With regard to the contents of the attached letter, I have to say that the work undertaken by the Superintendent of the Harbor was pursuant to direction of the Council, and was necessary to provide for the dredging work already contracted for. Delay would have been uneconomical and embarrassing to the City.

All work undertaken has been done through the Finance Department as prescribed by Ordinance.

All communications received by me from the Harbor Commissioners were promptly forwarded to the Common Council, where they might have been sent in the first place.

The Leeds & Barnard bill concerning the payment of which complaint is made was referred by the Council to me, and was returned with the indorsement recommending the payment of the bill. 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A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance prescribing rules and regulations governing sparring and boxing exhibitions, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, July 22nd, 1914.

To the Honorable Common Council

of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I return you herewith, proposed ordinance prescribing rules and regulations governing sparring and boxing exhibitions in the City of San Diego, with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this ordinance are--

First.- I do not believe that twenty round contests are to the best interests of the City of San Diego. Boxing contests of twenty rounds are, in my opinion, prize fights, and do not tend to elevate sportsmanship or the morals of the community.

Second.- Section D of the proposed ordinance states that no minors under the age of eighteen will be admitted to a sparring exhibition or boxing contest, either as a member of the club, or as a spectator, or as a principal. This statement on the part of the Council means that exhibitions of this character are detrimental to youths of 17 years, 11 months, 29 days, but not to the same youth when he is two days older. If exhibitions or contests of this nature are detrimental to people, I cannot see any reason why they should be permitted or if permitted why minors under the age of twenty-one should be admitted at all, unless with the written consent of parent or guardian.

Third.- Section 4 of the proposed ordinance states that this is an ordinance

for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety and is one of urgency.

The reason stated in this section is not, in my opinion, a good and sufficient one for passing this ordinance as an urgency measure. I cannot understand how the holding of boxing contests preserves the peace of the public or insures the safety of our citizens. Every ordinance passed by your Honorable Body could be made an emergency measure with as much reason and justification as this proposed one cites. This is apparently made an urgency measure in the hope that, as such, it will not be subject to a referendum, a previous ten round ordinance having been suspended, and that in consequence said ordinance will become a law. I do not believe it is just to all citizens that this Council should pass any legislation as an emergency measure, that deprives any citizens of the right of the referendum, unless the emergency clearly and unquestionably exists and undoubtedly affects the public peace, health and safety.

This ordinance is class legislation, inasmuch as by passing same as an emergency measure it deprives some citizens of the use and benefit of the referendum as granted to them by charter, and grants privileges to other citizens. The people should be accorded every right granted them by charter particularly as to matters affecting the moral welfare of the community. The ballot is the proper method of settling every question of this character. Why not let the people decide by holding an election on the ordinance previously suspended?

For these reasons I have vetoed this ordinance.

Under such circumstances it is exceedingly difficult to secure convictions without which arrests are farcical.

Should citizens observing flagrant violations of the traffic ordinance report the numbers of the cars and appear when cited against the delinquent drivers, it is believed that the lawlessness referred to would be reduced to a minimum.

A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance creating and establishing certain offices and employments in the Department of Water, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, August 7th, 1914.

To the Honorable, The Common Council
of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith proposed ordinance creating and establishing certain offices and employments in the Department of Water, with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this ordinance are--

First.- That twelve salaries of employees are increased, and while I believe these increases are well deserved and under prosperous conditions should be granted, I do not believe that same should be granted at this time, as the finances of the City are not in condition to warrant same.

Second.- Section 2 of the proposed ordinances states "the number of such employees and the amount of such labor to be determined by the Superintendent of the Department of Water." This portion of Section 2, in my opinion, nullifies the number of employees as stated in Section 1 and permits the Department to employ without any further ordinance any additional employees that may be desired. The charter provides that all additional employees for departments be provided for by ordinance by the Council. I do not believe that any department should be given unlimited power of appointment, by general ordinance, but that special ordinances should be passed when the necessity for such employments arise.

Third.- The number of regular positions created under this proposed ordinance exceeds last year's requirements by 229, not counting day laborers; there being 300 more provided for in that class than under the old ordinance. The water department will probably need the day laborers, in the event the Morena conduit is built by that department. As to the increase in the other positions, I believe that same should be revised and if possible kept down to the present working force.

For these reasons I have vetoed this ordinance.

A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance providing for sparring exhibitions for domestic incorporated clubs, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, August 11th, 1914.

To the Honorable, the Common Council

of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I return herewith, proposed ordinance providing for sparring exhibitions for domestic incorporated clubs, with my veto.

My reason for vetoing this ordinance is based primarily on the fact that it is sought to be made an emergency ordinance and one for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety. Aside from every other consideration, this section alone should defeat the ordinance, for the simple reason that the public peace, health or safety will not be in any better condition after passage of the ordinance than it is at this time. The ordinance states that it is made an emergency measure for the reason that the uncertain meaning of existing ordinances is so apparent and the consequences and the penalties so great in case the courts were to construe that Ordinance No. 3959 has not provided for the licensing of domestic incorporated clubs, that said Common Council hereby declares an emergency to exist. According to this statement, the emergency exists only in the interest of domestic incorporated clubs desiring to hold sparring exhibitions, and is not an emergency that pertains to the public peace, health or safety. This Council has the authority to refuse permission to clubs desiring to hold exhibitions, until such time as the Common Council shall by regular ordinance decided otherwise, thereby preventing any club suffering penalties.

The penal code classifies prize fights among crimes against the public peace, and yet this Council seeks to pass as an emergency an ordinance permitting sparring exhibitions, or prize fights, as a means of preserving the public peace. If true that an emergency exists and holding prize fights will remedy the emergency, it is a paradox, as the public peace would be preserved by a contest, classified in the Penal Code, as a

Crime Against the Public Peace. An impossible combination.

I trust that further consideration on your part will change your attitude on the subject and that a regular ordinance, if desired, will be substituted, eliminating the emergency clause, thereby fulfilling your duties as legislators for all of the people. The passage of this ordinance does not preserve the public peace, health or safety but is an apparent attempt to deprive citizens of the use of the referendum, one having been filed against an ordinance of this character. The whole duty of the Council, in my opinion, is to pass necessary legislation for all the people and not to attempt to deprive by so-called emergency ordinances any of the citizens, of the use of the referendum, or any other right retained by the people at the time the charter was adopted.

For these reasons, I have vetoed this ordinance.

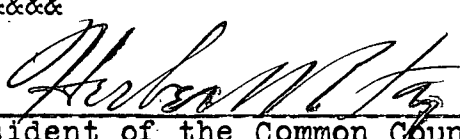

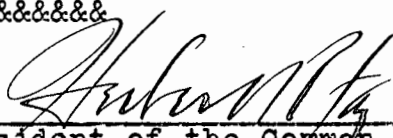
