Sign An Ordinance establishing the Grade of Hawthorne Street between 5th Street and the City Park. Also An Ordinance establishing the Grade of Sixth Street from "B" Street to the City Park, also An Ordinance establishing the Grade of Fourth Street, between Ivy and Maple Streets.

A communication from a number of citizens residing in the vicinity of N and 16th Streets, requesting the Council to cause a Bird Alarm Box to be placed on said corner, was read and referred to the Joint Fire Committee.

A communication from the Pound Master, appointing Frank Cato, Deputy Pound Keeper, in accordance with provisions of Ordinance 294, was read and on motion duly confirmed.

The following named persons were granted permission to construct artificial stone sidewalks in front of their respective lots, viz: Mrs Hewitt, Hackett and Littlefield, R. Champion, Trustees Keener Chappell & P. Johnson, being in front of Lots J. J and K, Block 60, also Lots J. K and L Blk 43, Hortons Addition.

Resolution of Award

Of Contract for sidewalking and crosswalking "C" Street from the East line of Fourth Street to the West line of Twelfth Street; Resolved that the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, having in open session on the 1st day of April A.D. 1895 opened examined and publicly declared

all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following work, to-wit: That "C" Street in said City from the line of Fourth Street to the west line of twelfth street (except such portions thereof as are already sidewalked with artificial stone or concrete and bituminous rock.) be sidewalked on both sides thereof with artificial stone or concrete; and that the intersections of said "C" Street, be crosswalked on both sides of "C" Street from the west line of Seventh Street to the East line of twelfth Street with bituminous rock.

The sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of Ordinance No. 226, approved August 15th, 1894.

The crosswalks shall be constructed in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 252, approved April 24th, 1894. hereby rejects all of said bids except that next herein mentioned and hereby awards the contract for said work to the lowest regular responsible bidder, to-wit: T. J. Engelbrech at the following prices, as specified in his proposal on file for said work, to-wit: Bituminous crosswalks in accordance with Ordinance No. 252, per square foot thirteen and one half cents.

Sidewalks in accordance with Ordinance No. 226, per square foot, eleven and one half cents.

The clerk of this City is hereby directed to post notice of this award conspicuously for five days on or near the Council Chamber door of this City, and also publish said notice in the San Diego Sun a daily newspaper, published and circulated in this City therefor and hereby designated for two days.

Delegate Hakes makes a motion that when the Board adjourns it be till Monday April 22nd 1895, at 7:30 P.M. said motion was adopted.

Rules of the Board of Delegates.

Rule 1. The regular meeting of the Board of Delegates shall be on the first Monday of each month, or if that be a legal holiday then on the next day, at the hour of 7:30 p.m.

Rule 2. The President shall call the Board to order precisely at the hour appointed for the meeting.

Rule 3. The roll of Delegates shall be called by the Clerk and the absentees, if any, noted.

Rule 4. The Standing Committees shall be as follows:

1st. Ways and Means. 8th. Public Buildings.

2^d. Streets, Alleys, Highways and Parks. 9th. Harbor and Wharves.

3^d. Sewers.

10th. Health and Morals.

4th. Fire.

11th. Schools and Library

5th. Water.

12th. Police

6th. Finance

13th. Gas, Electric Light and
Telephones

7th. City Lands.

Order of Business.

Rule 5. The Order of Business shall be as follows: Reading Minutes of Previous Meeting; Signing by the President of Ordinances; Mayor's Messages;

Unfinished Business; Reports of Committees; Franchises and Resolutions; Communications; Memorials and Ordinances.

Rule 6. No member shall vote when personally interested in the decision of the question before the Council, nor shall any member be security on any bond, note or obligation to the City.

Rule 7. Any member desiring to address the Board, shall rise to his feet and address the presiding officer, otherwise he shall not be recognized or heard. This rule shall also apply to the making of motions and seconding the same.

Rule 8. No personal or improper language shall be allowed in the presence of the Board while in session by members of the Board, or any other person, under penalty; if by one not a member of the Board, to expulsion from the room during the session, and if by a member of the Board, to such punishment as may be fixed by this Board.

Rule 9. When two members arise at the same time to address the Chair, the presiding officer shall decide which shall have the floor.

Rule 10. When the presiding officer desires to leave the Chair, he shall appoint some member of the Board to fill the same; or when absent from any meeting, the Board shall fill the Chair pro tem. during the time of such absence.

Rule 11. When an amendment to a resolution or motion is moved and seconded, the vote shall in all cases be first upon the amendment, and more than one amendment to an amendment shall not be allowed to the same question.

Rule 12. A motion to refer to a Committee or to lay on the table, shall, if seconded, preclude all amendments to the main question until such motion is decided.

Rule 13. The previous question being moved and seconded, shall preclude all further debate until it has been decided.

Rule 14. When the yeas and nays are called, the names of the members shall be called by wards, numerically,

except the President, who shall vote last, and all members shall vote, unless excused by the Council for cause. A tally sheet of such vote shall be taken and preserved, until the proceedings of the meeting have been read and approved, and opposite the names of those not present the word "absent" shall be written so as to appear on the records.

Rule 15. When a question has been once put and voted upon, it shall be in order for any member, who voted with the prevailing vote, to move for the reconsideration thereof; but no motion for the reconsideration of any vote shall be made after the ordinance or resolution shall have gone out of the possession of the Board, and no motion of reconsideration shall be made, except at the meeting at which the resolution or ordinance was adopted. The Presiding Officer, when voting with the prevailing vote, may move to reconsider.

Rule 16. No person shall speak more than twice to the same question without leave of the Board, nor more than once until every member choosing to speak shall have spoken.

Rule 17. When a motion is seconded, it shall be stated by the Presiding Officer, before debate, and every such motion shall be reduced to writing, if any member desires it.

Rule 18. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received unless:

Rule 19. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.

Rule 20. Every member who shall be present when a question is put, shall vote for or against the same, unless the Board shall excuse him, or unless he be personally interested in the question, in which case he shall not vote, but no member shall be permitted to vote upon a question,

when a division is called, unless present when his name is called in its regular order.

Rule 21. A member called to order, shall immediately sit down, unless permitted to explain, and the Board, if appealed to, shall decide in the case, but without debate; if there be no appeal, the decision of the Presiding Officer shall be submitted to.

Rule 22. A Committee appointed to report, or any report of the City Attorney, on any subject; shall, if called for, report the facts in relation to the matter or subject referred, with their opinions thereon in writing, and no report shall be received as the report of the Committee, except the same be signed by a majority of the Committee, but nothing herein contained shall prevent a minority from submitting their report, which shall be read if called for.

Rule 23. No member shall absent himself after the Board of Delegates convenes, with^{out} permission from the Presiding Officer.

Rule 24. The City Clerk shall procure a book, to be called the "Committee Book," wherein he shall keep a correct list of all committees appointed, and for what purpose, also a list of all regular committees, and all questions referred to them. The President shall call for reports of all committees at every meeting of the Board.

Rule 25. No person other than the members of the Board shall address the Board on any matter, except by permission of the President or by vote of the Board.

Rule 26. All rules or parts of rules, or resolutions conflicting with these rules, are hereby repealed.

Rule 27. Questions not covered by these rules are governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

Rule 28. The Janitor shall be the Sergeant-at-Arms, and shall at all times, when directed by the President, enforce good order during the meetings of the Board.

Rule 29. The minutes of all meetings must be signed by the Presiding Officer and the City Clerk.

Rule 30. These rules may be revised, amended or abolished, only by a two-thirds vote of the Board.

At the northeast corner of Block numbered 4 of Nutt's Addition 284.50 feet.

At the northwest corner of Block numbered

5 of Citteredue's Addition, 283.50 feet.

And the grade of said Sixth Street between the points fixed by this Ordinance, shall be of uniform ascent and descent, as shown by the grade map made by the City Engineer and on file in his office.

The center of said street shall be an average elevation of the curb grades.

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the official newspaper of said City.

Delegate Baker here enters and takes his seat in the Board.

The report of the Joint Street Committee, and opinion of the City Attorney, in re. the veto of the Mayor, of the Ordinance establishing the grade of Sixth Street, from B Street to the City Park, was read and upon motion of Delegate Jones adopted and is as follows, viz:

To the Hon. The Common Council of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen:

Your Joint Street Committee to whom was referred the matter of investigating as to the status of the Ordinance establishing the grade of Sixth Street, in said City, from B Street to the City Park, as vetoed by the Mayor by Message of date May 4th 1895, herewith report that we have investigated said matter, and find from the opinion of the City Attorney hereto attached and made a part of this report, that said veto is of no effect and that said Ordinance became a law by reason of the failure of the Mayor to return said bill within the time required by law. We therefore find it to be the duty of the City Clerk to certify to said Ordinance and publish the same, and we recommend that he be so instructed.

To the members of the Joint Street Committee of the
Common Council of the City of San Diego.

Gentlemen:

In answer to your inquiry regarding the legal effect of the Mayor's returning, with his disapproval, the Ordinance establishing the grade of Sixth Street, twelve days after the same had been presented to him for his approval, I will reply as follows:

The said Ordinance was passed, approved and adapted by the Board of Aldermen of the said City of San Diego, on the 1st day of April, 1895, and signed in open session by the President of that Board April 23rd 1895; and was passed, approved and adapted by the Board of Delegates of the said City on the 1st day of April, 1895, and signed in open session by the President of the said Board of Delegates on the 8th day of April, 1895.

The said ordinance was on the 24th day of April, 1895, presented by the Clerk of the said City of San Diego, who was ex-officio Clerk of the Common Council of the said City of San Diego, to the Hon. Wm. H. Carlson, Mayor of the said City of San Diego, for his approval.

The Mayor, on the 6th day of May, 1895, at the hour of 3:30 P. M., returned said ordinance to the said Clerk with his disapproval. The Charter of the said City of San Diego provides that "every bill which shall have passed the two Boards, (Board of Aldermen and Board of Delegates) shall be presented to the Mayor for his approval. The Mayor shall return such bill to the Board in which it originated, within ten days after receiving it. If he approves it he shall sign it.

and it shall then become an ordinance. If he disapproves it, he shall specify such objections thereto in writing. If he do not return it with his disapproval, within the time above specified, it shall take effect the same as if he had approved it."

The old Constitution of this State provided, in Section 17 of Article 4 as follows: "Every bill which may have passed the Legislature shall, before it becomes a law, be presented to the Governor. If he approve it, he shall sign it; but if not, he shall return it with his objections to the house in which it originated, which shall enter the same upon the journals and proceed to reconsider it. x x x. If any bill shall not be returned within ten days after it shall have been presented to him, (Sundays excepted) the same shall be a law in like manner as if he had signed it. x x" All of which recitals in the old Constitution are included in our new Constitution. In the case of *Harpending vs. Haight*, 39 Cal., page 199, under the old Constitution above recited, a bill on the 17th day of March, 1870, passed the Senate and on the same day passed the Assembly. On the 19th day of March, 1870, at one o'clock P. M. of that day, said bill was presented to the Governor for his approval. On the 31st day of March, 1870, at 4:30 o'clock P. M., twelve days after the presentation of the bill to him, the Governor returned said bill to the Senate without his approval. An action was afterwards brought for a Writ of Mandamus commanding the Governor to authenticate the said bill, and the Court said in its decision: "The bill in question was presented to the Governor March 19th, and if he intended to return it with his objections he was, by the general language of the Constitution (above quoted) bound to do so within a prescribed time after its presentation to him." And the Court in that case held that the "return" must be a step taken by which his (the Governor's) own time for deliberation is ended and that for the deliberation of the legislative body begun; that the bill itself must be put beyond the executive possession; that it must be placed into the possession actual

or potential of the Legislative Body, and that the return was not sufficient, and the Court ordered the Writ of Mandamus to issue.

Our Charter above quoted is practically the same as said Constitution as far as the duties of the Executive Officer is concerned, except that Sundays are not excepted in our Charter.

Now in this case, the ordinance was presented to the Mayor on the 24th day of April, 1895, for his approval, and if he intended to return it with his objections, he was by the general language of the Charter bound to do so within the prescribed time, (ten days) after its presentation to him. Now the question is, did the Mayor make the required return of the ordinance to the Board in which it originated.

Under the case above cited, there can be no doubt of the meaning of the word "return" as applicable to this ordinance. It must be an act taken by the Mayor by which the bill itself is placed beyond his possession and into the possession of the Board in which it originated. It must constitute a delivery of the ordinance itself to the Board in which it originated, or to someone who had the power and authority to receive it for such Board. This ordinance was disapproved by the Mayor May 4th, 1895, but retained by the Mayor in his own possession until the afternoon of the 12th day after its presentation to him, and the return was not completed until its delivery to the Clerk of said City on the 6th day of May, 1895.

Said Section 17 of our Charter further provides, that "said Board shall after 5, and within 30 days after such bill shall have been^{so} returned, reconsider and vote upon the same" etc.

The disapproval was dated May 4th, 1895, (within the ten days) from the time it was presented to him, but it was not returned with his disapproval to the City Clerk, until May 6th, 1895, twelve days after its presentation to him, being a space of two days longer than the time prescribed by law.

If the said Section 17 of the Charter was construed to mean that the Mayor must disapprove an ordinance within ten days from the time it is presented to him, but may retain said ordinance with his disapproval beyond said prescribed time, i.e., ten days, then there is no fixed limit of time within which he must return said ordinance, and he could, were he so disposed, disapprove an ordinance within ten days after its presentation to him, retain the same in his possession for more than thirty days allowed for its being passed over his veto, and thus prevent the Council from taking further action on the ordinance.

The requirements of the Charter concerning the passage of ordinances are mandatory. The Charter provides that "If he, (the Mayor), do not return it, (the ordinance) with his disapproval within the time above specified, (ten days after its presentation to him) it shall take effect as if he had approved it."

I am therefore of the opinion that the said Ordinance was not returned with the Mayor's disapproval within the time prescribed by law, and that upon the expiration of the ten days after its presentation to the Mayor, it took effect as if the Mayor had approved it.

Section 2. Every person who shall be guilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct in or upon any of the streets, sidewalks, or other public places in said City, or who shall make any loud noise or disturbance

or use any loud, noisy, boisterous, vulgar or indecent language, on any of the streets, sidewalks, or other public places in said City, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the City prison of the City of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

An Ordinance to regulate the Closing of Saloons and places where intoxicating liquors are kept for sale within the City of San Diego, California, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby made unlawful for any owner, keeper, or proprietor of any Saloon, bar, or bar-room, or any owner, keeper, or proprietor of any place where malt, spirituous, or vinous, or any intoxicating liquors, or drinks are kept for sale at retail, within said City of San Diego to keep such Saloon, bar, or bar-room, or such place where any malt, spirituous, vinous, or any intoxicating liquors or drinks are kept for sale at retail, open or

lighted up between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight and five o'clock A. M. of any day.

Section 2. It is hereby made unlawful for any owner, keeper, or proprietor of any Saloon, bar, or bar-room within said City, or any owner, keeper, or proprietor of any place where malt, spirituous, vinous, or any intoxicating liquors or drinks, are kept for sale at retail, within said City to permit any person, except the members of his own family and his bartender, to be or remain in or about any such Saloon, bar, or bar-room, or place where malt, spirituous, vinous, or any intoxicating liquors, or drinks are kept for sale at retail between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and five o'clock A. M. of any day.

Section 3. Every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding Two hundred dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the City prison of the City of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to Drug Stores.

Section 5. All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the "San Diego Sun" the official newspaper of said City.

An Ordinance to prevent the carrying of concealed weapons within the City of San Diego, California, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to wear or carry concealed upon or about his person, in this city, any pistol, stung-shot, brass or iron knuckles, sand club, dirk knife, bowie knife, or other dangerous or deadly weapon. The Police Commissioners of this City may grant written permission for a period of not exceeding six months, to any peaceable person whose profession or occupation may require him to be out at late hours of the night, to carry concealed deadly weapons upon his person, for his own protection.

Section 2. Every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding two hundred dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the City prison of the City of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed; provided, however, if it shall be proved from the testimony on the trial of any such case, that the accused was at the time of carrying any concealed weapon or weapons as aforesaid, a peace officer, or a traveller actually engaged in making a journey, or had a permit granted by the Police Commissioners of said City, as aforesaid, the accused shall be acquitted. Such persons, and no others, shall be deemed "travellers" within the meaning of this ordinance, as may be actually engaged in making a journey at the time.

Section 3. Section 39 of Ordinance No 19 of the Ordinances of said City, entitled "An Ordinance for the prevention of offences against the

peace, good order and health of the City of San Diego" approved August 23^d 1886, and all ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and one publication in the "San Diego Sun", the official newspaper of said City.

The Health & Morals Committee having approved the application of Frank Wilson for a retail liquor license the same was on motion granted.

Delegates Campbell, Pauly and Barker were each granted 30 days leave of absence.

Joint Resolution No. 615.

Whereas The inhabitants of the City of San Diego, California, have for many years past and now are using and consuming large quantities of water for which they have been and now are paying a consideration which in their opinion is in excess of the amount which should be paid therefor;

And Whereas The water rights under, and the water works through which said water has been and is now being so furnished is owned by a corporation separate and distinct from said City of San Diego;

And Whereas It is the wish of the said inhabitants of the said City of San Diego and of the Common Council of the said City, that the said City should acquire water rights and water works for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of the City with pure fresh water, and of obtaining pure fresh water for said City's own use;

And Whereas The Common Council of said City is desirous of receiving propositions to sell to the said City water rights or water works, or water rights and water works;

Now Therefore Be it Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows, to-wit:

That it be, and is hereby, declared and determined that it is

necessary that the City of San Diego should acquire its own water rights and water works, and to that end that public notice be given by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, ~~San Diego~~ County of San Diego, State of California, through the clerk of said Common Council, by publication for a period of ten days in the official newspaper of said City, that said Common Council will receive sealed propositions in writing up to the 2nd day of September, 1895, at the hour of eight o'clock P.M. thereof, to sell to the said City of San Diego, water rights or water works, or both water rights and water works, jointly; said propositions to be delivered to the clerk of the said City of San Diego, at his office in that building known as the 'City Hall,' situated on the S.W. corner of Third and I Streets in said City of San Diego; that said Common Council desires to receive propositions for the sale to said City of 1,000 miners inches, more or less, of pure fresh water, continuous and perpetual flow, to be delivered to the said City at an elevation of not less than 475 feet above sea level, at a point to be hereafter agreed upon, within the limits of said City, but propositions will be received for a less amount than 1,000 miners inches of water, but for an amount not less than 500 miners inches, said water to be so delivered as follows, to-wit: If said proposition shall be for 500 miners inches of water and no more, then the full amount shall be so delivered to said City within 18 months from the date of the contract hereafter to be made and entered into by and between the said City of San Diego and the maker of the proposition, that is accepted by the said City. But if said proposition shall for more than 500 miners inches of water, then 500 miners inches of water shall be so delivered within 18 months from the date of said contract, and an additional amount of 100 miners inches of water each year thereafter, until the full amount set forth in any proposition accepted by said City shall have been so delivered, or the full amount of water set forth in any proposition accepted by said City may be so delivered within 18 months from the date of the contract therefor, or sooner, at the option of the party submitting the proposition. That propositions may also be submitted at said time and place for the sale to the said City of any and all rights which any persons or company may have to take, appropriate, acquire, or receive water, whether such rights be in the nature of a right to take water from wells in any river or stream, or from the stream itself, or from a dam, reservoir, flume, ditch, conduit or pipe for conducting water, Provided, However, that a proposition containing a less amount than 500

inches of water will not be considered.

That propositions will also be received at the said time and place, to sell to said city water works for the purpose of distributing water to the said city and its inhabitants, which shall either be in accordance with the present system now in use by the San Diego Water Company, through which water is now being distributed to said city and the inhabitants thereof, or in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor as prepared by Edwin M. Capps and Thomas M. Shaw, Civil Engineers, and the supplementary specifications thereto attached, and on file in the office of the City Engineer of the city of San Diego, to which reference is hereby made for further particulars.

Any proposition to sell water works to said city may include any and all machinery of any and every kind, or pump or pumping plant, or any other means by which water may be pumped, elevated or forced into any reservoir or dam for storing water, or into any conduit, flume or pipe line for conducting water.

That if any proposition be made to sell to said city water rights and water works jointly, the said proposition may be to either sell and deliver said water to said city in the quantity and at the place above specified, and to sell a system for distributing water to said city and its inhabitants as above specified; or to sell any water rights to said city, the location of which is distant from said city, together with any reservoir or reservoirs, reservoir site or reservoir sites, dam or dams, dam site or dam sites, rights of way for any flume, ditch, ~~or~~ conduit, pipe or pipe line, or any ditch, conduit, pipe or pipe line, or any other means for conducting water from the source of said water rights to the said city, together with a system for distributing said water to said city and inhabitants thereof, as above specified.

That if said city shall accept any proposition which may be submitted pursuant to this resolution, and enter into a contract for the purchase of any water rights or water works, or both water rights and water works, that said contract shall be conditioned upon the city paying therefor in 5 per cent. 40 year bonds of said city, payable in gold coin of the United States, provided that two-thirds of the qualified electors of the said city of San Diego, shall determine by ballot that the said bonds shall be issued.

Be it Hereby Further Resolved, That the said city hereby reserved the privilege and right to insert any further or different terms in any contract to be hereinafter entered into with the maker of

any proposition which may be accepted by the city, such terms to be agreed upon by the maker of the said proposition and the said city.

That it is hereby distinctly understood That this resolution is merely for the purpose of opening negotiations with any person or company who may desire to submit any proposition to the Common Council of said city for the sale to said city of any water rights or water works, or both water rights and water works.

That propositions may be submitted at said time and place by any person or company for the sale to said city of water rights or water works, severally and separately, or for water rights and water works, jointly, whether hereinbefore adverted to or not, provided that no proposition to sell water to the said city will be considered for an amount less than 500 miners inches of water.

Any person or company submitting a proposition hereunder must file with such proposal a check certified by a responsible bank, payable to the order of the clerk of the city of San Diego, for an amount which shall be not less than Five Thousand (\$5000.), or a bond in said amount, and so payable, signed by the party making the proposal, and at least two sureties, who shall justify before an officer competent to administer an oath, in double the said amount, and over and above all statutory exemptions; such bond to be approved by the Common Council of the city of San Diego. An Ordinance imposing a ground rental of fifty cents per annum for each pole for the suspension of electric wires erected or used by Telegraph, Telephone, Electric Light, or Electric Railway Companies in the streets, alleys, or public places in the city of San Diego, California, and providing for the payment and collection thereof. Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the city of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. From and after the first day of October, 1895, every Telegraph, Telephone, Electric Light or Electric Railway Company doing business in the city of San Diego, California, shall pay to said city for the privilege of using the streets, alleys, and public places thereof, the sum of fifty cents per annum for each and every pole for the suspension of electric wires, erected or used by it, in the streets, alleys, or public places in said city.

Section 2. Every such Telegraph, Telephone, Electric Light, or Electric Railway Company shall deposit with the city Auditor of said city, on the first day of October of each year, beginning with October 1st, 1896, a verified statement showing the number of poles for the suspension of electric wires erected or used by it in the streets, alleys, or public places of said city, since the first day of October next prior thereto.

Section 3. The said Auditor shall copy and record said statement in a book kept by him for that purpose, and shall then file the same with the city clerk. It shall be the duty of the Auditor to ascertain the correctness of said statement, or if none be deposited with him, he shall ascertain the facts, required by Section 2 hereof, to be contained in such statement. If the statement be correct, the Auditor shall furnish a memorandum of its contents to the city Treasurer of said city. If such statement be incorrect, or if no statement shall be deposited with the Auditor as required by Section 2, then the Auditor shall furnish the said Treasurer with a memorandum showing

the number of poles, as ascertained by himself, required to be contained in the verified statement provided for in said Section 2. The Auditor shall keep a copy of said last mentioned memorandum on file in his office.

Section 4. If any Telegraph, Telephone, Electric Light, or Electric Railway Company shall fail to deposit the statement as required by Section 2 hereof, or shall report therein a less number of poles than is required by said Section 2, the Auditor shall set forth such facts in the said memorandum, and the Treasurer shall collect from any such company at the same time with the payment provided for in Section 1 hereof, the sum of 25 cents in addition to the fifty cents provided for in said Section 1, for each pole of such company failing to report, or if reporting, for each pole omitted from its statement.

Section 5. The payments provided for in Sections 1 and 4 hereof, shall be made to the City Treasurer of said City between the 20th and 30th day of October of each year, beginning with the month of October, 1896, and such payments when made, shall be by the said Treasurer placed in the Park Improvement Fund of said City. The Treasurer must give a receipt to the Company making any payments hereunder, specifying the amount paid, and the year and number of poles for which payments are made.

Section 6. In case default is made in any payment as provided for by this Ordinance, the City Treasurer shall at once notify the Common Council of that fact, and upon being requested so to do by the Common Council, the City Attorney shall immediately commence and conduct the necessary proceedings in the proper Court in behalf of the City for the collection of all amounts remaining unpaid.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and 2 publications in the San Diegoan-Sun, the official newspaper of said City.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Public Works of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to continue the present arrangement with William Jones, for the sailing of the garbage scow, temporarily, until January 1st, 1896, provided that said scow shall be taken out to sea and dumped, at least once every five days, and provided further that the garbage shall never be thrown overboard, inside the whistling buoy. In case said garbage is thrown overboard inside the said buoy, there shall be deducted from the payment next made to the parties sailing said scow, the sum of five dollars for each and every time such garbage is thrown overboard inside said whistling buoy.

Section 2. The said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and empowered to procure a canvas, and keep the said scow covered and closed with the same, excepting when the garbage is being dumped into it from wagons.

Section 3. No garbage shall be gathered between the hours of six o'clock A.M. and nine o'clock P.M. of any day, in that portion of said City having for its Northern boundary the north line of "A" Street, for its Eastern boundary the east line of Seventh Street, for its Southern boundary the Bay of San Diego, and for its Western boundary, the west line of Third Street.

Section 4. Every wagon used for gathering garbage shall be kept closely covered, while on any of the streets of said City, and shall be thoroughly washed out each time it is emptied into the scow, before being used again.

Section 5. All dead animals taken out in the scow, shall be opened before being thrown into the sea.

Section 6. Every person violating any provision of Section 3 or 4, of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding ten dollars.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect immediately after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance regulating the use of bicycles on the streets and sidewalks of the City, and repealing Ordinance No. 227, was read and on motion of Delegate Almsted referred to the Joint Street Committee.

Delegate Almsted moves that the Board do now adjourn for two weeks.

Delegate Hakes moves ~~as~~ an amendment that the Board adjourn for one week.

Gentlemen:-

I herewith return to your honorable body without my approval, Ordinance N^o _____ intitled "An Ordinance imposing a ground rental of fifty cents per annum for each pole for the suspension of electric wires erected or used by telegraph, telephone, electric light, or electric railway companies in the streets, alleys, or public places in the City of San Diego, California, and providing for the payment and collection thereof," for the following reasons:-

The said proposed ordinance will be a special and extra tax on the enterprise and

and public improvements made by private capital.

It also discriminates in omitting to tax railroad companies for each telegraph pole they may have in the City limits, which omission in said proposed Ordinance will work an exemption to the telegraph of the Santa Fe Railway Co. for over 20 miles in our City limits; also the Cuyamaca Railroad for three miles.

It will also discourage the building of a new competing telephone line, which is badly wanted and the building of which should be encouraged. As the community wants lower telephone rates, new telephone companies should be invited, instead of being welcomed by a special tax on their poles.

But by levying a special license tax on telephone companies, we will be keeping off new companies from coming to compete with the old and only company here. We want competition and to get it we should encourage new companies and not discourage them by a special license tax.

It will discourage such enterprising men as John D. Spreckles and associates, who built our beautiful electric street railway, from building any further extension of their extensive system should the City levy a special license tax on each pole they erect. I do not think it is time for City to levy a tax on enterprises which, though built by private capital, are welcomed by the public. What we want here are more of such enterprises. We want more railroads, telegraph, telephone and street railway lines. And I believe the people of this City are desirous of encouraging the building of such enterprises and their extension, rather than to levy an extra special tax on them.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to clean, dress or scale any fish upon any of the streets, sidewalks, or public grounds of said City.

Section 3. That none of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be so construed as to interfere with the use of any of the sidewalks of said City under the provisions of Ordinance No 126 of the Ordinances of said City, approved September 7th 1887.

Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person or persons so fined may be imprisoned at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

Sec. 5. This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval, and one publication in the San Diego Sun, the official newspaper of said City.

Because it is inconsistent, for in one sentence it says "that the garbage shall be taken out to sea and there dumped and never thrown over-board inside the whistling buoy", and then

in the next line it says that the garbage may be thrown over-board inside the whistling buoy by the garbage contractor paying a fine of \$5.00 for each time he throws it inside the whistling buoy, but as he is to empty the scow but six times in a month, hence, by said proposed Ordinance, he could dump inside the whistling buoy all the time by paying a total of \$30.00 in fines, and still receive a balance of \$195. in pay for doing work in a manner prohibited by the first sentence quoted. The garbage scow should never be allowed to dump inside the whistling buoy, under any circumstances, and the contractor should be compelled to dump during daylight, so that it can always be seen where the garbage scow is dumped, and should such rules for the protection of our harbor and ship channels be violated, then the contractor should forfeit his pay as a penalty therefor. The remainder of the provisions of said Ordinance are good, and a new Ordinance, embodying the above recommendations, I will be pleased to sign.

carrying of concealed weapons within the City of San Diego, California, and fixing a penalty for its violation," for the following reasons:

It attempts to take from the Mayor the power he has by law, to grant permits for carrying concealed weapons.

Its language is ambiguous, in that it says that permits may be granted by the Police Commissioners, which seemingly might permit each of the five Police Commissioners, to issue permits, no reference being made in said proposed Ordinance to the Board of Police Commissioners.

I cannot understand why any such ordinance should become a law whereby the power of the Mayor to issue such permits should be taken from him. To me it seems uncalled for, as during my two years of office, no one holding such a permit from me, has violated the honor and trust reposed in him by the issuance of such permit. Though the responsibility in the issuance of such permits is great, and calls for the greatest caution, care and judgment on my part, still, as it is a duty which befalls on me as Mayor, therefore, I am willing to perform it without throwing the responsibility on to others.

Ordinance No

An Ordinance regulating the use of Bicycles and Tricycles on the streets and sidewalks of the City of San Diego, and imposing a penalty for its violation and repealing Ordinance No 227 of the Ordinances of the said City, approved August 22nd, 1893.
Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a Bicycle or Tricycle after dark in any of the streets of the City of San Diego, without a lighted lantern attached to the front of such Bicycle or Tricycle, or carried by such rider.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a Bicycle or Tricycle on any of the public sidewalks of the City of San Diego.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than one dollar, nor more than ten dollars.

Section 4. Ordinance No 227 of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, entitled "An Ordinance regulating the use of Bicycles on the Streets of the City of San Diego, California, and imposing a penalty for its violation, approved August 22nd, 1893," is hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and 10 publications in the San Diego Union, the official newspaper of said City.

An Ordinance, authorizing the purchase of a Chemical Engine and Hose Wagon for use in the 8th Ward of the City, was read and adapted, by the following vote, to-wit:

Be it Ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of said City of San Diego, is hereby authorized and instructed to advertise for, and purchase, one Chemical Engine and hose wagon, combined, for the use of the Fire Department of said City, ~~to be located at the engine house in the Eighth Ward of said City~~ provided, that the same can be purchased at a price not exceeding twelve hundred and fifty dollars, (\$1250.00).

The Chemical tank or tank of such chemical engine and hose wagon, combined, shall have a capacity of not less than fifty (50) gallons in all; the wagon to be for one horse service and the bed of the wagon to have a capacity sufficient to carry not less than one thousand (1000) feet of hose.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the official newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diegoan-Sun.

An Ordinance establishing a City Paved, creating the office of Paved, Keeper was

read, and Delegate Jones moves to adapt said Ordinance. Delegate Warner moves to strike out the clause exempting teams and horses from the provisions of said Ordinance which motion was lost by the following vote, to-wit:

An ordinance establishing a City Pound in and for the City of San Diego, California, creating the office of Poundkeeper, fixing his fees, authorizing the appointment of deputies, and providing for the prevention of certain animals running at large within certain prescribed limits of said City of San Diego, and directing the police to take charge of horses and teams found not tied within certain limits of said city.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That there is hereby established a City Pound for impounding estrays, and the same shall be maintained in said city as a City Pound within the following described lands, viz: Beginning at the northwest corner of block number twenty-four, Bayview Homestead; thence running east three hundred feet; thence south three hundred feet; thence west three hundred feet; thence north three hundred feet to the place of beginning, being in the City Park of said city, and being the premises heretofore and now used by said city for a City Pound.

Sec. 2. That there is hereby created the office of Poundkeeper. Before entering upon the discharge of his duties the said Poundkeeper shall give good and sufficient bond in the sum

of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties and said Poundkeeper shall receive for his services such fees as are hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any horse, mule, donkey, burro, ox, bull, cow, hog, pig, sheep or goat to run at large within the following described limits of the City of San Diego, California, to-wit: All that portion of said city known as Pacific Beach; all that portion of said city known as Reed & Hubbell's addition; all that portion of said city known as Whitney's addition; all lands lying within the exterior boundaries of the city cemeteries, whether improved or unimproved; all that territory described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of pueblo lot 255, and running thence southeasterly to a point where the south line of pueblo lot 1192 intersects the northeast line of pueblo lot 255; thence east to the southeast corner of pueblo lot 1223; thence north to the northeast corner of pueblo lot 1223; thence west to the southwest corner of pueblo lot 1227; thence north to the northwest corner of pueblo lot 1227; thence east to the east line of the pueblo of San Diego; thence northwesterly following said east line of the pueblo of San Diego to a point where the north line of pueblo lot 1246 intersects the east line of the pueblo of San Diego; thence southwesterly following the south line of pueblo lots 1275, 1274, 1273, 1272, 1270, 1268, 1267, 1266, 1265, 1264, 1263 and 1262 to a point where the south line of said pueblo lot 1262 intersects the east line of pueblo lot 1259; thence southwesterly to a point where the projected south line of pueblo lot 1262 intersects the shore of the Pacific ocean; thence running southerly following the shore line of the said Pacific ocean to the entrance of False bay; thence following the shore of said False bay to the point of beginning; all that territory described as follows: Beginning at a point made by the intersection of the bay shore with Noel street; thence along said Noel street to California street; thence along said California street to Henry street; thence along Henry street continued in a straight line to the brow of the hill on the south side of Mission valley; thence eastward along the brow of the hill to Utah street extended northward; thence in a direct line southward along Utah street continued to the bay shore; thence northwesterly along the bay shore to the place of beginning, excepting that this ordinance shall not apply to horses and teams found within the territory bounded on the north by the north line of "D" street, on the east by the west line of Eighth street, on the south by the south line of "L" street, and on the west by the west line of Fourth street.

Sec. 4. That the police of said city shall and they are hereby required to look after and take charge of any and all horses or teams found running at large within the limits of the excepted territory described in section 3 of this ordinance, and turn the same over to the Poundkeeper if not claimed by the owner within two hours.

Sec. 5. That the Poundkeeper in and for the City of San Diego be and he is hereby authorized to appoint two deputy poundkeepers, subject to the approval of the Board of Delegates.

Sec. 6. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having the control of any of the above mentioned animals to graze or pasture the same, or cause the same to be grazed or pastured within the limits of said city hereinbefore described, unless such animals are securely fastened so that the same shall not run at large within the meaning of this ordinance, provided that no such animal shall be picketed or staked out in such a manner as to permit it to cross or trespass upon any traveled street or sidewalk within the limits of said city hereinbefore described.

Sec. 7. Whenever the Poundkeeper of the City of San Diego shall discover or be notified by any person, that any animal or animals above enumerated are grazing, pasturing or running at large, or picketed or staked out so as to permit it to cross or trespass upon any traveled street or sidewalk, in violation of this ordinance, it shall be his duty and he is hereby directed to immediately take them in charge and put them in the city pound, and within twenty-four hours thereafter have three notices posted in three conspicuous places and one published in the official paper of the city for ten days, describing such animals or animal so impounded giving the marks or brand or other distinguishing points with the date of the posting of such notices, and unless the owner or owners thereof come and claim said animals so impounded within ten days from and after the date of said notices, and prove the ownership of said property, and pay all lawful charges thereon as hereinafter provided, said poundkeeper is hereby authorized and it is made his duty to expose said animal or animals for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, and the proceeds of said sale, together with all fines, charges, fees and other expenses chargeable against said animal or animals, according to the schedule of charges hereinafter specified, shall be delivered to the Secretary of the Auditing Committee, together with a full description of the animal or animals sold as aforesaid, and the said Poundkeeper shall deliver to the purchaser of any animal or animals sold as aforesaid a bill of sale thereof, which shall vest the title of said property in the purchaser.

Sec. 8. The following charges and fines are hereby imposed for any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance: For any horse, mule, donkey, burro, ox, bull, cow, hog, pig, goat or sheep taken into custody by the Poundkeeper or any deputy of his, fifty cents; for driving any such animal to and placing the same in the pound, one dollar, and in addition the sum of fifty cents per day, not including the day in which such animal may be impounded, for keeping any such animal, and the further sum of one dollar for each animal that may be advertised, and 5 per cent commission on the amount of the sale, if any such animals are sold, all of which is hereby made a lawful charge against the owner or owners of any such animals impounded; and shall be a lien upon such animals for the payment thereof.

Sec. 9. All fees collected by the Poundkeeper under and in pursuance of the foregoing section, shall be retained by him, and shall constitute his full and only compensation for all services of every kind and description rendered by him as such Poundkeeper, his deputies and assistants, under this ordinance. It shall be the duty of such Poundkeeper to make a statement under oath to the Common Council of said city on the first day of every month, which statement shall be filed with the Clerk of said Common Council, and shall contain an itemized statement of the number and kind of animals taken into custody or impounded for the month next preceding the making of such statement, and shall also contain an itemized statement of the fees collected during such month, and from whom collected; the said city of San Diego shall be in no manner liable for any compensation to said poundkeeper, other than the fees herein provided.

Sec. 10. Should any amount remain in the custody of the city after deducting all expenses and charges herein provided for, the same shall be placed in the treasury of said city, to be paid to the owner or owners of said animals so sold on proper proof of ownership of said animals, but if not called for within one year from the date of sale by the owner of said animal or animals, the same shall be placed to the credit of the general fund of the city.

Sec. 11. That ordinance No. 216, approved June 29th, 1893, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 12. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and one publication in the San Diegan-Sun, the official newspaper of said city.

Upon motion of Delegate Currier, the Janitor was instructed to remove the lead covering from the stairway in the City Hall.

Upon motion of Delegate Dunbar, the Joint Street Committee was instructed to investigate the condition of the sidewalks on Sixth street, from "B" street to the water front.

Whereupon the Board adjourned until Monday, August 19th, 1895, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.

An Ordinance regulating the sale of Fish, Crabs, Lobsters, Shrimp, Clams, Meat or Game upon the Streets, Sidewalks or public grounds of the City of San Diego, California, and prohibiting the cleaning, dressing, scaling or washing of fish, Meat or game upon such Streets, Sidewalks or public places, and providing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or company, between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and five o'clock P. M. of any day, to expose for sale, offer for sale, or sell any fish, Crabs, lobsters, shrimp, clams, meat or game of any kind, on any of the streets, sidewalks, or public grounds in that portion of said City having for its northern boundary the north line of "B" Street; for its eastern boundary the east line of Seventh Street; for its southern boundary the south line of "D" Street; and for its western boundary the west line of Third Street; or on that portion of "D" Street of the sidewalks thereof, west of the west line of

Third Street.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or company to clean, dress, scale or wash any fish, meat or game of any kind upon any of the streets, sidewalks or public grounds of said City.

Section 2. That none of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be so construed as to interfere with the use of any of the sidewalks of said City under the provisions of Ordinance No 126 of the Ordinances of said City, approved September 7th 1887.



Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person or persons so fined, may be imprisoned at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and one publication in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit: The San Diego Sun.







Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, that the public interest and convenience require that the street work herein described be done, and therefore the said Common Council hereby orders the following street work to be done, according to the specifications herein mentioned, and under the direction and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets of said City, to-wit:

That "H" Street in said City, from the east line of Fifth Street to the east line of Sixteenth Street, including all intersections of streets between said points, (excepting such portion of said street and intersections as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, and also excepting such portion of said street and intersections between said points, as is occupied by a wooden bridge, and also excepting such portions of said street and intersections as are covered with bituminous rock cross-walks, and also excepting that portion of said H Street and intersections between said points already guttered with granite blocks laid to the official grade of said street and accepted) be paved from curb line to curb line, with bituminous rock pavement, two inches thick laid on the natural earth, in accordance with specifications therefor as contained in Section 6 of Special Specification No 5 of Article 1 of Ordinance No 276 of the Ordinances of said City, approved August 15th 1893, as amended by Ordinance No 279, approved December 27th 1894.

And also that that portion of said H street from the east line of Twelfth street to the west line of Sixteenth street, including all intersections of streets between said points, (excepting such portions of said street and intersections as are already curbed with concrete or natural stone, and also excepting such portion of said street and intersections between said points as is occupied by a wooden bridge) be curbed with concrete in accordance with specifications therefor as contained in General Specification No 7, of Ordinance No 226 of the Ordinances of said City, approved August 15th 1893.

The City Engineer of said City having estimated that the total cost of said improvement will be greater than one dollar per front foot along each line of said portion of said street so proposed to be improved as aforesaid, including the cost of intersection work assessable upon said frontage, it is hereby determined and declared, in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved February 27th 1893, that serial bonds shall be issued to represent the expense of said proposed improvement. Said bonds shall be serial extending for a period of ten years from their date, and shall be issued in the manner and form provided by said Act, approved February 27th 1893; an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by coupons on the 1st day of January of each year after their date, until the whole is paid, and said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum on all sums unpaid, until the whole of said principal and interest are paid. Said interest shall be payable semi-annually on the 2nd days of January and July, respectively, of each and every year.

The San Diego Sun, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City, is hereby designated as the newspaper in which this resolution ordering work, and the notice of said work inviting sealed proposals for doing the same, shall be published in the manner and form, and by the persons required by law.

The City Clerk of this City is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five days, on or near the chamber door of said Common Council, a notice with specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work, and said Clerk is also hereby directed to publish for two days, in the manner and form required by law, in the said newspaper designated for that purpose as aforesaid, a notice of said work inviting sealed proposals for doing the same, and referring to the specifications posted or on file. Said notices posted and published, shall describe said bonds and shall specify the rate of interest which they shall bear, in the manner required by law in such cases, and shall require that all proposals or bids offered shall be accompanied by a check payable to the order of the Mayor of said City certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall not be less than ten per cent. of the aggregate of the proposals, or by a bond for the said amount, and so payable, signed by the bidder and by two sureties who shall justify before any officer competent to administer an oath in double the said amount and over and above all statutory exemptions. Spears, Foreman of the printers and publishers of The San Diego-Sun, a newspaper published daily (except Sundays) at the City of San Diego, California, showing: That the "Resolution of Intention to grade Eleventh Street from the north line of "N" Street to the South line of the City Park," as adopted by the Board of Delegates of the City of San Diego, California, May 22^d 1895, and by the Board of Aldermen of said

City, May 22^d 1895, was published in said newspaper for the period of three days, to-wit: upon the 23^d, 24th and 25th days of May, 1895. Also.

The Affidavit of Geo. D. Resolution Ordering the Work of grading Eleventh Street, from the north line of "N" Street to the south line of the City Park.

Resolved by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, that the public interest and convenience require that the street work herein described be done, and therefore the said Common Council hereby orders the following street work to be done, to-wit:

That that portion of Eleventh Street in said City, from the north line of "N" Street to the south line of the City Park, including the sidewalks thereof and all intersections of streets between said points, (excepting such portions of said street and intersections as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person, corporation or company having railroad tracks thereon, and also excepting such portions of said street and intersections as have heretofore been graded) be graded to the official grade.

Such grading shall be done in accordance with specifications therefor as contained in Ordinance N^o 53 of the Ordinances of said City, approved December 24th 1889.

The San Diegoan-Sun, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City, is hereby designated as the newspaper in which this resolution ordering work, and the notice of said work inviting sealed proposals for doing the same, shall be published, in the

manner and form, and by the persons required by law.

The Clerk of this City is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five days on or near the Chamber door of said Common Council, a notice with specifications inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work; and said Clerk is hereby directed to publish for two days in the manner and form required by law, a notice of said work inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing the same, and referring to the specifications posted or on file, in the said newspaper designated for that purpose, as aforesaid.

Said notice shall require that all proposals or bids offered shall be accompanied by a check payable to the order of the Mayor of this City, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall ~~be~~ not ^{be} less than ten per cent. of the aggregate of the proposals, or by a bond for the said amount so payable, signed by the bidder and by two sureties who shall justify before any officer competent to administer an oath in double the said amount, over and above all statutory exemptions.

Said Ordinance, as adapted, is as follows, to-wit:

Ordinance No. 325.

An ordinance establishing a City Pound in and for the City of San Diego, California, creating the office of Poundkeeper, fixing his fees, authorizing the appointment of deputies, and providing for the prevention of certain animals running at large within certain prescribed limits of said City of San Diego, and directing the police to take charge of horses and teams found not tied within certain limits of said city.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That there is hereby established a City Pound for impounding strays, and the same shall be maintained in said city as a City Pound, within the following described lands, viz: Beginning at the northwest corner of block number twenty-four, Bayview Homestead; thence running east three hundred feet; thence south three hundred feet, thence west three hundred feet; thence north three hundred feet to the place of beginning, being in the City Park of said city, and being the premises heretofore and now used by said city for a City Pound.

Sec. 2. That there is hereby created the office of Poundkeeper. Before entering upon the discharge of his duties the said Poundkeeper shall give good and sufficient bond in the sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties and said Poundkeeper shall receive for his services such fees as are hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any horse, mule, donkey, burro, ox, bull, cow, hog, pig, sheep or goat to run at large within the following described limits of the City of San Diego, California, to-wit: All that portion of said city known as Pacific Beach; all that portion of said city known as Reed & Hubbell's addition; all that portion of said city known as Whitney's addition; all lands lying within the exterior boundaries of the city cemeteries, whether improved or unimproved; all that territory described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of pueblo lot 255, and running thence southeasterly to a point where the south line of pueblo lot 1182 intersects the northeast line of pueblo lot 255; thence east to the southeast corner of pueblo lot 1192; thence north to the northeast corner of pueblo lot 1223; thence west to the southwest corner of pueblo lot 1227; thence north to the northwest corner of pueblo lot 1227; thence east to the east line of the pueblo of San Diego; thence northwesterly following said east line of the pueblo of San Diego to a point where the north line of pueblo lot 1246 intersects the east line of the pueblo of San Diego; thence southwesterly following the south line of pueblo lots 1275, 1274, 1273, 1272, 1270, 1268, 1267, 1266, 1265, 1264, 1263 and 1262 to a point where the south line of said pueblo lot 1262 intersects the east line of pueblo

lot 1259; thence southwesterly to a point where the projected south line of pueblo lot 1262 intersects the shore of the Pacific ocean; thence running southerly following the shore line of the said Pacific ocean to the entrance of False Bay; thence following the shore of said False Bay to the point of beginning; all that territory described as follows: Beginning at a point made by the intersection of the bay shore with Noel street; thence along said Noel street to California street; thence along said California street to Henry street; thence along Henry street continued in a straight line to the brow of the hill on the south side of Mission valley; thence eastward along the brow of the hill to Utah street extended northward; thence in a direct line southward along Utah street continued to the bay shore; thence northwesterly along the bay shore to the place of beginning, excepting that this ordinance shall not apply to horses and teams found within the territory bounded on the north by the north line of "C" street, on the east by the west line of Eighth street, on the south by the south line of "L" street, and on the west by the west line of Fourth street.

Sec. 4. That the police of said city shall and they are hereby required to look after and take charge of any and all horses or teams found running at large within the limits of the excepted territory described in section 3 of this ordinance, and turn the same over to the Poundkeeper if not claimed by the owner within two hours.

Sec. 5. That the Poundkeeper in and for the City of San Diego be and he is hereby authorized to appoint two deputy poundkeepers, subject to the approval of the Board of Delegates.

Sec. 6. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having the control of any of the above mentioned animals to graze or pasture the same, or cause the same to be grazed or pastured within the limits of said city hereinbefore described, unless such animals are securely fastened so that the same shall not run at large within the meaning of this ordinance, provided that no such animal shall be picketed or staked out in such a manner as to permit it to cross or trespass upon any traveled street or sidewalk within the limits of said city hereinbefore described.

Sec. 7. Whenever the Poundkeeper of the City of San Diego shall discover or be notified by any person, that any animal or animals above enumerated are grazing, pasturing or running at large, or picketed or staked out so as to permit it to cross or trespass upon any traveled street or sidewalk, in violation of this ordinance, it shall be his duty and he is hereby directed to immediately take them in charge and put them in the city pound, and within twenty-four hours thereafter have three notices posted in three conspicuous places and one published in the official paper of the city for ten days, describing such animals or animal so impounded giving the marks or brand or other distinguishing points with the date of the posting of such notices, and unless the owner or owners thereof come and claim said animals so impounded within ten days from and after the date of said notices, and prove the ownership of said property, and pay all lawful charges thereon as hereinafter provided, said poundkeeper is hereby authorized and it is made his duty to expose said animal or animals for sale at public auction to the

highest bidder for cash, and the proceeds of said sale, together with all fines, charges, fees and other expenses chargeable against said animal or animals, according to the schedule of charges hereinafter specified, shall be delivered to the Secretary of the Auditing Committee, together with a full description of the animal or animals sold as aforesaid, and the said Poundkeeper shall deliver to the purchaser of any animal or animals sold as aforesaid a bill of sale thereof, which shall vest the title of said property in the purchaser.

Sec. 8. The following charges and fines are hereby imposed for any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance: For any horse, mule, donkey, burro, ox, bull, cow, hog, pig, goat or sheep taken into custody by the Poundkeeper or any deputy of his, fifty cents; for driving any such animal to and placing the same in the pound, one dollar, and in addition the sum of fifty cents per day, not including the day in which such animal may be impounded, for keeping any such animal, and the further sum of one dollar for each animal that may be advertised, and 5 per cent commission on the amount of the sale, if any such animals are sold, all of which is hereby made a lawful charge against the owner or owners of any such animals impounded, and shall be a lien upon such animals for the payment thereof.

Sec. 9. All fees collected by the Poundkeeper under and in pursuance of the foregoing section, shall be retained by him, and shall constitute his full and only compensation for all services of every kind and description rendered by him as such Poundkeeper, his deputies and assistants, under this ordinance. It shall be the duty of such Poundkeeper to make a statement under oath to the Common Council of said city on the first day of every month, which statement shall be filed with the Clerk of said Common Council, and shall contain an itemized statement of the number and kind of animals taken into custody or impounded for the month next preceding the making of such statement, and shall also contain an itemized statement of the fees collected during such month, and from whom collected; the said city of San Diego shall be in no manner liable for any compensation to said poundkeeper, other than the fees herein provided.

Sec. 10. Should any amount remain in the custody of the city after deducting all expenses and charges herein provided for, the same shall be placed in the treasury of said city, to be paid to the owner or owners of said animals so sold on proper proof of ownership of said animals, but if not called for within one year from the date of sale by the owner of said animal or animals, the same shall be placed to the credit of the general fund of the city.

Sec. 11. That ordinance No. 216, approved June 29th, 1893, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 12. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and one publication in the San Diego Sun, the official newspaper of said city.

An Ordinance regulating the Draining of water from the roofs of Buildings upon the sidewalks was read and adopted by the following vote, to-wit:

Ordinance N^o 329.

An Ordinance in regard to the draining of water from the roofs of Buildings upon sidewalks, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner or agent of any building or buildings abutting immediately upon any of the sidewalks in said City, to permit the water drained from the roof or roofs of any such building or buildings, to be discharged upon the surface of any such sidewalk; and every such owner or agent of any such building or buildings, shall cause all such water drained from the roof or roofs of any such building or buildings to be carried by a drain under the surface of such sidewalk to the street gutter.

Section 2. Any sidewalk or portion of a sidewalk which may be dug up or removed in order to put in any drain provided for in Section 1 hereof, shall be replaced and such sidewalk repaired by the party putting in any such drain, or causing the same to be done; and the repairing of any such sidewalk shall be done to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets of said City.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding thirty dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then such person may be imprisoned in the City prison of said City, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of said fine remaining unpaid.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit: The San Diego-Sun.

An Ordinance regulating the sailing of the Garbage Scow and the gathering of Garbage was read and adopted, by the following vote to-wit:

Said Ordinance, as adopted, is as follows, to-wit:-

Ordinance No 328.

An Ordinance to regulate the sailing of the Garbage Scow and the gathering and disposal of the Garbage of the City of San Diego, California, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Public Works of said City, is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to continue the present arrangement with William Jones for the sailing of the garbage scow temporarily, until January 1st, 1896, Provided, that such scow shall be taken out to sea and there dumped at least once every five days; And Provided, further, that the garbage shall never be thrown overboard inside the whistling buoy. In case such garbage is thrown overboard inside said buoy, there shall be deducted from the payment next made, to the parties entitled thereto, for the sailing of said scow, the sum of forty dollars for each and every time such garbage is thrown overboard inside said whistling buoy.

Section 2. The said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed, to procure a canvas for the use of the party or parties in charge of such garbage scow, and the said scow shall be kept covered and closed with such canvas, excepting when the garbage is being dumped

into it from wagons.

Section 3. No person shall take out or dump, or cause to be taken out or dumped, the garbage scow used for conveying the garbage of this City, out to sea during the period of any day between sunset and sunrise.

Section 4. No person or company shall gather any garbage between the hours of 6 o'clock A. M. and 9 o'clock P. M. of any day, in that portion of said City having for its northern boundary the north line of A Street, for its eastern boundary the east line of Eleventh Street, for its southern boundary the Bay of San Diego, and for its western boundary the west line of Third Street.

Section 5. Every person or company gathering garbage shall keep the wagon used for that purpose closely covered while on any of the streets of said City, and shall thoroughly wash out the inside of the bed of such wagon immediately after the garbage is unloaded from the same into the scow, and before such wagon is brought from the place where unloaded. Section 6. All dead animals taken up in the scow shall be opened before being thrown into the sea.

Section 7. Every person violating any of the provisions of Sections 2, 3 or 4 of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding \$30.00, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fine may be imprisoned at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine remaining unpaid.

Section 8. This Ordinance be in force and take effect from and after its passage, and approval, and one publication in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit: The San Diegoan-Sun.

At this time a Message from the Mayor was received and read, appointing N. E. Hadley, as a member of the Board of Public Commissioners vice O. D. Wright, term expired, upon motion action upon said appointment was laid over until the next meeting of the Board.

An ordinance declaring the grade of Ash street in the City of San Diego, California, to be changed, from the east line of Seventh street to the west line of Eighth street and establishing the grade of the same.

The Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, having on the 23rd day of July, 1896, duly passed a resolution of intention to change and establish the grade of Ash street between the east line of Seventh street and the west line of Eighth street, and describing and establishing the district to be benefited by such change of grade, and to be assessed for the cost of the same; and the Superintendent of Streets having caused notices of the passage of said resolution of intention to be conspicuously posted within said district in the manner and form required by law, and no objection to said proposed change or changes or modifications of grade having been filed with the Clerk of said Common Council, and the petition of the owners of a majority of the property affected by said proposed change of grade having been duly filed with the Clerk and presented to this Common Council, therefore

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows.

The grade of Ash street in said city, from the east line of Seventh street to the west line of Eighth street, is declared to be and the same hereby is changed and established in conformity with said resolution of intention, as follows:

Section 1. At the northeast corner of said Ash and Seventh streets, the grade shall be 135 feet; at the southeast corner of said Ash and Seventh streets the grade shall be 132.00 feet; at a point on the south line of Ash street, 70 feet due east from the northeast corner of Ash and Seventh streets, 138.00 feet; at a point on the south line of Ash street, 45 feet due east from the last-named point, 138.40 feet; at a point on the north line of Ash street, 70 feet due east from the northeast corner of Ash and Seventh streets, 140.00 feet; at a point on the north line of Ash street, 45 feet due east from the last-named point, 140.00 feet; at the southwest corner of Ash and Eighth streets, 132.50 feet; at the northwest corner of Ash and Eighth streets, 133.00 feet.

And the grade of said Ash street between the points fixed by this ordinance shall be of uniform ascent and descent, as shown by the grade map made by the City Engineer and on file in his office.

The center of said street shall have an average elevation of the opposite curb grades.

The numbers used above, where their meaning is not shown to be otherwise by their immediate context, mean the number of feet which the points designated in the proposed new grade, shall be above the city datum line of levels, as fixed by ordinance No. 8 of the ordinances of said city, entitled "An ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by ordinance," approved June 30th, 1886.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval and one publication in the city official newspaper of said city, to-wit: The San Diego Sun.

Section 1. The grade of Front street from the north line of Redwood street to the north line of Thorn street is hereby established as follows:

The elevation of the points herein named above the datum line of levels fixed by Ordinance No. 3 of the ordinances of said city approved June 30th, 1886, shall be fixed as follows:

At the northwest corner of Front and Redwood streets 229.50 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof 231.50 feet.

At the southwest corner of Front and Spruce streets, 231.50 feet; at the northwest corner thereof 232.00 feet; at the southeast corner thereof 233.50 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof 234.00 feet.

At the southwest corner of Front and Thorn streets, 235.00 feet; at the northwest corner thereof 235.00 feet; at the southeast corner thereof 236.00 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof 237.00 feet.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to wear or carry concealed upon or about his person, in this City, any pistol, slung shot, brass or iron knuckles, sand club, dirk knife, bowie knife or other dangerous or deadly weapon. The Police Commissioners of this City may grant a written permission for a period of not exceeding six months, to any peaceable person whose profession or occupation may require him to be out at late hours of the night, to carry concealed deadly weapons upon his person, for his own protection.

Section 2. Every person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding two hundred dollars, and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person so fined may be imprisoned in the City prison of the City of San Diego, at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine imposed; Provided, however, if it shall be proved from the testimony on the trial of any such case, that the accused was at the time of carrying any concealed weapon or weapons as aforesaid, a peace officer, or a traveller actually engaged in making a journey, or had a permit granted by the Police Commissioners of said City, as aforesaid, the accused shall be acquitted. Such persons, and no others, shall be deemed "travellers" within the meaning of this Ordinance, as may be actually engaged in making a journey at the time.

Section 3. Section 39, of Ordinance N^o 19 of the Ordinances of said City, entitled "An Ordinance for the prevention of offences against the peace, good order and health of the City of San Diego, approved August 23^d, 1886, and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, in conflict with this Ordinance, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Whereas it appears from said communication and from the records and files in the office of the Clerk of the Common Council of said City that said 725 feet of six inch sewer pipe, 60 feet of 6" x 4" Y₂ and 2 man holes and 1 flush tank has already been laid and constructed in said Second Street.

To the Honorable Board of Delegates of the City of San Diego.
Gentlemen:-

I herewith respectfully return
without my approval thereof, proposed Ordinance
No. —, entitled "An Ordinance regulating the sale of
fish, crabs, lobsters, shrimps, clams, meat or game upon
the streets, sidewalks or public grounds of the City of
San Diego, California, and prohibiting the cleaning,
dressing, scaling or washing of fish, meat or game
upon such streets, sidewalks or public places, and
providing a penalty for its violation," for the
following reasons:

The said proposed Ordinance as now before
is arbitrary, unjust, and legislates against a class
of business run by poor men struggling for an
existence in an honorable way. To say that certain
classes of business are prohibited to be carried on
in the streets of San Diego, no matter how cleanly

may be conducted, would work a great hardship on some poor men who are supporting large families by such business, and at the same time accommodating the public to a little extent, to say the least. I respectfully suggest that your honorable body amend the said proposed Ordinance so as to regulate the manner of selling fish and game the street, by requiring the consent of the property owner and tenant of the abutting property, to be secured by the party desiring so to sell fish or game, before he can do so, and without such consent he should be prohibited, and requiring the fish wagons or carts to be so constructed as to not be a public nuisance, by requiring them to be covered with netting or otherwise made fly proof and with tightly covered refuse receptacles, and which carts or wagons must be approved as satisfactory by the City Health Officer. Such an amended Ordinance I will be pleased to sign.

Whereas the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, by Ordinance N^o 92, approved June 23rd, 1887, and Ordinance N^o 337, approved May 2^d, 1888, and Ordinance N^o 34, approved October 5th, 1889, and Ordinance N^o 55, approved December 24th, 1889, and Ordinance N^o 95, approved September 27, 1890, has granted to the Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company, David D. Dare, and the San Diego Cable Railway Company, certain franchises for the purpose of constructing, laying down, and maintaining a cable railway in certain streets of said City, and along and upon Fifth Street from the north line of K Street to the center of C Street, and along and upon C Street from the center of Fifth Street to the center of Fourth Street, and along and upon Fourth Street to University Avenue, and along and upon University Avenue to the Park Boulevard in University Heights, thence along said Park Boulevard and Carolina Street to the north line of Adams Avenue in University Heights, being the streets along which the road and

tracks of the San Diego Cable Railway Company are now laid; and by said ordinances required that the cars upon said cable railway be propelled by wire ropes running under the surface of the street and moved by stationary steam engines. And

Whereas, the said George B. Kurper purchased at Commissioners sale, on the 6th day of February, 1895, and is now the owner of, the said Cable Railway and franchises granted to it and said David D. Dake, and the said Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company as aforesaid: And

Whereas, the said George B. Kurper desires to change the motive power of said Cable Railway and propel cars thereon by electricity.

Therefore,

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. The said George B. Kurper and his assigns are hereby authorized and permitted to propel street cars upon said railway by electricity conducted, carried or transmitted by wires or conductors over or under ground, and may use the tunnel of said railroad for the purpose of operating with an underground system for conveying the electric current, should it be found desirable to adopt such system.

Section 2. That the provisions of Ordinance No 174 of the Ordinances of said City, approved August 3^d 1892, shall control the manner of the erection of wires for conveying the electric current, except that where the track is laid on one side of the center of the street, poles with brackets may be used, set on one side of the street only.

Section 3. The said George B. Kurper and his assigns, are also authorized and permitted to lengthen any or all of the turnouts of said line, should it be found desirable to do so for the better operation of the line.

Section 4. That the work of changing the motive power of said railway from cable to

electricity, shall commence within thirty days, and be completed and in operation within six months after the decision of the case now pending in the Supreme Court of this State, relative to the ownership of the Pavilion Grounds in University Heights at the northern terminus of said railway.

Section 5. That none of the provisions of said Ordinances Nos 34, 55, 92, 95 and 337, shall be affected by this Ordinance, except so far as the same are modified by the terms hereof.

Section 6. That the Common Council reserves the right to repeal, amend or modify this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval, and one publication in the City Official Newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diegoan Sun.

Section 3. That none of the provisions of this ordinance shall be so construed as to interfere with the use of any of the sidewalks of said City under the provisions of Ordinance No 126 of the Ordinances of said City, approved September 7th 1887.

Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00 and in case the fine imposed be not paid, then the person or persons so fined may be imprisoned at the rate of one day for every Two Dollars of the fine imposed.

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and one publication in the City Official Newspaper of said City, to wit: The San Diegoan Sun



An Ordinance imposing a Ground Rental of fifty cents per annum for each pole for the suspension of electric wires erected or used by any person, corporation, or company in the streets, alleys, or public places in the City of San Diego California, and providing for the payment and collection thereof.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. From and after the first day of January, 1896, every person, corporation, or company doing business in the City of San Diego, California, shall pay to said City for the privilege of using the streets, alleys, and public places thereof, the sum of fifty cents per annum for each and every pole for the suspension of electric wires, erected or used by any such person, corporation or company, in the streets, alleys or public places in said City.

Section 2. Every such person, Corporation, or company shall deposit with the City Auditor of said City, on the first day of January of each year, beginning with January 1st 1897, a verified statement showing the number of poles for the suspension of electric wires erected or used by such person, Corporation, or company in the streets, alleys, or public places of said City.

since the first day of January next prior thereto.

Section 3. The said Auditor shall copy and record said statement in a book kept by him for that purpose, and shall then file the same with the City Clerk. It shall be the duty of the Auditor to ascertain the correctness of said statement, or if none be deposited with him, he shall ascertain the facts, required by Section 2 hereof, to be contained in such statement. If the statement be correct, the Auditor shall furnish a memorandum of its contents to the City Treasurer of said City. If such statement be incorrect, or if no statement shall be deposited with the Auditor as required by said Section 2, then the Auditor shall furnish the said treasurer with a memorandum, showing the number of poles, as ascertained by himself, required to be contained in the verified statement provided for in said Section 2. The Auditor shall keep a copy of said last mentioned memorandum on file in his office.

Section 4. If any person, corporation, or company shall fail to deposit the statement as required by Section 2 hereof or shall report therein a less number of poles than is required by said Section 2, the Auditor shall set forth such facts in the said memorandum, and the Treasurer shall collect from such person, corporation, or company at the same time with the payment provided for in Section 1 hereof, the sum of 25 cents in addition to the fifty cents provided for in said Section 1, for each pole of such person, corporation, or company failing to report, or if reporting, for each pole omitted from its statement.

Section 5. The payments provided for in Sections 1 and 4 hereof, shall be made to the City Treasurer of said City between the 20th and 30th day of January of each year, beginning with the month of January, 1897, and such payments when made, shall be by the said Treasurer placed in the Park Improvement Fund of said City. The Treasurer must give a receipt to the person, corporation, or company making any payments hereunder, specifying the amount paid, and the year and number of poles for which payments are made.

Sec 6. In case default is made in any payment as provided for by this Ordinance, the City Treasurer shall at once notify the Common Council of that fact, and upon being requested so to do by the Common Council, the City Attorney shall immediately commence and conduct the necessary proceedings in the proper court in behalf of the City for the collection

of all amounts remaining unpaid.

Section 7 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and 2 publications in the San Diego Sun, the Official newspaper of said City.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1 That the City Treasurer of said City of

San Diego be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to sell at public auction, to the highest bidder for cash, all that certain real property heretofore sold and struck off to the City of San Diego as the purchaser at the delinquent tax sale held in said City in the year 1894 for the delinquent City taxes thereon for the fiscal year 1893, which has not been redeemed, and which has been or may hereafter be conveyed to said City by deeds executed under and by virtue of the provisions of Joint Resolution No. 663, passed and adopted by the Common Council of said City on the 8th day of October, 1895.

Section 2. That any and all sales made hereunder shall be subject to the lien of the City for the taxes for each year subsequent to the fiscal year 1893.

Section 3. The report of the Joint Water Committee as recommended by the Joint Committee of the whole was read and adopted as follows, to wit:

San Diego Cal. Oct 11 1895

To the Honorable the Common Council of the City of San Diego

Gentlemen, Your Joint Water Committee to whom was referred the bids of the Southern California Mountain Water

Company and the San Diego Flume and Water Companies, beg leave to report as follows:

We have thoroughly sifted all the propositions, and find any one of them suitable to the requirements of or obtainable by the City, and therefore recommend that all be rejected. We are now endeavoring to arrive at a satisfactory solution by means of negotiations and counter propositions, but nothing tangible has yet been reached, and no report can be made on these that would be of value. In the meantime we recommend the adoption of the accompanying joint resolution offering \$500,000 in City bonds for the present distributing system.

To make plain our reasons for recommending this offer it is necessary to refer to a few matters arising since the Committee has had under consideration the bids of the San Diego Water Company and San Diego Flume Company.

The proposition of the Southern California Mountain Water Company was held in abeyance, pending the report of the engineer on the estimated cost of the system under the proposition, and the propositions of the Flume and Water Companies were immediately taken up. The committee met with a request for delay, on the ground that the purchase of the Pine Valley system by the Flume Company was so recent, that the officers of the latter company had had no time to make a survey of the proposed conduit from Pine Valley to connect with the flume. Ten days' time was asked for, but the committee granted two weeks, and the company took three weeks.

At the end of that time, the committee met to receive the additional information expected from the officers of the Flume Company. We were met with a request for still further delay, for the purpose of allowing the Flume Company to place a pump at the Pine Valley damsite to handle the water while excavating for bed rock. Ten days' time was again asked for, and your committee granted two weeks, wishing to give the Flume Company every opportunity to make good its proposition.

Your committee met again on the evening of Oct. 9 to hear the result of the excavations at Pine Valley. At that time a modified proposition was handed in, offering to sell to the City the Pine Valley reservoir and water rights with a 60 foot masonry storage dam, conduit from Pine Valley to the Flume line at Chocolate Creek and the City

distributing system for \$1,175,000 and \$15,000. annual rental delivered at Meter House - \$5000 annual rental for water delivered north of river.

Your committee recommends that this proposition be also rejected, for the following reasons: Under the offer the city would receive less than 200 inches of water perpetual flow, not counting loss by evaporation or otherwise; there is admitted to be threatened litigation regarding the water rights, with the prospect that the system would be delayed for at least a year; we have reason to believe that the company has no right of way between Pine Valley and Chocolate Creek. In brief, the proposition contemplates a system so entirely inadequate and unsatisfactory that we cannot believe that the Flume company expected that it would receive serious consideration.

For the purpose of saving time during these delays, your committee on Oct 4th adopted the following resolution:

"Resolved That this committee agrees to recommend to the Council the purchase of the plant of the San Diego Water Company for the sum of \$500,000. in 5 per cent forty-year bonds at par.

Be it further resolved, that this committee make this offer to the San Diego Water Company, and that the said company be requested to give notice of the acceptance or rejection of the offer by Wednesday Oct. 9, 1895, at which time this committee will meet."

In pursuance of that resolution, this committee made such an offer to John D. Hooks as President of the San Diego Water Company, and a copy of the resolution was incorporated in the letter to him, for the express purpose of indicating that the committee intended to submit the matter to the Council.

At the meeting of the committee Oct 9, John D. Hooks handed his reply to the clerk, and of the Water Company through its president was found to be an evasion of a direct reply, on the ground that the committee was not authorized to make such an offer.

Your Committee recommends that the San Diego Water Company be given another opportunity to reply to a proposition from the City to purchase the distributing system. We recommend that the accompanying joint resolution be adopted, and that no proposition other than that contained in the resolution be made to or accepted from the San Diego Flume Company or the San Diego Water Company, as any delay will tend to delay the settlement of the water question.

The supplemental report of the Joint Water Committee as recommended by the Joint Committee of the whole was read and adopted and is as follows to wit:

Supplemental report 10/12/95

To the Common Council of the City of San Diego

Your Joint Water Committee respectfully submits the following Supplement report:

Your Committee, after finding that the procurement of ¹⁰⁰⁰ inches of water and a distributing system under the joint proposition of the San Diego Water Company and the San Diego Flume Company, would cost more in City bonds than the City could legally issue, the sum being over \$2,000,000.00 made up as follows:

Cost of property to be conveyed \$1,175,000.00

Cost of increase of dam to the 1000 inch contour line \$250,000

Cost of Flume to carry the water from Chocolate ^{brook} to the City \$400,000

Cost of necessary improvements to distributing system \$200,000.00

called the representative of the Southern California Mountain Water Company before it, and made said Company the proposition contained in the following resolution, to wit:

Be it Resolved that the following proposition be made to the Southern California Mountain Water Company, and if accepted by said Water Company that this Committee recommend the adoption of the same to the Common Council of this City.

The proposition is, that the said Southern California Mountain Water Company convey to the City its upper Otay Reservoir and dam with capacity of 1000 inches of water and filled with water, together with the conduit from the said upper Otay Reservoir and dam, to the City, of 1000 inches capacity, and water rights to the first 1000 inches of water from Cottonwood Creek, and the right to flowage in said conduit from said Cottonwood Creek to said upper Otay Reservoir; and in consideration of the

conveyance of the above described property, to said City, that the said City will pay and deliver to said Water Company One million seventy five thousand Dollars of five per cent 40 year City Bonds or the proceeds thereof, and if said City does not purchase from the San Diego Water Company its distributing system and water works plant complete within the city for Five hundred thousand Dollars, then the said Southern California Mountain Water Company to construct a distributing system of cast iron pipe of double the capacity of the San Diego Water Company's distributing system including having the pipe line to Pacific Beach go via the highlands north of the San Diego River, and including reservoirs in said city, to be constructed by said Southern California Mountain Water Company, 50 per cent larger than the present reservoirs in said City, to be located at such points in said City as the said City may direct; and in consideration of the construction of such distributing system and reservoirs, and conveying the same to the City the said City will pay and deliver to said Southern California Mountain Water Company, the sum of \$500,000 in 5% 40 year City bonds; \$425,000.00 of which bonds shall be delivered at the time the said distributing system is turned over to the City, and \$75,000 of such bonds to be delivered whenever the assessed valuation of the City will allow the voting of said additional \$75,000 of bonds, over and above the present assessed valuation.

The said City to have the right to call for additional water at any time or times at such a price as may be fixed by arbitrators, which arbitrators shall be selected, one by the City and one by said Water Company, and the two thus selected to select a third.

The said Southern California Mountain Water Company accepted the proposition, made in said resolution, as shown by its letter attache hereto and made a part of this report.

Your committee is satisfied that this is the only way by which the City can become the owner of 1000 inches of water, and it therefore recommends that its action in the premises be approved, and that it be authorized, with the City Attorney and the City Engineer, to prepare the proper papers and agreements with the Southern California Water Company, to carry out the proposition contained in said resolution.

#### Ordinance No.

An ordinance providing for the sale and conveyance of certain lands owned by the City of San Diego, California, authorizing certain Officers to execute deeds therefor, and apportioning the moneys received therefrom.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, as follows:

Sec 1. That the City Treasurer of the City of San Diego, California, be and hereby authorized and directed to sell at public auction, to the highest bidder for cash, all that certain real property heretofore sold and struck off to the City of San Diego as the purchaser at the delinquent tax sale held in said City in the year 1894.

for the delinquent city taxes thereon for the fiscal year 1893 which has not been redeemed, and which has been or may hereafter be conveyed to said city by deeds executed under and by virtue of the provisions of Joint Resolution No. 663 passed and adopted by the Common Council of said city on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1895.

Sec. 2. That any and all sales made hereunder shall be subject to the lien of the city for <sup>the</sup> taxes for each year subsequent to the fiscal year 1893.

Sec 3 No sale shall be made under the provisions of this Ordinance until after publication and notice thereof by said City Treasurer, for at least three weeks in the City Official newspaper of said city, which notice must contain the time and place of such sale, a description of the property to be sold, and a statement that all sales made shall be subject to the lien of the City for the Taxes for each year subsequent to the fiscal year 1893.

Sec 4 That said Treasurer is authorized to postpone the day of commencing such sale, or the sale from day to day, but the sale must be completed within three weeks from the day first fixed, provided, however, that said Treasurer shall discontinue and abandon such sale at any time upon being instructed so to do by a resolution of the Common Council of said City.

Section 5. That on the day and hour fixed in said notice for the said sale, or at some subsequent day to which he may have postponed it, the said Treasurer must commence the sale of the property advertised, commencing at the head of the list and continuing in the order that the same is described in the notice of sale, until completed, unless said sale is discontinued and abandoned as hereinbefore provided.

Sec. 6. All deeds to property sold at such sale shall be executed on behalf of said City by the said Treasurer, and attested by the City Clerk, with the City official seal affixed; and said Treasurer and said City Clerk are hereby empowered, authorized and directed, to execute such deeds for said on behalf and as the act and deed of the said City of San Diego.

Sec. 7. That all moneys for property purchases at such sales shall be paid to the City Treasurer, who shall execute duplicate receipts therefor, showing amount paid, by whom paid, and the description of property purchased, one of which receipts shall file with the Auditor of said City and deliver the other to the purchaser; such purchaser or his assigns, upon presenting and delivering such receipt to the City Clerk, shall be entitled to a deed conveying to him all the interest of said city in and to the

property described in such receipt which the city received by virtue of such tax sale and the tax deed received thereon, subject only to the lien of the city for taxes for each year subsequent to the fiscal year 1893, and said City Clerk shall thereupon prepare such deed and deliver the same to such purchaser or his assigns, after having the same executed on behalf of the city as provided by section six of this ordinance.

Sec. 8. That upon the filing of the duplicate receipt with the City Auditor, as in section seven provided, he shall apportion the amount therein named as follows, to wit: one half of said amount to the Street Fund of said city, and one half to the Salary Fund thereof.

Sec. 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval, and one publication thereof in the city official newspaper of said city, viz: the San Diego Sun.

the said Auditor.
