The Attorney's opinion states, "The one-fifth appropriation of the City in the matter of lighting grows out of and has an existence only by virtue of the Resolution of Intention in each separate lighting district fund. Since there was no assessment and no lighting district fund for the lighting of Fourth street between B and C streets, there could have been no liability upon the City originating from any such source; consequently the \$80.00 covered by the said ordinance has no better standing than the remaining \$320. of the \$400. claim."

The Charter of the City of San Diego specifically states in Sec.15 of Chapter 2, Article 2, Page 30, the following: "Neither the Common Council, nor any officer, board, department, or authority shall allow, make valid, or in any manner recognize any demand against the City which was not at the time of its creation a valid claim against the same, nor shall they or any of them, ever allow or authorize to be paid any demand which, without such action, would be invalid, or which shall then be barred by any statute of limitation, or for which said city was never liable."

In view of the language used in this Section and of the Attorney's statement, that there was no assessment, and no lighting district, and that no liability to the City did originate from such a source, I have vetoed this ordinance.

An Engineer from the City Engineer's office spent several days with floats studying the currents both on incoming and outgoing tides, and the mouth of the outfall is located where the immense volume of water, and the strong current into which it discharges will rapidly disperse the sewage without its being offensive to either sight or smell.

There seems to be a disposition on a part of the people of Ocean Beach to want a septic tank installed, but no matter how well a septic tank works there will always be more or less objections, especially to anyone who happens to know the location and lives near.

As it is important that Ocean Beach should be sewered as soon as possible, and that the plan submitted is both economical and efficient, I recommend that the petition be denied.

"San Diego, California, February 11th, 1914.

To the Honorable,

The Common Council of the City of San Diego.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith proposed ordinance appropriating the sum of \$595.19 for the relief of the San Diego Consolidated Gas & Electric Company, with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this ordinance are: First, that the City should be required to pay only one-fifth of amount called for in this ordinance as it was a charge on account of a lapsed contract. The property owners should pay four-fifths. I realize that the electric company furnished the current and are justly entitled to their pay, but I do not believe that the City should pay amount it owes and the amount due by the individual property owners. If the City is liable to this company under a lapsed contract, I cannot see why the property owners are not liable to the City on the same contract for their four-fifths.

My second reason for vetoing this ordinance is based on the fact that the claim is a 1912 expenditure, whereas, the ordinance states "that the sum of \$212.87 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Street Light Fund, etc." This would in a measure recognize a 1912 claim as an outstanding indebtedness against the 1914 Street Light Fund. In my opinion this ordinance should have read "Street Light Fund of the year 1912," as the bill was incurred during that year, and must according to the Charter, be paid out of the revenues of the year 1912.

For these reasons I have vetoed this ordinance.

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A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 1434, limiting district within which intoxicating liquors may be sold, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, March 3rd, 1914.

To The Honorable,

The Common Council of the City of San Diego.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith proposed ordinance "amending Section 2 of ordinance No. 1434, limiting the district within which intoxicating liquors may be sold in the City of San Diego, California," with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this ordinance are;- First, that it is a special privilege granted to particular pieces of property to the exclusion of other properties similarly located. I can see no equitable reason why properties are picked at various locations designated as particular spots where saloons can be located. It seems to me that if the zone is to be extended it should be extended to the west line of Eighth street and to the north line of Ash street thereby including all properties adjoining locations where licenses

are proposed to be granted. As stated above, these locations for the granting of special permits are special privileges, and any privilege granted to one person or class, infringes on the rights and liberties of all other persons.

My second reason for vetoing this ordinance, is that the general representations made for the extension of the zone were to the effect that saloons would be transferred into new and expensive hotels. I have personally visited the locations described in the ordinance and find one of the hotels is more in the nature of a loding house than a hotel as it has simply passage way and stairs leading to the second floor. Another location named in the ordinance is occupied by one story buildings, occupied by various fruit stands and similar business. I cannot see any justifiable reasons for granting saloon privilege under these conditions to these particular properties, unless all properties adjacent thereto are granted the same privilege.

For these reasons I have decided to veto this ordinance.

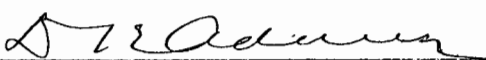

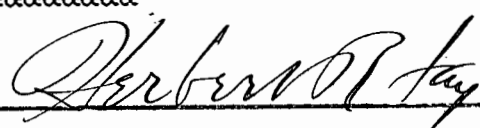

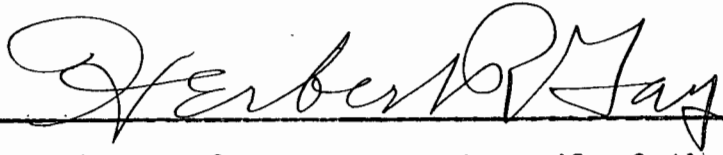

"San Diego, California, May 8th, 1914.

To the Honorable,

The Common Council of the City of San Diego.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith proposed ordinance authorizing the Superintendent of the Department of Finance, Ways & Means to contract in the open market, without advertising for bids, for the grading and excavating of a certain lot in the City of San Diego, with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this proposed ordinance are:

First - I am informed that the lot in question is to be used by the Water Department for a machine shop and similar purposes, and that the total cost will be \$35,000. I do not believe that we should spend that sum for a water department shop, unless it is to form the nucleus of a shop or shops where all city work can be done. In my opinion, the block in question is not large enough for the use of all departments, consequently, other departments wishing to have their own shops must necessarily go elsewhere. This means scattering instead of concentrating our maintenance, repairs and upkeep, and will necessarily mean more expense by reason of shops being operated in different parts of the city. Further, I believe that owing to the financial conditions of the country at this time, that it would be wiser for the Water Department to remain in their present quarters and the money intended for this shop to be either expended in betterments and extensions or placed in the sinking fund for the payment of water bonds.

Another reason for vetoing this ordinance is, that it is made an emergency ordinance stating that it is "for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety." I cannot see any good reason why this ordinance should be made an emergency.

For these reasons, I have vetoed this ordinance.

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A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 1434 fixing and describing limits within which liquor may be sold, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, May 27th, 1914.

To the Honorable, The Common Council  
of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith proposed ordinance "Repealing Ordinance No. 1434," which I have vetoed.

My reason for vetoing this ordinance is that it is not legally an urgency measure and that it seeks apparently to deprive our citizens of their rights as stated in the charter. I do not believe that any one can justify this ordinance on the ground that it will preserve the public peace, health and safety. Wherein does ordinance 1434 fail to protect our citizens? It has been in force for eleven years and I do not know of any instance whereby our peace, health and safety have been endangered by reason of any defect in the old ordinance.

Apparently, (and I am forced to this conclusion by the urgency clause) the reason for making this proposed ordinance an urgency measure, is that probably by so doing it might escape the referendum, if it was desired to be applied by any citizens. This conclusion is substantiated by Sec. 3, Page 15 of the City Charter which reads as follows:

Sec. 3. No ordinance passed by the Common Council (except when otherwise required by the general laws of the State, or by the provisions of this charter, respecting street improvements, and except an ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, which contains a statement of its urgency and is passed by a two-thirds vote of the Common Council, but no grant of any franchise shall be construed to be an urgency measure, but all franchises shall be subject to the referendary vote herein provided) shall go into effect before thirty days from the time of its final passage and its approval by the Mayor.

This proposed ordinance if legal would deprive citizens of the right granted by charter by styling it an urgency measure. I do not approve of taking from any class of our citizenship, anti or prohibitionists, or what not, a single right or opportunity given them by law, consequently I must register my protest against class legislation as this appears to be and veto the ordinance.. I do not believe that this Council would knowingly and willing adopt a subterfuge for the enactment of a law and deliberately take from the people their rights as granted by state law and the Charter and I trust that second thought on the subject, the apparent absurdity of an urgency existing, and the fact that it appears as an attempt to take from your constituents the rights granted all citizens by our Charter, will cause your honorable body to refuse the adoption of this ordinance. Substantiating my statement that this ordinance is not legally an emergency ordinance, I refer you to the state law in the case of Geroge Hoffman in Cal. Reports 1908-09, pages 114 to 120 wherein the court held "that the mere statement in an ordinance by the Council that this is an urgency measure for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety was neither conclusive nor yet sufficient." The ordinance itself should, where a sudden emergency has arisen, contain a statement of the nature of the emergency, otherwise it is not an emergency measure and a simple declaration on the part of the Council cannot make it one.

Consequently this ordinance is not legally an urgency measure and is subject to provisions cited in Charter. For these reasons I have vetoed this ordinance.
