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A Message from the Mayor vetoing an ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance  
No.7500, creating offices in the Health Department, is presented and read, viz:

"October 3rd, 1918.

Gentlemen of the Council,

of the City of San Diego, Calif.

Honored Sirs:

With reference to the ordinance, which I have this day vetoed and am returning  
herewith, entitled, 'An Ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No.7500 of the ordinances  
of the City of San Diego, entitled, "An Ordinance amending Sections 2 and 3 of Ordinance  
No.7293 of the ordinances of the City of San Diego, entitled, An Ordinance creating and



establishing offices and employments in the Health Department of the City of San Diego, California, and fixing the compensation appurtenant thereto, approved February 20, 1918, adopted August 28, 1918."

I have vetoed this ordinance on account of an unequal graduation of salaries, disregarding demands upon employees receiving less than \$100 a month, who have families; disregard for the union scale of wages for carpenters, which should be six (\$6.00) dollars per day; disregard for the common laborer's scale of wages, which should be no less than three (\$3.00) dollars per day. All married attendants, with children, who are receiving salaries under \$100.00 per month, should be substantially increased. Such salaries in excess of \$125.00 per month should not be increased more than 5 or 10 per cent, if any.

The analysis of any department salary increase, should be equitable and distributed in proportion to present livable demands, as well as efficiency and service to such departments. For the reasons given above I also veto proposed ordinance set forth in Document No. 117667.

His training and ability had been recognized outside his home City, and only recently he had been elected to the position of Secretary of the Pacific Coast Association of Port Authorities.

In his death the City of San Diego has lost an official whose every interest has been the advancement of the commercial importance of this harbor, and whose loyalty has been unquestioned.

To his bereaved wife and father this Common Council extends the sincere sympathy of its individual members, and feels that it is expressing the sentiments of the entire community in the adoption of this resolution.

I have vetoed this ordinance because an agreement entered into between the liquor interests and Government Agent Lieut. Reilly was changed in the ordinance without the knowledge or consent of parties interested:

Second:- Because such changes will seriously effect the carrying out of the intent of Lieut. Reilly's amendment to the War Measure Ordinance framed by Major General Strong and Major Kind, in 1918:

Third: Because the two paragraphs, changed in old ordinance by the amendments, would produce the opposite effect and create numerous new ways and loop-holes to bootlegging since they allow the retailer to increase the day sales of small bottle goods to individual customers, creating fifty-three avenues to increase the traffic:

Fourth: Because this amended ordinance makes a wholesaler out of the retailer, and has no object other than to help a few retailer liquor dealers who are overstocked and who feel they might not rid themselves of their wines and liquors by next July:

Fifth: Because the words, "or permitted to be made," are omitted in Paragraph No.2, Page No.3 of this ordinance. The remainder of ordinance, from Page No.3, Paragraph



No.1, to Page No.6 inclusive, is o.k. and were the original amendments agreed upon between the government agents and liquor dealers.

First - Because the Council has no definite plans or cost of construction - nor has soundings for permanent foundation been made in channel;

Second - Because steel bridge with permanent footings could not, under any circumstances, be completed or be of any benefit whatever this season;

Third - Because the bridge ordinance was advanced on misleading, outside propaganda - being political and intimidating private enterprises by threatening trade and Los Angeles alliance;

Fourth - Because four miles of finished good roads connecting the highway to Escondido is of vastly more benefit to Escondido and San Diego, than 400 feet of fancy bridge.

Fifth - Because other points of unfinished roads to highways are of more importance to San Diego than a political bridge to serve a private interest instead of a community interest;

Sixth - Because our city finances are not such at this time that we can indulge in immediate luxuries to help a friend;



Seventh - Because the Arizona Railroad will be completed this summer and water, and good roads and warehouses for cargo are prominent necessities we must provide for at once to protect and promote domestic and foreign trade activities, close at hand.

Eighth - Because the Hardy bridge is not a community demand - is not a vital necessity - is not a priority privilege - and the majority of our people and the best interests of our city as a whole, is better served by spending our limited means where it will do the greatest good;

Ninth - Because it is not up to this Council to burden the incoming new Council in two months from now, with a depleted treasury and unnecessary commitments - that a new, businessman's Council might seriously object to and that conditions at that time might alter.
