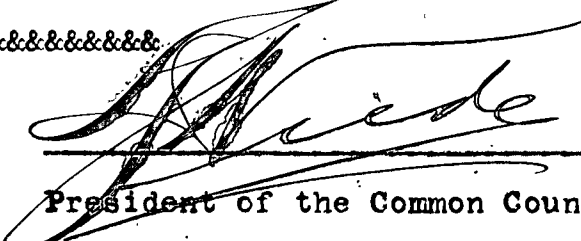

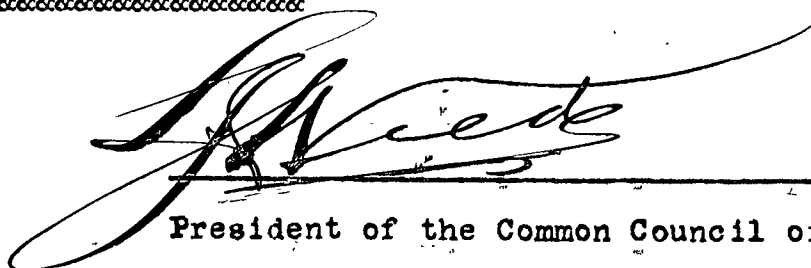

A Message from the Mayor/authorizing the purchase of one motor driven sweeper and appropriating \$6500. in payment thereof, is presented and read, viz:

"March 11, 1918.

Gentlemen of the Council

of the City of San Diego, Calif.

Honored Sirs:

With reference to the ordinance which I have this day vetoed and am returning herewith, entitled, "An Ordinance authorizing the purchase in the Open market, without advertising for bids, of one motor driven sweeper, and appropriating the sum of \$6500.00 in payment thereof."

The intention of the charter is, that ordinances shall not provide ways and means whereby sums in excess of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars of the city's money can be used without advertising for bids in the open market, from any department or from any item.

It is true this measure has not been adhered to where strict emergency was necessary, but it appears to me that a sum of \$6500.00 for a motor driven street sweeper is too large an amount and of too much importance to rush into the market and take the first blush offering.

Section 2 of the proposed ordinance reads, "That the sum of six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6500.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, be, and the same is hereby set aside, etc." It would seem as a pure business proposition to fill such an emergency, as the Council may deem necessary, that the Manager of Operation and the



Purchasing Department could have had competitive figures and a definite amount presented to the Council to pay for that which in their judgment was the best bargain, the most practical sweeper, and a better reason why this large amount should not have called for some publicity and competition.

The question to determine is -- is it necessary, at this particular time, when war prices are to be met; can we not get along with what we have, at least for the present, and should not the Council know about the amount required before they issue ordinances in excess of amounts provided by the charter?

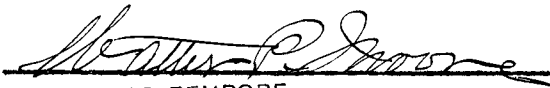

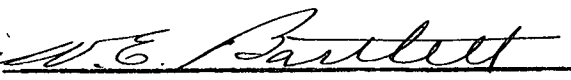

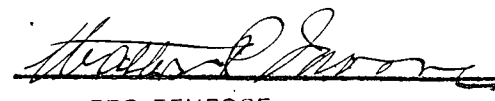

Honored Sirs:-

With reference to the ordinance which I have this day vetoed and am returning herewith, entitled, "An Ordinance prohibiting the utterance or use of seditious language, or of words tending to disturb the public peace,"

The intention of the ordinance is good, but it should be so worded to conform with the President's proclamation and not in conflict with federal authority, for the reason that this ordinance might or could be innocently or wilfully abused. Personal spite, frame-ups, hot-heads or political enemies could take advantage of innocent citizens or loyal subjects. No act, ordinance or resolution of a municipality should override the diplomatic utterances of the President and the Federal Government, especially in a time of war. Keep your mouth shut, your powder dry and buy Liberty Bonds.

Honored Sirs:

With reference to the ordinance which I have this day vetoed, and which I am returning herewith, entitled, 'An Ordinance relating to water service and rates', wish to say I have compared this ordinance with the one vetoed by me on March 4, 1918, and I do not find any material change, in fact, they almost are identical. I must maintain the same attitude for the same reasons which caused me, after careful consideration, to veto that unwarranted, unguarded and inequitable measure.

My opinion is confirmed by the sound judgment of disinterested and experienced business interests of both small and large consumers, and even the people who were interested in putting forth this ordinance, were in doubt about its advantages or disadvantage. However, the Mayor is not in doubt about it.

Water users have not been heard in open session and vital necessities, like water, gas, electricity, bread and meat must not be put beyond the reach of the average citizen by the profiteer or by an inefficient or wasteful management of public moneys.

Furthermore, these are war times and we are expected to encourage the housewife small farmer and poor people with their war gardens, and not discourage and heap burdens and numerous committments upon them.

The Mayor will veto all ordinances which work a hardship upon the general public, wasteful street improvement and unnecessary expenditures of money.

The Mayor is willing to sign a water ordinance which is clean cut and equitable to all, alike, and when no advantage is given or taken, providing however, that such fund created, is set aside as a separate fund for water purposes only, and for the further development of water by competent, non-political engineers and under direction of a water commission composed of level-headed business men, who would serve the City for this purpose and not for any personal or invisible interests.
