My reasons for disapproving this ordinance are as follows:

First - The creating of the office of "Inspector of Public Municipal Work" is entirely unnecessary and uncalled for.

Second - The creating of such an office in the municipal government would not in the least degree facilitate, nor guarantee the integrity of any work any more than can be done through the office of the City Engineer at the present time without further expense.

Third - In making such an appointment, delegating to the appointee such autocratic powers as outlined in the ordinance in question, would practically annul and supercede the City Manager and the City Engineer in their official capacities.

Henry Newman Manney was born in Indiana on January 22nd, 1844. He entered the United States Naval Academy from the State of Minnesota on September 24th, 1861, and was graduated with the class of 1866. In April, 1869, he was promoted to ensign, soon afterward to master, and on March 21st, 1870, to lieutenant. In October, 1886, he received a promotion to lieutenant commander, and in May, 1895, to commander. His advance to captain came March 3rd, 1901. Following his various assignments as naval officer at sea and on shore, he became, March 15, 1904, chief of the Bureau of Equipment, United States Navy Department, with rank of rear admiral. Upon his retirement he removed to San Diego and here served the Navy Department as inspector upon the construction of the naval coaling station upon Point Loma.

At the General Election in the City of San Diego in April, 1913, he was elected as a member of the Common Council and for two years, until the amendment of the City Charter served as head of the Department of Police, Health and Morals, to which duties were added the supervision of Harbor Affairs. Throughout his long period of public service he was known for his devotion to the interests of the people, these interests being held as close as his own, and his attention to details marked his career.

Aside from his service in public office, Admiral Manney has, during his residence in this city, found time to devote to the interests of organizations which have had for their purpose the betterment of the community, and these will, like this body, miss his cheerful presence and hearty cooperation.





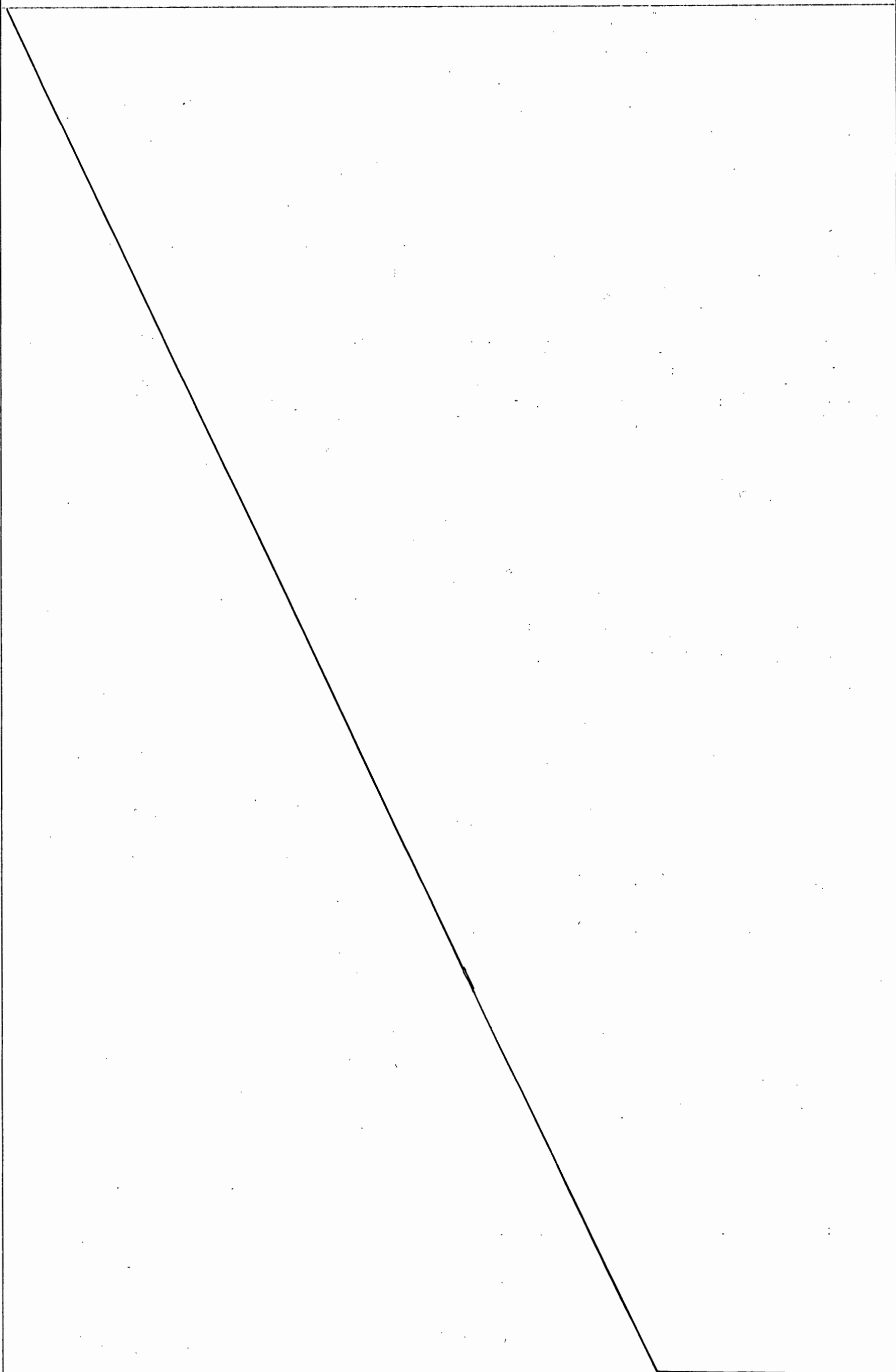

"San Diego, California, November 19th, 1915.

The Honorable, the Common Council,
City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I herewith return to your honorable body an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance authorizing a majority of the members of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, to enter into a lease with John Campbell, David C. Campbell and George E. Campbell, for certain tide lands, and repealing Ordinance No. 6275 of the ordinances of the City of San Diego, approved July 31, 1915," for the following reasons:

First - The tract of land proposed to be leased as described in the ordinance in question, extends from the mean high water mark on the east to the U.S. Government bulkhead line on the west, thereby absolutely cutting the City's tide lands into two sections.

Second - The unqualified provision is made in the ordinance authorizing the City government to extend its streets through the parcel of land proposed to be leased when it may desire to do so.

Third - The words in the last three lines of Section 2 of the ordinance in question are objectionable, and read as follows: "upon paying to the lessees reasonable compensation for damages occasioned by such annulment, change or modification." In accordance with this wording, no streets or other passage ways could be opened through the tract of land proposed to be leased, without the City first paying to the lessees damages for so doing. This is entirely wrong. Either the streets and railroads should be laid out in advance and the lease made to conform with them, or some unimpeachable clause should be inserted in the ordinance authorizing the City Government to lay out such streets and railroads through the leased lands as may by them be deemed desirable, and without payment to any one.



The Honorable, The Common Council,

City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:-

I herewith return to your Honorable Body without my approval an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 2341 of the ordinances of the City of San Diego", for the following reasons:

First: The adoption of this ordinance would mean a net reduction in the revenue of the City of \$12,000 per annum. This deficit would have to be made up by placing the same in the tax levy for the coming year.

Second: I cannot see the justice in reducing the Class "A" restaurant license from \$150.00 per month to \$100.00 per month, when this class "A" restaurant license permits the sale of the identical goods that the regular saloon sells. The regular saloon paying the old license of \$150.00 per month.

Third: The adoption of the ordinance in question would of right and justice, entitled the saloon men to make application to the Council for a like reduction of \$50.00 per month, which could not with consistency be refused.

As there are fifty-five (55) of such saloon licenses in effect, this would entail a loss in revenue to the City of \$2,750 per month, or \$33,000 per annum, which sum would likewise be placed upon the tax payer for the coming year.

This extra tax would partly be borne by the other retail and wholesale houses of the City, who unfortunately have not the opportunity to appeal to the Council for relief as is proposed in the ordinance in question.
