FINDINGS OF THE COMMITTEE.

This matter coming on regularly to be heard before the Common Council of the City of San Diego, State of California, sitting as a committee of the whole council and having been heard upon the recommendation of Hon. Edwin M. Capps, Mayor of said City, pursuant to the request set forth in a written communication addressed by said Mayor to the Honorable Common Council under date of August 28th, 1916, document numbered 102276, requesting the appointment by the Common Council of a committee to investigate the matter of the alleged payment of excessive prices for medical supplies furnished the City of San Diego, during certain times mentioned in the official report of John J. Hetzel, Public Accountant, and in particular that portion of said report contained on pages 145 to 191, both inclusive; and said Common Council pursuant to the request of said Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, having at a regular meeting of said Common Council held on the 18th day of September, A.D. 1916, upon motion regularly made and seconded, declared that the matter of said investigation be referred to the Common Council sitting as a committee of the whole and appointing Monday, September 18th, 1916, at 2 o'clock P.M. of said date, the time for the hearing of said

matter; and said matter coming on regularly to be heard before said Common Council, sitting as a committee of the whole, on said 18th day of September, A.D. 1916, and all the members of said Common Council being present, and the Vice President of said Common Council being in the chair, the investigation and hearing having been held, witnesses having been sworn, oral testimony having been heard, documentary evidence having been considered and arguments of all the parties concerned having been made and considered, the said Common Council sitting as committee of the whole having been fully advised in the premises, and having fully considered all the evidence introduced, and all reasonable and fair deductions therefrom, hereby finds and declares, that any and all charges and allegations against the purchasing department, or the Department of Finance, Ways and Means of the City of San Diego, and against the Board of Health of the City of San Diego, and the firm of Ferris & Ferris, druggists of the City of San Diego, which charges and allegations are particularly set forth in the report of said Public Accountant John J. Hetzel, for the year 1915, between pages 145 to 191, both inclusive of said report, are, and the same are hereby found and declared to be unwarranted, unfounded and unsupported by the facts proven at the hearing herein.

It is further found and declared by said committee of the whole council, that Otto M. Schmidt, formerly Superintendent of the Department of Finance, Ways and Means, Doctor A.E. Banks, Health Officer of the City of San Diego and Carl I. Ferris of the firm of Ferris & Ferris are, and they are hereby publicly commended for the manner in which they in the capacities above mentioned conducted the campaign waged against an epidemic of smallpox which threatened to become virulent in this municipality during the period of time mentioned in said report, wherein supplies were furnished to the Health Department of said City by the firm of Ferris & Ferris, druggists.

That this committee, acting for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, hereby extends to Carl I. Ferris and his associates the thanks of the municipality for the services rendered during the epidemic above mentioned.

That the City Clerk of the City of San Diego, be and he is hereby directed to furnish copies of these findings to the Mayor, the members of the Common Council, to Doctor A.E. Banks, Health Officer, to the firm of Ferris & Ferris, druggists, to the public press and to the Common Council, which copy shall be document numbered and filed in the official records of the City of San Diego.






