City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I am returning herewith proposed ordinance, authorizing the Superintendent of the Department of Water to erect certain shops for the use of the Water Department, with my veto.

My reasons for vetoing this ordinance are:-

1st.- It would be better to wait until the proposed amendments are accepted or rejected before making this expenditure, as in all probability it will be an inconvenient location for future work if maintained as a separate shop, and might hamper the economical administration of the operation of departments.

2nd.- I believe that when this shop is built the location of same should be such that it would form a natural nucleus for all other city shops, warehouses or garages that may be necessary in the future. It seems to me that it is not wise to have the water, street and sewer department shops located in various sections of the City, as each yard or shop will require yardmen or watchmen that could as easily look after all of these if all shops were concentrated.

The City is owner of many acres of tidelands that would be ideal for these purposes and I respectfully suggest that you consider the advisability of selecting a site for these various shops on the tidelands and have departments move thereon.

For these reasons I have decided to veto this ordinance.

This difference has been estimated upon equipment the equivalent of that now owned and operated in San Diego Bay by the North American Dredging Company of Nevada. Equipment of this capacity is inadequate to place the dredgings in Area No. Seven; but supplemented by a booster pump, additional pipe line and other equipment the dredged material could be placed in Area No. Seven.

The cost of installation, maintenance and operation of this additional equipment would entail an expenditure of seven and one tenths cents per cubic yard, based upon an estimate of six hundred and thirty thousand cubic yards of dredging to be placed in Area No. Seven.
