Dear Mrs. Huntington:

Your letter to the City Council was referred to me by the City Manager for reply.

The Park and Recreation Commission has maintained a policy over the years that no liquor will be sold in Balboa Park. Home of the restaurants in the Fajik have a liquor license. The only be license is held by the operator of the Balboa Golf Course cafe. The only beer

to serve liquor to their guests. Private parties who rent facilities for catered meals, contract with one of the restaurant operators for banquets, or use picnic facilities may serve liquor to their guests. Under the State law, it is illegal for such groups to sell liquor as they do not hold liquor licenses. As you probably know, liquor licenses are granted only for specific locations and, as I stated earlier, there are no licenses in the There are no restrictions in the Park on private groups who wish

The class you mentioned in your letter is one which was conducted jointly by the San Diego County Health Department and Tavern Owners' Association. This class was for the purpose of training waitresses as well as bar tenders in the proper methods of work, and dealt primarily with techniques involving health standards and proper methods of serving both foods and beverages. The class was public during evening hours. conducted in one of the restaurant facilities which is closed to the The class was
