The report of the Joint Street Committee, to whom was referred the protest and objections to grading Eleventh Street, was adopted and is as follows, to-wit:

To the Honorable Common Council of the leity of San Diego, Sentlemen:

The Joint Street Committee, to whom was referred the matter of muestigating the written protest and objections to the proposed grading of Eleventh Street from the north line of Il Street to the south line of the bity Park, as shown by the Resolution of Intentron heretofore passed by your honorable body, and now on file in the office of the belerk of the said beity of San Diego, respectfully report as follows;

After the above matter had been referred to your committee, a meeting of said committee was duly set for the 20th day of June, 18 95, at the hour of 7:30 P.M. and due notice thereof given to all persons interested in the same, of the time and place fixed for the meeting of the said committee and when the said protest and objections would be heard and investigated.

It the time and place fixed for the meeting of said committee, evidence was heard from J. B. Hooker, S. B. Holland, C. a. Burgoyne, J. P. Preston, Levi Chase and others, relative to the signing of said protest and objections, and of the ownership of property on said street, and thereafter your committee adjourned to the 22nd day of June, 1895, at the hour of 10 o'clock aM., when further evidence was heard regarding the said signing of the said protest or objections, the ownership of property fronting on said street, and the right of persons to sign said protest or objections, and after said matter had been thoroughly investigated, and said evidence duly considered, your committee conclude, find, and report that said protest, or objections does not represent a majority of all the property fronting upon said street between the points to be graded, as set forth in the Resolution of Intention, filed in the office of the belerk of the said beity, in the said matter, and that said protest or objections is not legal, and that said protest or objections has not been legally signed by the owners of a majority of the frontage on said street, between the said points to be graded, as set out in said Resolution of Intention.

Therefore your Committee recommends that the said protest or objections be desired and disallowed and that the accompanying

resolution be adopted.

Section 1. Eevery sperson who shall be found drunk in or upon any public street, sidewalk, highway, square, alley, or other public place within the leity of San Drigo, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding Thirty Dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the sperson so fined may be imprisoned in the leity sprison of the leity of San Drigo, at the rate of one day for every \$2.00 of the fine imposed.

Section 2. Every person who shall be quilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct in or upon any of the streets, sidewalks, or

other public places in said leity, or who shall make any loud noise or disturbance, or use any loud, noisy, boisterous, vulgar or indecent language, on any of the streets, sidewalks, or other public places in said leity, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding lifty Dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the leity prison of the leity of San Diego, at the sate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the "San Diegan Sun" the official newspaper of said leity.

An Ardinance to Prevent the carrying of Concealed Weapons was read and adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Ayes—Aldermen Beard, Dodson, Sweeney, Spears, Blockman and Bachman.

On Ordinance to Prevent the Carrying of Concealed Reapons Within the City of San Diego, California, and fixing a Penalty for its Violation.

Be it ardained, By the beommon Council of the beity of San Diego, as follows:

Section! It shall be unlawful for any person to wear or carry concealed upon or about his person, in this leity, any pistol, shing shot, brass or iron Anuckles, sand club, dirk Knife, bowie Knife, or other dangerous or deadly weapon. The Police Commission for a period of not exceeding six months, to any peaceable person whose profession or occupation may require him to be out at late hours of the night, to carry deadly weapons upon his person, for his own protection.

Section 2. levery person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed quilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding for Hundred Dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the leity prison of

the leity of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every Two Dollars of the fine imposed; provided, however, if it shall be proved from the testimony on the trial of any such case, that the accused was at the time of carrying any concealed weapon or weapons as aforesaid, a peace officer, or a traveller actually engaged in making a journey, or had a permit granted by the Police Commissioners of said beity, as aforesaid, the accused shall be acquitted Such persons, and no others, shall be deemed "travellers" within the meaning of this Ordinance, as may be actually engaged in making a journey at the time.

Section 3. Section 39, of Ordinance No. 19 of the Ordinances of said leity, entitled "An Ordinance for the prevention of offense against the peace, good order and health of the leity of San Diego" approved august 232, 1886, and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and bein force from and after its passage, and one publication in the "San Diegan Sun" the official newspaper of said leity.

An Ordinance to regulate the closing of saloons and places where intoxicating liquous are slept for sale within the leity of San Diego, Sealifornia, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordanied, By the Common Council of the leity of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby made unlawful for any owner, Keeker, or proprietor of any salown, bar, or bar-room, or any owner Keeker, or proprietor of any place where malt, spirituous, or vinous, or any intoxicating liquors, or drinks are disk for sale at retail, within said leity of San Diego to deep such salown, bar, or bar-room, or such place where any malt, spirituous, vinous, or any intoxicating liquors or drinks are dist for sale at retail, open or lighted up between the

hours of twelve o'clock midnight and five o'clock am. of any day.

Section 2. It is hereby made unlawful for any owner, Keeper, or proprietor of any salom, bar, or bar-rome within said leity, or any runer, Keeper, or proprietor of any place where malt, specitions, vinous, or any intoxicating bignors or drinks, are dept for sale at retail, within said leity to permit any person, except the members of his own family and his bar-tender, to be or remaining or about any such salom, bar, or bar-room, or place where malt, spirituous, vinous, or any intoxicating bignors, or drinke are dept for sale at retail between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and five o'clock all, of any day.

Section 3. Every person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any aum not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not spaid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the leity Prison of the leity of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to Drug Stores.




