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A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance authorizing a lease of certain tide lands to the San Diego & Arizona Railway Company, being contained in Document No.88432, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, April 21st, 1915.

To the Honorable, The Common Council,

City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I am returning herewith two proposed ordinances, leasing to the San Diego & Arizona Railway certain tide lands, approximating seventy-six (76) acres, with my veto.

My reason for vetoing these ordinances will be found in the Act of the State of California, Section 5, whereby the tidelands were ceded to this City. Section 5 reads as follows:

"The City of San Diego may lease not to exceed an aggregate of seventy-five per cent of the lands conveyed to it by this act, for a term not to exceed twenty-five years and upon which wharves, docks or piers have not been actually constructed and no such lease shall be for a larger area than forty acres, and such leases shall not be assignable or transferable, nor shall any lessee have the right to sub-let the leased premises or any part thereof, and all such leases so executed shall reserve to the common council of the City of San Diego the right and privilege, by ordinance to annul, change or modify such leases as in its judgment may seem proper."

You will note, according to the provisions cited, not more than forty acres can be leased. It is true that these two leases are for less than forty acres each, but it is also true that these two leases cover contiguous territory, or to all intents and purposes seventy-five acres of land in one body, and will be used for a common purpose as though held under one lease. It may be possible that, legally, two leases or ten leases of forty acres each could be made to the same purpose or corporation, on separated acres in the bay of San Diego, but I do not believe that two leases or ten leases, embracing forty acres each, can be legally leased in one body or in contiguous acres by any one person or corporation, simply by having separate leases, and if it could be done, I do not think it would be wise to do so.

In my opinion, the act quoted above specified forty acres in order to prevent persons or corporations securing large holdings of tidelands, and thereby retard the development of, or tie up, the water front. The proposed leases are, I believe, in conflict with the tidelands act.

Should the leases proposed in these two ordinances be granted, you will undoubtedly be called on hereafter by corporations or individuals and asked to lease eighty, one hundred, two hundred acres or more, in forty acre leases, and your Honorable Body would find that by reason of granting these leases and establishing this precedent, that you could not consistently refuse. The consequence of such a policy, if adopted, would permit one or two persons or corporations to control the entire tideland area, except the twenty-five per cent reserved by law. The wisest course to pursue, and one that will safeguard both the people and the applicants, is to comply with the spirit of the State law by only entering into leases of forty acres or less.

The San Diego & Arizona Railway enjoys today, a wharf franchise covering the property sought to be leased, and can continue to hold this acreage under the franchise act as specified by Charter. Personally, I am willing and anxious to grant to the San Diego & Arizona Railway Company, a new franchise or any other privilege necessary to the development of that railway, consistent with the charter and regulations governing tidelands. I am quite sure that the railway company will not find any difficulty in securing a wharf franchise such as they now hold, and that the franchise will prove just as secure and satisfactory as would be the leases.

Other objections to these leases are, compensation provided for as rental, nature of improvements and time of construction. Twenty-five dollars per month is not adequate compensation for seventy-six acres, but as the ordinance provides that the rental can be raised at any time this objection is not a very serious one. As to improvements, I think that in all cases where a lease of forty acres or thereabouts, is being entered into by the Common Council, it should contain a requirement for the construction of proposed work within a certain time and that the building plans be submitted to the Harbor Department for approval.

For the foregoing reasons, I have vetoed these ordinances.

Gentlemen:-

Herewith you will find annual report prepared by Benjamin H. Vreeland, Public Accountant, showing the condition of the various departments of this City.

This report is on conformity with charter requirement, as provided in Article 3, Section 3, of Chapter 1, wherein it is made mandatory on the Mayor to appoint an expert yearly, to examine every department of the city.

This report contains some very interesting and valuable information, and portrays the fact that the system of accounts and collections now in use are very inadequate cumbersome and expensive.

This report also alleges that several departments have not complied with the requirement of the charter, wherein it is made mandatory to settle with the Treasurer at least once a month.

This report also alleges that certain departments are short, or long, on cash, and also that some of the departments have their records in such shape that exact balances cannot be ascertained.

This report also alleges that certain employees of the city have their accounts in such shape that I deem it advisable to have same re-checked and corrected. I would advise that this report be referred to a committee of the Common Council and an accountant employed to verify alleged discrepancies and shortages mentioned therein, particularly those sections of the report contained in Exhibit B, schedule 4, page 36, schedule 2, page 34, schedule 13, page 63; and under Exhibit E, schedule 5, page 90, schedule 13, page 109; also Exhibit G, page 119, schedule 1; also Exhibit D, second paragraph, page 75, also on page 110.

I also refer you to pages 1 to 9, inclusive, being comments of the Special Auditor in the transmission of the report to the Mayor.

The following Message from the Mayor is read and ordered filed, viz:

"In assuming the duties of the office of Mayor, I am fully cognizant of the many problems and difficulties that are to be solved in order that the affairs of this City may be properly administered for the coming two years.

It is a fact well known to students of municipal affairs that the rapid expansion of many of the cities of the west entail upon the public officials and upon the citizens extraordinary exertions, not only to keep pace with the growth, but also to meet the financial requirements.

It will be conceded that San Diego owing to its unparalleled attractiveness, and to the superior inducements for business which it will offer upon the completion of its railroad and the development of its harbor and the further enterprises coincident therewith has made and is continuing to make an abnormal growth, which entails a multiplicity of necessary improvements that would be considered a creditable showing to any of the staid cities of the east of three times its population. It has the distinction of being the oldest as well as one of the youngest cities in the United States, and has made the phenomenal record of increasing its population from less than 40,000 in 1910 to an estimated population, at the present time, of 100,000.

The citizens of San Diego have appreciated this rapid growth and the consequent necessary improvements, and have been very generous in meeting the extraordinary demands. A time has arrived, however, when a temporary cessation is imperative. This is due to the stringent money conditions which prevail throughout the world and which make necessary the practice of retrenchment in municipal affairs, and with always a consistent regard for progress this word should be the watchword throughout the coming administration, or until a better condition prevails throughout the country in money matters. All public work which is undertaken should be of such a character as to provide the maximum amount of expenditure for labor, and material furnished should always be home products when quality and price are equal. We should steadily keep before us the interests of our industrial population and conserve our resources to that end.

No large corporation ever attempts to conduct its affairs without first adopting a well defined policy looking to an ultimate success; a city, being a corporation, should adopt a similar policy, and the energies of its officials and citizens should be directed along the lines of the policy adopted.

In San Diego a policy may be readily defined, since its industrial development is contingent upon the development of four basic factors, as follows: development of its harbor, development of transportation, development of an abundant water supply, and the securing of a cheap fuel supply. Its supremacy as a tourist resort and home city for the man of leisure rests upon its magnificent climate, its bay, and the development of its parks, highways and amusement resorts.

It is obvious that the four factors essential in its industrial development are so intimately related that their development must of necessity be coincident. The development of the harbor will be of no appreciable value to the city without the development of adequate rail transportation, and rail transportation is contingent upon the commerce resulting from harbor development. The building of a great city is limited by its water supply and factories and other commercial enterprises are governed almost entirely by the cost of the fuel supply, consequently the need of the development of these four prime factors is at once apparent.

Unquestionably the foundation of San Diego's future commercial supremacy lies in the possession of her municipally controlled water front. Providence seems to have interposed in her favor in the securing of this valuable asset from the State. This princely estate embraces 1460 acres, extending the full length of the city's water front, a distance of ten miles, and when fully developed its value will run far into the millions. The sixty acres of this area already reclaimed is estimated to be worth \$3,000,000. The possession of these lands places San Diego in the most enviable position of being able to offer to all legitimate business enterprises inducements to establish themselves in San Diego upon a basis which cannot be paralleled by any other sea port on this coast.

It should be the policy of the municipal government to work in harmony with all semi-public bodies in the formulating of a plan whereby a committee of representative citizens may be appointed and financed to use their best efforts in securing for the city any business proposition which promises to be a substantial acquisition to her industries. This committee should be armed with most attractive inducements to bring about this end, such as very low rentals for sites, or if necessary, practically no rent for a period during their establishment, and an entire rebate of municipal tax until they are upon a paying basis; the main object should be to secure enterprises which will furnish big pay rolls and develop the commerce of the port. It will be readily seen that the city will be abundantly recompensed for the concessions made in securing these enterprises.

Of the many varied industries possible at this port may be mentioned ship building, dry docks, furniture factories to work up the hard woods of Mexico and Central America tanneries, cotton mills, foundries and machine shops, fruit and fish canneries, and distributing houses for the eastern trade.

The tide lands should be gradually reclaimed in advance of the requirements; this should be accomplished by municipal ownership of its dredgers which should be operated by our own citizens.

It is evident that before enterprises of any character can be induced to locate on San Diego Bay, adequate railroad transportation to the east must be secured. Such railroad facilities as are required are now in course of construction in the San Diego and Arizona R.R. This road is being built in a most substantial manner, of heavy steel and on easy grades and curves, showing the confidence of its builder in the future of this port, and assuring to the shipper quick and economical transportation. When connection is made with a trans-continental line there will be opened up to this port the whole of the southwest region of the United States. Every encouragement should be given for the early completion of this road. Another and most needed railway improvement is the reconstruction of the Temecula cut-off which was washed out many years ago, and was never rebuilt; the result has been that the legitimate traffic belonging to this port, from the rich districts surrounding Riverside, San Bernardino, and Riverside has been diverted to Los Angeles. Abnormal pressure should be brought to bear upon the Santa Fe to force the rebuilding of the eleven or twelve miles of railroad required to restore to San Diego its legitimate territory.

The water question is of the greatest importance to the future growth of this city. The precipitation in the mountainous region lying immediately back of the city is ample to meet the requirements of a very large city, and the conservation of these waters is one of the problems which concerns this city in a most vital degree. It is imperative that due regard be given at all times to a proper and progressive development of the water supply to keep pace with the growth in population. The formation and topography of the back country adjacent to the city is such as to present numerous capacious reservoir sites in which the winter flood waters may be conserved. The completion of the present system owned by the city and the development of the water supply obtainable from the San Diego River is the logical line of procedure at the present time.

Perhaps the fuel problem admits of a more complex nature than any of the others. Successful manufacturing enterprises are seriously handicapped because of the high price of fuel, and some means should be adopted which will materially reduce the present cost. It is a well known fact that fuel oil pipe lines are practicable, even if extending several hundred miles in length from their source of supply. Such a pipe line can be constructed from the Fillerton oil fields to this city, a distance of approximately one hundred miles, by which fuel oil may be delivered to this city as cheaply as to any other point along the coast. In order that this may be done it will be necessary only to show that there will be a sufficient consumption of oil to warrant its construction. A cheaper coal supply can be secured by municipal ownership and control of coal bunkers, at which coal may be unloaded from ships and delivered to the consumer at the lowest possible cost. The municipality should give encouragement to the construction of such a fuel oil pipe line, and if the present prohibitive cost of coal continues to the detriment of industrial development, the city government should make provision for the construction of municipal bunkers. Unquestionably the city has the same legal right to do this as it has to construct piers or other harbor improvements.

It will be seen that the four cardinal propositions as above set forth, to-wit: the development of the harbor, its water supply, adequate rail transportation, and a cheap fuel supply, constitute the very foundation upon which the future greatness of San Diego rests, and it should be the policy of the municipality to exert every effort toward development along these lines.

The city government should look well to the exploiting to the limit of our unexcelled climate; this asset is exclusively San Diego's own, and is of immense value as an inducement to the tourist and retired citizen to sojourn here or make San Diego his home. This asset should be capitalized in the construction of parks, playgrounds, highways, and amusement resorts. Excellent progress has already been made along these lines in which San Diegans can justly feel proud. It should be the aim of the municipality to continue these very essential improvements, with always a due consideration for the condition of the times.

Measures should be adopted by the city government looking to an early survey of the mean high water line along the bay shore, defining the boundary between the city tide lands and the lands of private citizens; this is important and should be done as soon as practicable. The tide lands should be laid out into lots and blocks, with sufficient streets leading through to the bulkhead line, in order that easy access may be afforded to wheeled vehicles. Special attention should be given to the matter of laying out a municipally controlled right of way for a belt line of railroad tracks; this right of way should extend the full length of the bay shore in front of the city, and should be wide enough to permit of the building of at least four parallel tracks, with their attendant side tracks and spurs.

All municipally owned automobiles should be housed in a municipal garage, which should be equipped with the necessary machinery to make repairs. All machines should be checked in and checked out of this garage by an official caretaker, who should keep an accurate record of all gasoline used, as well as the mileage covered by each car while absent from the garage.

It is well known that the system of bookkeeping in use in the city government is very defective and admits of serious confusion, requiring the services of an expert at great expense to arrive at even an approximate conclusion as to the facts. I would recommend that a complete change be made in the form of keeping the accounts to the end that an accurate knowledge of the condition of any fund may be had at a moment's notice.

The money required to meet bond interest and sinking funds on outstanding bonds is unavoidable in its outlay, but all other expenses of every character should be trimmed down to the very lowest point, and only such street improvements as are petitioned for by the property owners who own a majority of the frontage on the street proposed to be improved, should be ordered done.

All propositions whereby it is proposed to issue any further city bonds should be laid on the table, until the financial condition throughout the country has very materially improved.

San Diego's capacity for development lies in its immense natural advantages and in the advantages which may be acquired, together with the capacity of its people to bring them into fruition. I believe that the City government should be a prime mover in all matters pertaining to the public welfare and in the city's advancement, and I feel assured that the coming two years will demonstrate that the city government has not only the will but that it will use its utmost endeavor to carry into effect all plans which will materially advance the interests of this city.

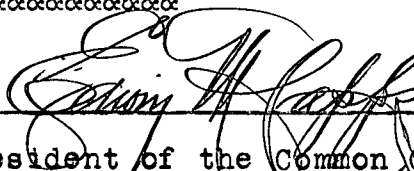

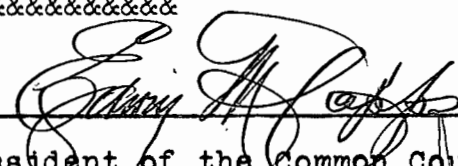

"San Diego, California, July 1st, 1915.

To the Honorable, the Common Council,
City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I herewith return to your honorable body, without my approval, an ordinance

entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting Loitering, Picketing, Placing Or Displaying Banners or Other Devices, Making Loud or Unusual Noises, or Speaking in Loud or Unusual Tones, In Public Streets and Other Public Places, for Certain Purposes".

Section 2 of this ordinance reads as follows:

"That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, in or upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, or other public place in the City of San Diego, to loiter, or to picket, act as a picket, or assist or engage in any act of picketing, or to place, carry, show or display any banner, badge, sign or other signal, in front of or in the vicinity of, any works, factory, shop, store, hotel, restaurant, public conveyance, or any other place where business is transacted, conducted or carried on, for the purpose of inducing or influencing or attempting to induce or influence, or for the purpose of intimidating, threatening or coercing or attempting to intimidate, threaten or coerce any person:-"

I disapprove that portion of the above section which reads as follows:- "to loiter, or to picket, act as a picket, or assist or engage in any act of picketing," "for the purpose of inducing or influencing any person."

I believe the enforcing of the above would be an invasion of the constitutional rights of a citizen.

The loitering or picketing referred to has been decreed by almost all supreme courts in their decisions as "peaceful picketing" and not unlawful, and it is the opinion of the City Attorney that the Supreme Court of this State would render a like decision.

The advocates of the passage of this ordinance have offered to defray all expenses in connection with any court proceeding which might be incurred by reason of its enforcement but I believe it to be a very unwise proceeding for the city to incur obligations of this nature, against the advice of the City Attorney, which it may later be forced to meet.

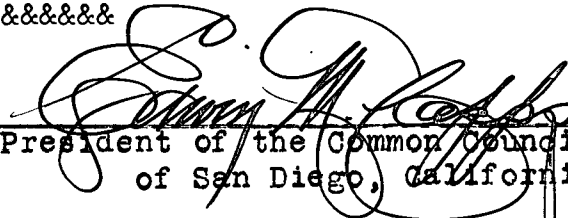
