

Under the provisions of Article IX, Chapter III of the City Charter, a Board of Health shall be established; this is mandatory. Under the same provisions, Section 5, this same Board of Health shall appoint a Health Officer, This is also mandatory.

It appears from the wording of the proposed ordinance that a "Department of Public Health" is to be created, authorizing the appointment of a Superintendent of the Department of Public Health. The duties of which clearly overlaps the authority of the Board of Health, and further that it duplicates and complicates the duties of said Board. It is a useless proceeding. CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

FOR THAT WHEREAS, Section 11 of Chapter I of Article III of the Charter of the City of San Diego provides as follows:

WHEREAS, Honorable Edwin M. Capps has been the duly elected, qualified and acting Mayor of the City of San Diego since the first day of May, 1915; and

Capps has, since said first day of May,1915, wholly neglected and failed to perform the duty of appointing a Chief of Police of the City of San Diego, which duty is specifically enjoined upon said Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, by the Charter provision hereinbefore set forth; and

WHEREAS, there is no power in the CommonlCouncil of said City to appoint a Chief of Police; and

WHEREAS, this Common Council is of the opinion that the present disorganized and inefficient condition of the Police force of the City of San Diego is due wholly and entirely to the failure of Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, to perform the duties imposed upon him by Charter provision, and to appoint a Chief of Police of the City of San Diego, and to the consequent lack of authority of the present acting head of the Police Department and to the uncertainty which exists, and since the first day of May, 1915, has existed, with reference to the tenure of office of the present acting head of the Police Department and the uncertainty as to the appointment or time of appointment of any successor, and the consequent lack of organization and discipline in the Police Department and the attendant lack of efficient direction by the acting head of said Department; and

WHEREAS, Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor of the City of San Diego, has, on the 22nd day of November, 1916, handed to each member of the Common Council a communication, attached to which are copies of reports of investigations made of certain cafes in the City of San Diego wherein intoxicating liquors are sold, and in which reports certain conditions are detailed and alleged to exist which should have been suppressed by the Police Department of said City immediately upon the ascertainment of the alleged facts set forth in said reports; and

WHEREAS, such investigations and reports have been made by members of the Police Department, which Department, under the Charter provisions and under the State law is vested with the power and charged with the responsibility of preventing crime and suppressing vice; and

WHEREAS, no report has been filed with this Common Council by the acting head of the Police Department, J. Keno Wilson, in any manner touching upon the reports of the respective members of the Police Department, which reports have been made to Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor; and

WHEREAS, this Common Council did, on the 3rd day of May, 1915, being the first regular meeting of the present Common Council of said City, pass resolutions appointing the heads of the respective departments where the Common Council was authorized to appoint such heads of departments; and

WHEREAS, Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has failed, neglected and refused to appoint a Chief of Police, or to submit to the Common Council for confirmation the name of any person to act as Chief of Police, and has failed, neglected and refused to reappoint J. Keno Wilson Chief of Police, or to submit to this Common Council for confirmation the name of J. Keno Wilson for reappointment; and

WHEREAS, this Common Council is of the opinion that since the first day of May, 1915, Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has been attempting to act as Chief of Police of the City of San Diego and to direct the policy of the Police Department, and to this end has wilfully failed and refused to comply with the provisions of the Charter and appoint one other than himself to act in such capacity; and

WHEREAS, this Common Council is of the opinion that such action on behalf of Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has resulted in and is wholly and entirely the cause of the present deplorable condition of the Police Department of the City of San Diego, and as a direct result and consequence thereof has allowed the existence of conditions in this municipality which would not be possible with a well organized and efficient Police Department; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Common Council to do all in their power to compel Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, to perform his duties as defined by Charter Provision in the matter of the appointment of a Chief of Police; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Common Council to do all in its power to assist in the organization of an efficient Police Department, in order that crime may be prevented and vice suppressed: NOW THEREFOR.

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows: That it is hereby determined and declared,-

First: That Honorabe, Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has, since the first day of May, 1915 failed, neglected and refused to perform the duty imposed upon him by Charter provision in the matter of the appointment of a Chief of Police.

Second: That Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has, since the first day of May, 1915, exercised, or attempted to exercise, the duties of the Chief of Police of the Police Department of said City.

Third: That the failure, neglect and refusal of Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, to appoint a Chief of Police and the attempted exercise by said Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, of the duties of Superintendent or Chief of Police, has resulted in a disorganized and inefficient Police Department and a consequent failure to apprehend criminals and prevent violations of State and municipal laws.

Fourth: That it is the desire of this Common Council to take such steps as will remedy the evils now existing as the result of conditions above set forth.

Fifth: That the Common Council of the City of San Diego hereby call upon and demand Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor of the City of San Diego, to immediately appoint a Chief of Police as authorized and required by the provisions of Section ii of Chapter I of Article III of the City Charter of said City of San Diego.

Sixth: That in the event said Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, has failed to appoint a Chief of Police, or to submit to the Common Council for confirmation the name of a person to act as Chief of Police on or before Thursday, the seventh day of December, 1916, the City Attorney is hereby authorized and directed to commence mandamus proceedings against Honorable Edwin M. Capps, Mayor, to compel said Mayor to comply with the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Diego, and to appoint a Chief of Police or Superintendent of the Police Department of said City.

A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance providing for licensing and regulating certain businesses, trades, professions, callings and occupations in the City of San Diego, is presented and read, viz:

"San Diego, California, December 11th, 1916.

The Honorable, the Common Council,

City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen: -

I am herewith returning to your Honorable Body, without my approval, an ordinance entitled, 'An Ordinance providing for licensing and regulating certain business, trades, professions, callings and occupations in the City of San Diego,' for the following reasons:

First: Referring to Section 7, which reads as follows:

'Upon the contents of the report of the License Inspector the Chief of Police of said City may grant or deny the application, or may, in his discretion, require a further investigation by said License Inspector, or by other means. The Chief of Police shall have the power to deny any application if it be deemed by him that the applicant is not a suitable or proper person to carry on the business for which aslicense is required, or if the place at which the same is proposed to be located, practiced, carried on, or conducted is not a suitable or proper place therefor. If any application is denied, the amount of money deposited with the License Inspector by the applicant shall be returned to the applicant.

The said Chief of Police of said City shall on or before the tenth day of each month send to the Common Council of said City two reports, one a detailed report of all licenses applied for and granted during the preceding month, and the other a detailed report of all licenses applied for and denied during the preceding month. The said monthly reports made as herein provided shall be filed with the City Clerk of said City, and shall form a part of the records of said City Clerk.

It is seen from this provision that the Chief of Police is to grant or deny any license applied for, which appears to be final, but as will be observed in reading the second paragraph of Section 12, which reads as follows:

'The Common Council shall upon the filing of a written petition with the City Clerk appoint a time for the hearing of an application for a license hereint provided for which has been denied by the Chief of Police. At least one day's notice of such hearing shall be given by said City Clerk to the License Inspector and to the Chief of Police. Upon the hearing of the application the Common Council may approve the order of the Chief of Police refusing a license, or order a license to be granted, or refer the application to the License Inspector for further consideration."

The power of the Chief of Police to deny an application for a license is deftly taken away from him and placed in the Council, which annuls the force of the whole provision.

The power conferred upon the Chief of Police to grant a license, should also confer the absolute power to deny. Also the power conferred upon the Chief of Police to grant a license, should also grant the power to revoke a license.

In the last statement, the power to revoke a license lies entirely in the Common Council, as will be seen by reading the first paragraph of Section 12, which reads as follows:

'The Common Council may at any time, for any cause by them deemed sufficient, revoke any license herein provided for, which has been granted or issued. When any license has been revoked, the Common Council may or may not, in its discretion, return that part of the paid license fee which is proportionate to the period which would otherwise have elapsed before the termination of the license.'

It is evident from reading these sections that the Common Council slyly unloads the responsibility of handling these upon the Chief of Police, which the Charter and the Ordinances of this City make it the plain duty of the Common Council to perform.

The Council at the same time in the proposed ordinance retaining full power to undermine the Chief of Police when it is advantageous to them to do so.

These powers should exist absolutely, either in the Common Council or in the Chief of Police, but not in both.

Section 19 reads as follows:

'No license shall be granted or issued to any person to occupy for private purposes

any part of any public street, sidewalk, alley or other public place unless such person shall file with the License Inspector the written consent of the person in possession of the real property abutting upon the proposed fixed location of the business, vehicle, stand, or other object contemplated by the person desiring such license.

No license contemplated in this ordinance shall be granted or issued to any person to occupy any portion of any public street, sidewalk, alley, or other public place, within that certain district of the City of San Diego to be known as the central congested district

or that district bounded as follows, to-wit: On the north by the north side of B street, on the east by the east side of Seventh street, on the south by the south side of F street, and on the west by the west side of First street.

This provision is objectionable, for the reason that the streets of this City belong to its citizens, and should at all times be under the direct control of the City Authorities. Under the provisions of the section referred to in the proposed ordinance, the City practically conveys to the abutting property holder the streets in front of their respective properties to be used by them for hire, directly reducing the authority of the Police Department in governing street traffic, and incidentally conferring upon the property holder the right to collect tribute from public property that he is not entitled to.

I am of the opinion that basements under the sidewalks should pay a rental to the City for their use.

Section 30 of the proposed ordinance reads as follows:

'For selling newspapers or periodicals by outcry and all other hawkers of goods or merchandise upon any public street, sidewalk, alley or other public place not herein specifically enumerated the sum of \$15.00 per quarter; except by special permit of the Chief of Police of said City of San Diego.'

The clause, "except by special permit of the Chief of Police of said City of San Diego," is objectionable and practically vitiates the whole section in that the Chief of Police will be importuned by every one for a free license. It is self-evident that no one will be willing to pay the \$15.00 quarterly license fee, if he can induce the Chief of Police to grant him a license for nothing. This would cause no end of trouble for the Chief of Police, accusation of favoriteism, resultant friction and dissatisfaction. This clause should be expunged.

Sections 53 and 54 of the proposed ordinance reads as follows:

'Section 53. For every person, firm or corporation maintaining, carrying on, engaging in or pursuing the business of a laundry or wash house conducted for profit, operated by machinery driven by power other than muscular power, where clothing, suits, garments, handkerchiefs and other similar articles are cleansed or pressed, the sum of \$10.00 per year. Section 54. For every person, firm, or corporation maintaining, carrying on, or engaging in or pursuing the business of a laundry or wash house conducted for profit, not operated by machinery driven by power other than muscular power, where clothing, suits, garments, handkerchiefs and other similar articles are cleansed or pressed, the sum of \$5.00 per year.'

If the washing and cleaning of soiled linen is not a most necessary function of modern civilization, I do not know what it is. Why tax this business any more than tax dry goods stores, grocery stores, etc. It certainly does not require police regulation any more than the last named businesses.

City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen: -

I am herewith returning to your Honorable Body, without my approval, an ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance fixing and declaring the budget allowance of the City of San Diego and the various Departments thereof for the fiscal year beginning Janary First, 1917," for the following reasons:

First: The ordinance in question does not provide a secret service fund for the detection of crime, that cannot be secured through the ordinary channels of the Police Department proper. This fund is of the utmost importance and its elimination is a serious error in favor of the criminal element of this City. If violations of the law prevail in this City, it will in a large measure be attributable to this omission.

Second: The failure to provide funds in the ordinance to pay the Mayor's secretary, is objectionable.

Third: The reduction of the Police budget in that it does not provide funds for the full complement of matrons, on the grounds of economy, while in the next breath raises the salary of the Superintendent of the Bureau of Identification, both of which are objectionable.

Fourth: The establishment of a City Chamberlain in the City Hall would entail an extraordinary expense in the cutting out and rearrangement of the rooms, while the employment of such an official would not be acceptable. All of which is objectionable.

For the above reasons, together with others of less importance, I am returning Document No.105101 without my approval.

Gentlemen: -

I am herewith returning to your Honorable body, without my approval, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance providing for licensing and regulating certain businesses, trades, professions, callings and occupations in the City of San Diego," for the following reasons:

First: Section 21, on page 7, is objectionable in that it permits the property holder to rent out the streets, a public property; and further, practically places the control of the street traffic in charge of the property holder for purposes of the character mentioned.

In the second paragraph of the same section 21, last line, reading as follows:

"At a point or place where there is congestion of traffic," is susceptible of endless interpretation, and consequently embarrassing the Police Department in administering the law.

Second: Section 49. Legislation upon astrologers, seers, soothsayers, fortune tellers, mind readers, palmists, and clairvoyants, placing a tax of \$300.00 per quarter upon them appears to be unreasonable if the businesses referred to are permissible at all, which under the provisions of the proposed ordinance it proposes to recognize them as such. The magnitude of the tax seems to decree their undesirability. If such is the case, they should not be permitted at all. The placing of a high tax on them does not in the least degree minimize their evil effects, if such they have.

Third: Section 54, page 17, objectionable, for the reason that it places a tax on the business of a laundry or wash house. In my opinion, this is unjust and discriminatory. Why place a tax on a laundry any more than any other business?

Fourth: Section 55, page 17, is objectionable for the same reasons as expressed last above mentioned.

Fifth: Section 56, page 17, is also objectionable for the reasons as stated in the third and foruth objections above.

The U.S. mails could and should have been employed to send the certificate of tide lands lease to the Government Engineers at Los Angeles, which could not have cost more than 22 cents; this amount would have registered, paid special messenger and U.S. postage. The authorities at Sacramento had confidence enough in the mails to send the document down to this City by mail.

The Resolution No.22360, authorizing this expenditure, recites:

"That Honorable H.R. Fay be and he is hereby authorized and directed to immediately proceed to Los Angeles, California, and there confer with G.B. Pillsbury, Major, Corps of Engineers, United States Engineers Office, for the purpose of ascertaining the attitude of the engineers of the War Department in the matter of pending and contemplated improvements to be undertaken by public and private capital in the Bay of San Diego.

That said Honorable H.R. Fay be and he is further authorized and directed to deliver to said Major G.B. Pillsbury certificates of the Surveyor General of the State of California and of the City Clerk of the City of San Diego showing title to the tide lands commonly known as Dutch Flats conveyed to the United States.

That authorization is hereby conferred to incur expense necessary or incident to observing the direction of this resolution."

There is no possible attitude of the U.S. Engineers in regard to any matter concerning this bay, that cannot be ascertained through correspondence out of the City Clerk's office at a cost of a few postage stamps.
