Board Member, B.J. Nystrom, will be taking over as Treasurer.

Thanks and farewell also goes out to Justin Hawks, who resigned from the Board in March after purchasing a home in Del Cerro. Continuing Board Member, John Stende, took over much of the work to prepare for last month's chili cook-off.

In addition to B.J. Nystrom and John Stende, three more members will continue on the Board from last year. Carl Luster will continue as Chair, and Jan Riley will continue as Vice-Chair and Editor of the Newsletter. Scott Lewis will continue coordinating newsletter distribution.

The Board of Directors still needs a secretary, and there are many other ways to take an active role in El Cerrito Community Council.

#### Update El Cerrito Neighborhood Patrol By Patti Saraniero

The El Cerrito Neighborhood Patrol continues to be active. The patrol volunteers have put in over 150 hours of patrol since we started last summer! New volunteers are always welcome.

The patrol currently has submitted requests to fix two street lights (one at 55th & El Cajon Blvd and one at 54th & El Cajon Blvd). In addition, three graffiti incidents were removed in March. These simple prevention efforts will make a difference!

The patrols from around the Mid-City Division continue to receive updates from Lt Chuck Kaye. Things have been relatively quiet, which is great news. Some items of note:

Late night car prowls continue to be an issue in the Mid-City area (this is not necessarily specific to El Cerrito). Laptops are at the top of the list of things stolen from cars.

Officers Dulani Jackson and Jerimiah Lutz, in the 6700 block of El Cajon Blvd, found a suspicious person who was later identified as a bank robber. He was arrested and taken to the Robbery Unit for questioning. The suspect had committed several bank robberies since November 2009.

The "motorcycle club" in the 5400 block of El Cajon Blvd has become a significant nuisance. SDPD has responded to El Cerrito neighbors' concerns. They are patrolling that area heavily.

#### Sewer & Water Upgrades Water Main Replacement Group 773 Eastern and College Areas

The City of San Diego has established an ongoing program that mandates replacement of all aging and deteriorating existing cast iron water mains on the following streets:

**Adams Avenue** – from College Avenue to just east of Soria Drive.

Estelle Street, Adelaide Avenue, Meade Avenue & Vale Way from 60<sup>th</sup> Street to 58<sup>th</sup>

These replacements will help to eliminate future water main breaks, improve services to the community and reduce maintenance costs.

#### **Project Overview**

Water Group 773 consists of installing approximately 4,720 linear feet of new 8-inch and12-inch water main. The project also includes the installation of 32 new pedestrian curb ramps and the resurfacing of the streets that are impacted by the project.

#### Water Main Replacement

The City will require traffic control plans during construction to ensure accessibility, minimize disruption and protect the safety of the residents within the project area. The contractor will be directed at all times to keep the area as clean as possible from dirt and dust.

#### **Construction Schedule**

Construction is estimated to begin in the summer of 2010 and estimated to complete in the early summer of 2011.

#### Cost

The total cost for this project is approximately \$2,204,000.

#### What is Scavenging and How Can I report it?

Scavenging is the act of unauthorized persons going through recycling or refuse containers, whether the containers are located on City or private property. Like illegal dumping, scavenging is a crime in San Diego, and it is taken very seriously by the City.

Every year, scavengers steal thousands of dollars in recyclables from the City's curbside program, which makes the program less cost efficient and ultimately costs taxpayers. To help keep scavengers from taking your recyclables, place your container out at 7 a.m., just before collection, rather than the night before.

To help stop this crime, the City encourages anyone who encounters a scavenging incident that has already taken place to report it. If you observe someone scavenging, please take down the following information:

- Date, time and location of incident
- Description of vehicle and license plate number
- Description of person(s) scavenging
- What items/materials were being scavenged
- Your name and phone number (optional)

The ECCC Trash Can Stickers will be available at the April meeting. These are supposed to be selfadhesive, but we would recommend you add glue to the backs of them before putting them on top of your trash cans.
