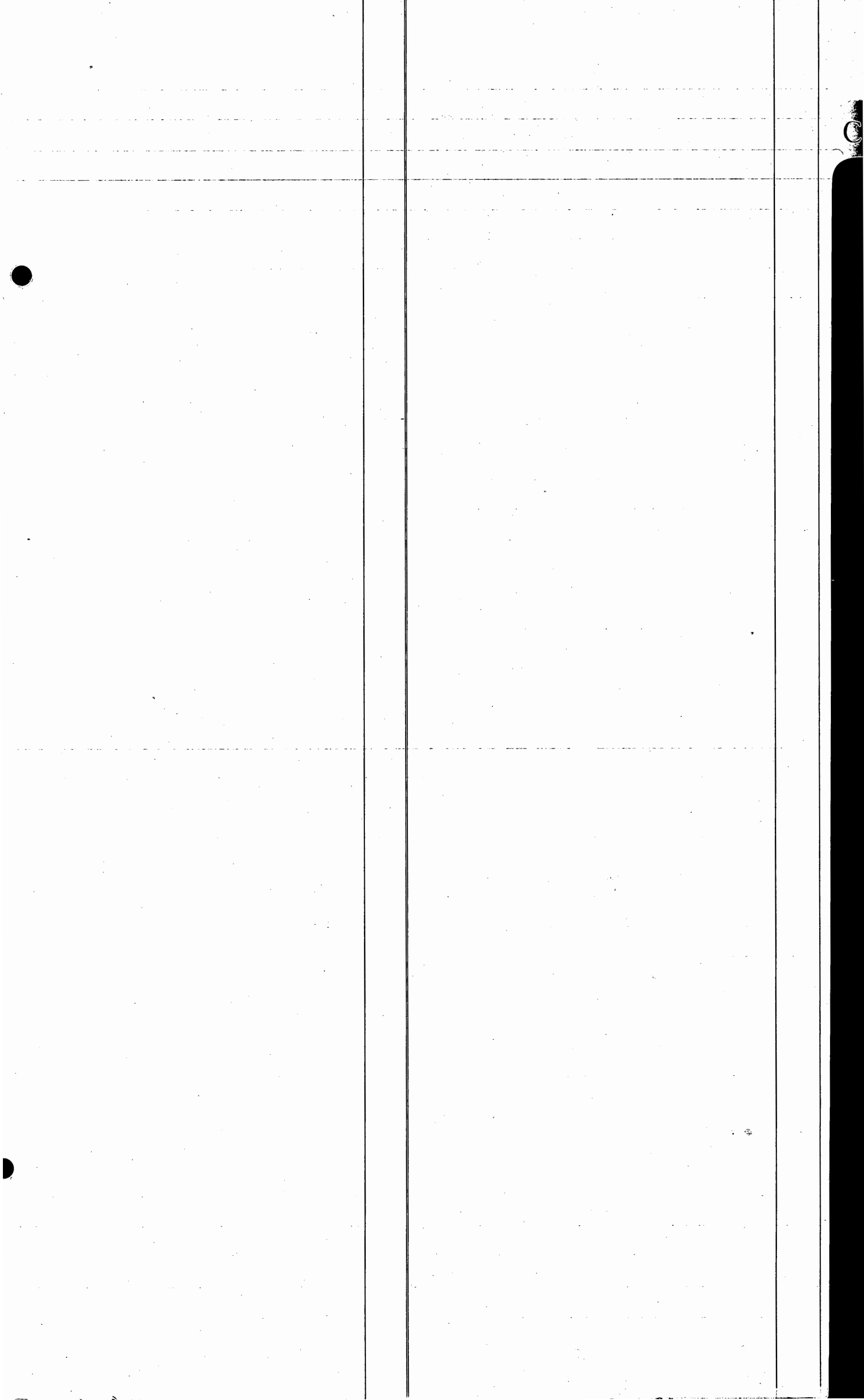

Section 1, That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be and is hereby authorized and directed to sprinkle with water and roll with the steam road roller "F" street from the east line of Eighth street to the west line of Twenty-fifth street from curb line to curb line. Said work to be with the street force of said City; provided the expense therefor shall not exceed the sum of \$150.00.

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Ordinance No. 1416.

An Ordinance providing for the continuation of the Abstract of title to the Reservoir site in La Jolla Park in the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, Frederick T. Scripps and Ellen D. Scripps have agreed to sell to said City of San Diego, the water reservoir in La Jolla Park in the City of San Diego, California, for one thousand dollars, and to expend the said sum of one thousand dollars, and two hundred and fifty dollars in addition thereto, in grading and making a wagon road from Pacific Beach to La Jolla Park in said City; and

Whereas, an abstract of title to said reservoir, which it will be necessary to have before said transaction can be completed, will cost about seventy five dollars; and

Whereas, the said Frederick T. Scripps and Ellen D. 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Ordinance No. 1419.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR the purchase of water pipe for a water pipe line from Pacific Beach to La Jolla Park in the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, by Resolution numbered 1510, adopted by the Common Council of said city on the 16th day of March, 1903, and approved by the Mayor of said city on the 17th day of March, 1903, determined, and declared that the public interest and necessity of the said city and of the inhabitants thereof demanded the construction, by said city, of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of certain improvements and extensions of the system of water works in said city for the purpose of supplying said city and its inhabitants with water, said improvements and extensions of said water system including, among the construction of other pipe lines, the construction of a water pipe line from the intersection of First street and Grand street in Pacific Beach to the intersection of Grand avenue and Prospect street in La Jolla Park in said city, consisting of twenty thousand three hundred and fifty linear feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe, and that bonds of said city should issue for the payment thereof; and

Whereas, since the adoption of said resolution all the proceedings required by law for the issuance of bonds for such purpose have been taken and adopted, but said bonds have not yet been issued; and

Whereas, at the time said Resolution was adopted it was considered that a four-inch pipe line was sufficient to supply the demands for water of the said La Jolla Park and the people residing thereat; and

Whereas, since the adoption of said Resolution over sixty new houses have been built in the said La Jolla Park, and the population of the said La Jolla Park has nearly doubled in number, and on account of the demand made therefor by the people residing at the said La Jolla Park, plans and specifications for a new sewerage system are being prepared and will be constructed in the near future, and several new additions have been laid out between Pacific Beach and La Jolla Park, and many new building lots sold to persons who are expecting to build dwelling houses thereon to be supplied with water from said pipe line; and the demand for water in that locality is now nearly double the demand which existed when said Resolution was adopted; and

Whereas, on account of these new conditions which have arisen since the adoption of said Resolution, and since the election at which the issuance of said bonds was authorized, it has been ascertained that the said four-inch cast iron pipe line will not, by itself, be of sufficient capacity to supply the demands for water of the people living along said pipe line and at La Jolla Park; and

Whereas, in order to supply such demand now existing, it will require the construction of a four-inch cast iron pipe line in addition to and besides the four-inch cast iron water pipe line for the construction of which provision was made in the said proceedings for the issuance of bonds; and

Whereas, the said Common Council is not desirous of taking any action which will interfere in any manner whatsoever with the issuance of said bonds, but is desirous of constructing a four-inch water pipe line between the said Pacific Beach and the said La Jolla Park, which will be in addition to the said four-inch water pipe line provided for in the said proceedings for the issuance of bonds;

Now, therefore, be it ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby found and determined that the public interest and necessity of the said City of San Diego, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction of a four-inch cast iron water pipe line between Pacific Beach and La Jolla Park, in said city, in addition to the four-inch cast iron water pipe line provided for in the proceedings for the issuance of said bonds; that when said bonds have been issued and sold, the said four-inch cast iron water pipe line running from the intersection of the said First street and Grand street in Pacific Beach to the intersection of the said Grand avenue and Prospect street in La Jolla Park (the construction of which has been provided for in the proceedings for the issuance of said bonds) shall be constructed with the proceeds of said bonds; that for the purpose of constructing a four-inch cast iron water pipe line in addition to the said four-inch cast iron water pipe line (the construction of which has been provided for in said bond proceedings), the Board of Public Works of said city be and is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and let a contract for furnishing to said city 18,840 feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe, said pipe to be furnished according to specifications to be prepared by the said Board of Public Works; provided, that the expense thereof shall not exceed the sum of \$8,800.00.

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Ordinance No. 1421.

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS for the Operation of Self-propelling Vehicles in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to run, drive or operate, or cause to be run, driven or operated any automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power at a rate of speed faster than six miles an hour upon any of the streets in that portion of the City of San Diego, California, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point where the north line of "B" street intersects the west line of Third street; thence running east along the said north line of "B" street to a point where the said north line of "B" street intersects the east line of Seventh street; thence running south along the said east line of Seventh street to a point where the said east line of Seventh street intersects the south line of "K" street; thence west along the said south line of "K" street to a point where the said south line of "K" street intersects the said west line of Third street; thence running north along the said west line of Third street to the place of beginning, or at a rate of speed faster than four miles an hour over or across any street crossing or street intersection within the said described district.

Section 2. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to run, drive, or operate, or cause to be run, driven or operated any automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power at a rate of speed faster than ten miles an hour upon any of the streets in that portion of the City of San Diego, California, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point where the southeasterly line of Upas street, if extended southwesterly would intersect the northeasterly shore line of the bay of San Diego, thence running first along the southeasterly line of Upas street; thence along the southerly line of Upas street to the west line of the fourteen hundred acre public park; thence running south along the west line of the said public park to the north line of Caruther's addition; thence running east along the said north line of Caruther's addition to the east line of Caruther's addition; thence running south along the east line of Caruther's addition to the south line of said public park; thence running east along the said south line of said public park to the east line of Twenty-fifth street; thence running south along the said east line of Twenty-fifth street to the south line of "N" street; thence running at right angles east to the east line of said city; thence running south along the said east line of said city to the northeasterly shore line of the bay of San Diego; thence following the meanderings of the said northeasterly shore line of the bay of San Diego, first in a northwesterly and then in a northerly direction to the place of beginning; or at a rate of speed faster than six miles an hour over or across any street crossing or street intersection within said last described district; provided, however that the provisions of this section shall not in any manner whatsoever be construed so as to affect the regulations prescribed by section one of this ordinance.

Section 3. That any person running, driving or operating, or causing to be run, driven or operated any automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power in the City of San Diego, California, shall, upon meeting any person driving or riding a horse or horses, or riding or driving any other domestic animal or animals, at the request or signal, or by putting up the hand, from the party either driving or riding such horse or horses, or other domestic animal or animals, cause the said automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power to immediately stop and remain stationary, and if requested, shall cause the engine of the said automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power to stop running until said horse or horses, or other domestic animal or animals shall have passed.

Section 4. That any person running, driving, or operating any automobile, steam carriage, motor-bicycle, or other self-propelled vehicle operated or propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity, or other power upon any street or public highway in said city upon meeting any person driving or riding a horse or horses, or driving or riding any other domestic animal or animals upon any grade upon such public highway, shall take the outside of said grade without reference to whether it be the right or left side of such grade.

Section 5. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00), nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment in the city jail of said city for a period not exceeding one hundred (100) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE LIMITING THE DISTRICT WITHIN WHICH INTOXICATING LIQUORS MAY BE SOLD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to keep any saloon, bar, barroom, tippling house, dram shop, or other place where any spirituous, vinous, malt, or any intoxicating liquors are sold in the City of San Diego, California, outside of that certain district in said City described as follows:

Commencing at a point where the south line of "F" street intersects the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence east along the said south line of "F" street to the east line of Arctic street; thence north along the said east line of Arctic street to the south line of Beech street; thence east along the said south line of Beech street to the east line of India street; thence south along the said east line of India street to the north line of "C" street; thence east along the said north line of "C" street to the east line of Third street; thence north along the said east line of Third street to the north line of "B" street; thence east along the said north line of "B" street to the east line of Fourth street; thence north along the said east line of Fourth street to a point fifty (50) feet north of the said north line of "B" street; thence east to a point on the east line of Fifth street fifty (50) feet north of the said north line of "B" street; thence south along the said east line of Fifth street to the south line of "D" street; thence east along the said south line of "D" street to the west line of Sixth street; thence south along the said west line of Sixth street to the north line of "H" street; thence east along the said north line of "H" street to the west line of Seventh street; thence south along the said west line of Seventh street to the north line of "K" street; thence east along the said north line of "K" street to the east line of Fourteenth street; thence north along the said east line of Fourteenth street two hundred (200) feet; thence running at right angles east to the west line of Sherman's addition; thence running at right angles south to the said north line of "K" street; thence east along the said north line of "K" street to the west line of Fifteenth street; thence south along the said west line of Fifteenth street to the north line of "L" street; thence west along the said north line of "L" street to a point where said north line of "L" street intersects the northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence first in a northwesterly and then in a northerly direction along the said shore line of the said Bay of San Diego to the point of beginning.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell any spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors to be used in or upon the premises in the residence portion of the said City of San Diego, but all such sales shall be excluded from the residence portion of said City, and all places where such sales may be made shall be confined to the business portion of the said City of San Diego, which is described as follows:

Commencing at a point where the south line of "F" street intersects the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence east along the said south line of "F" street to the east line of Arctic street; thence north along the said east line of Arctic street to the south line of Beech street; thence east along the said south line of Beech street to the east line of India street; thence south along the said east line of India street to the north line of "C" street; thence east along the said north line of "C" street to the east line of Third street; thence north along the said east line of Third street to the north line of "B" street; thence east along the said north line of "B" street to the east line of Fourth street; thence north along the said east line of Fourth street to a point fifty (50) feet north of the said north line of "B" street; thence east to a point on the east line of Fifth street fifty (50) feet north of the said north line of "B" street; thence south along the said east line of Fifth street to the south line of "D" street; thence east along the said south line of "D" street to the west line of Sixth street; thence south along the said west line of Sixth street to the north line of "H" street; thence east along the said north line of "H" street to the west line of Seventh street; thence south along the said west line of Seventh street to the north line of "K" street; thence east along the said north line of "K" street to the east line of Fourteenth street; thence north along the said east line of Fourteenth street two hundred (200) feet; thence running at right angles east to the west line of Sherman's addition; thence running at right angles south to the said north line of "K" street; thence east along the said north line of "K" street to the west line of Fifteenth street; thence south along the said west line of Fifteenth street to the north line of "L" street; thence west along the said north line of "L" street to a point where said north line of "L" street intersects the northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence first in a northwesterly and then in a northerly direction, along the said shore line of the said Bay of San Diego, to the point of beginning.

PROVIDED, that this ordinance shall not apply to drug stores and the San Diego Brewery, nor to hotels on blocks 231 and 249 of Horton's Addition in the said City of San Diego.

Section 3. That any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or be imprisoned in the city jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty (50) days, or shall suffer both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.



AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE "FIRE IMPROVEMENT BONDS" AND "BRIDGE BONDS" OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA. BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of San Diego, California, sell, at private sale, ten or more one-thousand-dollar "Fire improvement Bonds" and the ten five-hundred-dollar "Bridge Bonds" authorized by the electors of said city on the 25th day of April, 1903, at an election held for that purpose, to be issued and sold by said City, and that for that purpose the City Clerk of said City be and he is hereby authorized to prepare a subscription list for persons who desire to purchase said bonds, or any portion thereof, which subscription list shall provide that the person desiring to purchase any of said bonds will agree to take the same when his proposal has been accepted by the Common Council; that upon said offer being made and subscription list signed, the purchaser shall pay to the said City Clerk five per cent of the purchase price of the bonds which he desires to purchase as security that he will take said bonds at such price and pay the other ninety-five per cent of the purchase price of said bonds, when his proposal has been accepted by the said Common Council, and the bonds delivered to such purchaser, by the City Treasurer of said City. That said bonds shall not be sold for less than their par value, and that when subscriptions have been so received for ten or more of said "Fire Improvement Bonds" or the full amount of the issue of said "Bridge Bonds," and the said deposit made as aforesaid, the said City Clerk shall submit the same to the said Common Council, and thereafter the said proposals (if accepted) shall be accepted by ordinance duly adopted by the said Common Council; provided, that the said Common Council reserves the right to reject any offers or proposals made.

An Ordinance prescribing the mode for the sale of a Telephone Franchise in the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, Arthur Wright, an applicant for a telephone franchise in the City of San Diego, California, did, on the 9th day of November, 1903, file with the governing and legislative body of the City of San Diego, California, to wit the Common Council of said City, an application for a telephone franchise in said City, which application describes said franchise, and is now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, endorsed as follows: "Document No. - Filed Nov. 9th, 1903, Geo. L. Goldman, City Clerk, Petition of Arthur Wright for a Telephone Franchise Amended and granted by Council Nov. 9th, 1903"

And whereas, said application for said franchise petitioned the said governing and legislative body of said City to advertise said franchise for sale, and sell the same to the highest bidder for cash and,

Whereas, it is the desire of the said governing and legislative body of said City to grant said application and advertise said franchise for sale,

Now therefore, Be It Ordained By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows;

Section 1. That said governing and legislative body of the said City of San Diego, advertise the fact of said application, together with a statement that it is proposed to grant the same, in the City official newspaper of said City, to wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, a daily newspaper of said City and of general circulation within said City, wherein said franchise is to be exercised once a day for ten (10) successive days, and that said advertisement shall state that bids will be received for said franchise and that it will be awarded to the highest bidder.

Said publication must be completed not less than twenty nor more than thirty days before any further action will be taken upon said application. Said publication shall also state the character of said franchise and privilege proposed to be granted, the term for which it is to be granted, that sealed bids therefor will be received up to a

Certain hour and day named therein, and that the successful bidder and his assigns must, during the life of said franchise, pay to the said City of San Diego, two percent of the gross annual receipts of the person, partnership, or corporation, to whom the said franchise is awarded, arising from its use, operation or possession, provided, that no percentage shall be paid for the first five years succeeding the date of the said franchise, but thereafter such percentage shall be payable annually, and in the event said payment is not made, said franchise shall be forfeited.

Said advertisement shall also contain a statement that the said franchise will be struck off, sold, and awarded to the person, firm, or corporation who shall make the highest cash bid therefor; provided, that at the time of the opening of said bids any responsible person, firm, or corporation present or represented may bid for said franchise or privilege a sum not less than ten percent above the highest sealed bid therefor, and said bid so made, may be raised not less than ten percent by any other responsible bidder, and said bidding may so continue until finally said franchise shall be struck off, sold, and awarded by said governing body to the highest bidder therefor in gold coin of the United States. Each sealed bid shall be accompanied with cash or a certified check, payable to the treasurer of said municipality, for the full amount of said bid, and no sealed bid shall be considered unless said cash or check is enclosed therewith, and the successful bidder shall deposit at least ten percent of the amount of said bid with the City Clerk of the said San Diego before the franchise shall be struck off to him, and if he shall fail to make such deposit, immediately, then and in that case, his bid shall not be received, and shall be considered as void, and that said franchise shall then and there be again offered for sale to the bidder who shall make the highest cash bid therefor, subject to the same conditions as to deposit as above mentioned.

Said procedure shall be had until said franchise is struck off, sold, and awarded to a bidder who shall make the necessary deposit of at least ten percent of the amount of his bid therefor, as in this Ordinance provided. Said successful bidder shall deposit with the said City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, within twenty-four

hours after the acceptance of his bid, the remaining twenty per cent of the amount thereof, and in case he or it shall fail to do so, then the said deposit theretofore made shall be forfeited, and the said award of said franchise shall be void, and the said franchise shall then and there, by said governing body, be again offered for sale to the highest bidder therefor, in the same manner and under the same restrictions as hereinbefore provided, and in case said bidder shall fail to deposit with the said City Clerk the remaining twenty per cent, of his bid, within twenty four hours after its acceptance, the award to him of said franchise shall be set aside, and the deposit theretofore made by him shall be forfeited, and no further proceeding for a sale of said franchise shall be had unless the same shall be re-advertised and again offered for sale in the manner hereinbefore provided.

The successful bidder for any franchise struck off sold, and awarded under this ordinance shall file a bond running to said City of San Diego, with at least two good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by said Common Council in the penal sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) (which shall be set forth in said advertisement for bids, conditioned that such bidder shall well and truly observe, fulfill, and perform each and every term and condition of such franchise, and that in case of any breach of condition of such bond, the whole amount of the penal sum of two thousand dollars, (\$2,000.00) shall be taken and deemed to be liquidated damages, and shall be recoverable from the principal and sureties upon said bond.

Said bond shall be filed with such governing body within five days after such franchise is awarded, and that the successful bidder of said franchise shall within five days after such franchise is awarded file with the Common Council of said City a bond running to said City with at least two good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by the said Common Council, in the penal sum of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) conditioned that the said successful bidder, his or its successors or assigns, shall expend the sum of money within the time resp

ectively and for the purpose as in paragraph First of the said application for such franchise provided, that in case of any breach of such bond the whole amount of the penal sum therein named shall be taken and deemed to be liquidated damages, and shall be recoverable from the principal and sureties upon said bond. And upon the filing and approval of such bonds the said franchise shall, by said governing and legislative body, be granted, by ordinance to the person, firm or corporation to whom it has been struck off, sold, or awarded. And in case said bonds shall not be so filed, the award of such franchise shall be set aside, and any money paid therefor shall be forfeited, and said franchise shall, in the discretion of the said governing and legislative body, be re-advertised and again offered for sale in the same manner and under the same restrictions as hereinbefore provided. Said advertisement shall be signed by the said City Clerk, and he shall cause the same to be published as above specified.

Said notice shall specify the time and place, when and where said bids will be received. At the said time and place, the said governing body shall, through its Clerk, namely the City Clerk of said City, to whom said bids shall be delivered, and by whom said bids shall be received, for and on behalf of the said governing body, proceed to open and declare said bids, and at the same time of so opening said bids, the said governing body through its said Clerk, shall proceed to hear and receive the bids of any responsible person, firm, or corporation, present or represented, who may bid for said franchise or privilege, a sum not less than ten per cent, above the highest sealed bid therefor and said bid so made may be raised not less than ten per cent, by any responsible bidder, and said bidding may so continue to be made, and bids continue to be received by the said governing body through its said Clerk, until finally said franchise shall be struck off, sold and awarded by said governing body through its said Clerk, to the said highest bidder therefor, in gold coin of the United States subject however, to such striking off, sale, and award.

being confirmed by ordinance by the said governing body, and the said bid being accepted by ordinance by the said governing body, and no such award of such franchise shall be made, nor any bid therefor finally accepted, until so accepted and made by said governing body by ordinance.

And the grant of said franchise, rights, and privileges shall be subject to the right of the said Common Council to fix a reasonable rate of compensation to be charged and collected by any person, or corporation for the use of a telephone or telephones under such franchise, and also subject to all the provisions of the law and of the character of said City relative to granting franchises, rights and privileges.







Ordinance No. 1456.

An Ordinance Prescribing Certain Regulations for the laying of sidewalks and Curbs in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to lay or put in place any sidewalk or curb in or upon any street in the City of San Diego, California, without first obtaining permission so to do from the Board of Public Works of said City. Any person desiring to construct a sidewalk or curb upon any street in the said City of San Diego, shall make application in writing to the said Board of Public Works for permission so to do; said application shall state the place where said sidewalk or curb is to be laid, and the number of feet of said sidewalk or curb to be constructed.

Said applicant shall deposit with the said Board of Public Works the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk and curb, or fractional part thereof where the applicant desires to construct both a sidewalk and curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of sidewalk, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant desires to construct a sidewalk without constructing a curb at the same time in front of the same property, or ten dollars (\$10.00) for each one hundred (100) feet of curb, or fractional part thereof, where the applicant does not desire to construct a sidewalk at the same time in front of the same property, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said City when said sidewalk or curb has been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street and according to specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, and that the portion of the sidewalk not paved shall be graded to the official grade thereof, provided that in lieu of the cash deposit above specified, any contractor regularly engaged in the business of laying cement or other sidewalks, or in constructing concrete, natural stone, or other curbs in the said City of San Diego, California, may furnish and deliver to the said Board of Public Works a bond payable to the said City of San Diego, in the penal sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the said Board of Public

Works, as security for the removal of all debris and surplus material from the street in said City, when the said work shall have been constructed, and also as security that said sidewalk and curb shall be laid to the official grade of said street, and according to specifications therefor prescribed by the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, and also as security that that portion of the ^{said} sidewalk not paved shall be graded to the official grade thereof.

That in the event any person giving such bond, or his assigns, shall fail for a period of fifteen days, after the completion of said work, to remove said debris or surplus material from said street, or to grade the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof, the said Board of Public Works shall cause said debris to be removed from said street, or the unpaved portion of said sidewalk to be graded to its official grade (as the case may be) and said person giving said bond, and the sureties thereon, shall be liable to said City, in a civil action, upon said bond, for the expenses so incurred, and in the event that said person giving said bond shall fail to construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, and shall fail or refuse for a period of ten days, after having been notified by the owner of the property, in front of which and for whom said work is being done, or his agent, to put and construct said sidewalk or curb to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, then the said owner may put and construct, or cause to be put and constructed said work to the official grade of said street, and the said person giving said bond and the sureties thereon shall be liable upon said bond for all costs and expenses incurred by the owner of said property in putting and constructing said work to the official grade of said street, or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, (as the case may be) and also for all damages suffered by said owner on account thereof.

Every bond so executed under the provisions of this Ordinance is in force and obligatory upon the principal and sureties therein, to and for the said City of San Diego, and to and for the use and benefit of all persons who may be injured or aggrieved by the person giving said bond failing to remove said debris and surplus material or to construct said work to the official grade of said street.

or according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, or to grade the ungraded portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof. And any persons so injured or aggrieved may bring suit upon such bond in his own name, without any assignment thereof. No such bond is void on the first recovery of a judgment thereon, but suit may be afterwards brought, from time to time, and judgment recovered thereon by the said City of San Diego, or by any person to whom a right of action has accrued against the principal and the sureties of said bond, until the whole penalty of said bond is exhausted, whenever such bond does not contain the substantial matter or conditions required by this ordinance, or there are any defects in the approval or filing of said bond, it is not void so as to discharge such person giving such bond and his sureties, but they are equitably bound to the said City of San Diego, or any party interested, and the said City or such party may by a civil action in Court, suggest the defect in such bond, approval, or filing, and recover the proper and equitable demand or damages from the principal of such bond and the persons who intended, to become and were included as sureties in such bond.

In the event that the said Board of Public Works, shall find and determine, after having given the Contractor an opportunity to be heard, that such Contractor has violated any of the provisions, conditions, or obligations of such bond, either by failing to construct such work to the official grade of the street, or according to the said specifications therefor, or by failing to grade the ungraded portion of the sidewalk to the official grade thereof, or by failing to ^{so} remove such debris or surplus material, the said Board of Public Works, shall immediately thereafter report such fact to the said Common Council and shall not thereafter issue any permit to the person giving such bond for doing any other work, or for any such work to be done by such Contractor, unless specifically authorized so to do by said Common Council.

Upon said application being made and said sum being so deposited with the said Board of Public Works, or said bond being so furnished, the said Board of Public Works shall issue a permit to the applicant for the construction of the work described in the application, and shall immediately notify the City Engineer of said City of the issuance of such permit, and thereof the said City Engineer shall set the grade stakes for the

Construction of the said work, which states shall be to the official grade of said street, and thereafter said work shall be constructed according to the said grade states according to the official grade of said street, and according to the specifications prescribed for doing such work by the ordinances of said City in force at the time such work is done, and not otherwise, and the unimproved portion of said sidewalk shall be graded to the official grade thereof.

After said work shall have been so constructed, the said City Engineer shall survey the same for the purpose of ascertaining whether said work has been constructed to the official grade of said street, and that the unimproved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to its official grade, and according to the states set therefor. If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and that the unimproved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to the official grade, he shall issue, to the person for whom the said work has been constructed, a certificate in writing certifying that fact, but he shall not issue any certificate if he finds that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and the unimproved portion of said sidewalk has been graded to the official grade thereof. When the said City Engineer issues such certificate, the said Board of Public Works shall thereafter return said deposit, provided, that said surplus materials and debris have been removed from said street upon which said work has been so constructed and the unimproved portion of said sidewalk graded to the official grade thereof.

If the said City Engineer shall find that the said work has not been constructed according to the official grade of said street, or that the unimproved portion of said sidewalk has not been graded to the official grade thereof, he shall immediately notify the said Board of Public Works of that fact, and said deposit shall not be returned until said work has been constructed according to the official grade of said street, and the unimproved portion of said sidewalk graded to the official grade thereof, and a certificate issued to that effect by the said City Engineer.

Provided, however, that no permit shall be issued by the said Board of Public Works for the construction of bituminous rock or asphalt sidewalks or wooden curbs, nor shall a permit be issued by said Board of Public Works for the construction of a concrete or other sidewalk or curb after a resolution

of intention has been passed by the Common Council of said City to sidewalk or curb that portion of the street upon which the applicant desires to construct such sidewalk or curb, without special permission having ^{being} first had and obtained from the Common Council of said City.

The said City Engineer shall charge the regular fees for making such survey and setting such stakes as prescribed by the Ordinances of this City, except that no extra fees shall be charged for checking up work after the completion thereof.

This Ordinance shall not apply to work done under a Contract, by the Superintendent of Streets under the general street law, of the state of California, where an assessment is to be levied therefor.

Section 2, That it shall be and it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, constructing any sidewalk or curb under any permit, issued by the Board of Public Works, of said City, as herein provided, to fail or refuse, for a period of fifteen days after the completion of said work, to remove from said street upon which said work has been constructed, all debris or surplus material, or to lay or construct any sidewalk or curb other than to the official grade of the said street, or not according to the specifications therefor prescribed by the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, or to fail or refuse to grade the unfinished portion of said sidewalk to the official grade thereof; provided, that the provisions of this ordinance shall not require the grading of that portion of the sidewalk between the inside line of the sidewalk and the property line occupied by any building, retaining wall, fence, or any obstruction other than the natural earth. Provided further that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to any work where permits for doing such work have already been obtained from the said Board of Public Works; provided that such work for which permits have already been so obtained shall be constructed and completed within ninety days from and after the passage and approval of this ordinance.

Section 3. That whenever the said Common Council shall determine that any street shall be permanently improved, which shall include the construction of sidewalks and curbs, the said Common Council shall fix a time within which the owners of property fronting upon said street may construct such sidewalks and curbs in front of their property by private Contract; that it -

shall be the duty of the City Engineer of said City, immediately thereafter to prepare a profile of the sidewalks of that portion of said street so determined to be sidewalked and Curbed, which profile shall be kept on file in the office of the said City Engineer, who shall furnish to any person applying therefor, an estimate of the number of cubic yards of excavation or embankment which it will be necessary to make in bringing any portion of the sidewalk of said street to its official grade; that when the said time so fixed within which the said property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, has elapsed, it shall be the duty of the said City Engineer to furnish the said Common Council with a detailed report showing the amount of sidewalking and curbing yet remaining to be done on the said street or portion thereof so determined to be improved.

Section 4. That when the said Common Council has decided upon the improvement of a street or portion thereof, and has fixed the time within which property owners may do their own work, as herein before provided, it shall be the duty of the City Clerk of said City to advertise the fact that said improvement has been decided upon, and that property owners desiring to construct sidewalks and curbs by private contract must complete said work on or before the date fixed by the said Common Council; and also that said work must be constructed in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, regulating the construction and providing specifications for such work. Said advertisement shall be published in the City official news paper of said City not to exceed three times. When the time within which property owners may do their ^{own} work as herein before provided has elapsed, it shall be the duty of the said City Clerk to inform the said Common Council of that fact.

Section 5. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6. That any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1. or Section 2. of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for a period of not exceeding one hundred days (100), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 7. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 8. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Ordinance to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

That, except as otherwise herein provided, it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, Company, or Corporation to place, erect, or maintain any poles or other supports for telephone lines or wires, or to string, or erect, or maintain telephone wires for the purpose of transmitting sounds, signals, Conversation, and intelligence through and over wires by means of electricity, upon any street, except in underground conduits, within that portion of the said City of San Diego, California, described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the northwest corner of the intersection of "D" Street and Third Street in the City of San Diego, California, thence running east along the north line of Seventh Street; thence running south along the said east line of Seventh Street to the northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running westerly along the said northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego, to a point where the west line of Third Street intersects the said northerly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running north along the west line of Third Street to the place of beginning.

Provided, that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the erection and maintenance of poles for the distribution of such wires, or the stringing or distribution of such wires from such poles, provided, that such poles shall be at least one hundred and fifty feet apart, and provided also, that no such wires shall be stringed or run from one pole to another pole within said district, Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall prohibit any person, Company or Corporation, or his or its successors or assigns, who may obtain a Franchise under any petition or application therefor, or under any proceeding for the granting or sale thereof now pending, from placing, erecting, or maintaining poles or from stringing or maintaining wires for said purpose, in said district, until the second day of January, 1907, except in that portion

thereof described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at a point where the north line of "D" street intersects the west line of Fourth Street in the City of San Diego, California, thence running east along the said north line of "D" street to the east line of sixth street; thence running south along the said east line of sixth street to the south line of "I" street; thence running west along the said south line of "I" street to the said west line of Fourth Street; thence running north along the said west line of Fourth Street to the place of beginning.

Provided, further, that any person, Company, or Corporation now maintaining any such poles or wires over or under any street within said described district, shall have until the second day of January, 1907, within which to place such wires in underground conduits within said district above described; and that all of said poles and wires shall be removed from the said streets within the said district above described on or before the said second day of January, 1907, except as otherwise herein provided, Plans and specifications for the construction of all such conduits shall be filed in the office of the City Engineer, of said City before the actual work of constructing the same shall have been commenced, and the work of constructing the same shall be in accordance with the reasonable rules and regulations relative thereto, adopted by said Common Council or the Superintendent of streets of said City.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That any person, Company, or Corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of two hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for a period not exceeding one hundred days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and that each day that any person, Company, or Corporation shall so place, erect, or maintain such wires or poles in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense and a separate violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

Specification book No. 1" from page one to page four inclusive; and that the said Board of Public Works of said City be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the furnishing of all labor and material necessary for the construction of said bridges, in accordance with said plans and specifications, for fifteen days in the City official newspaper of said City, to wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, provided that all bids received by the said Board of Public Works in accordance with said advertisement shall be immediately opened and declared by said Board then forwarded to the said Common Council, and that no bid shall be accepted or contract awarded or any indebtedness or liability incurred by the said City of San Diego, until the Common Council of said City shall by Ordinance authorize the said Board of Public Works to accept the lowest responsible bid for the furnishing of said labor and material in accordance with said plans and specifications; and provided further that said notice shall also contain a provision that the said Board of Public Works reserves the right to reject any and all bids; and provided further, that no bids shall be accepted for furnishing said labor and material, or for the construction of said bridges unless said bid shall be a reasonable bid, and provided further, that no bid shall be accepted or contract awarded for the construction of said work, unless the bridge bonds in the amount of five thousand dollars, which the electors of this City authorized the Common Council to issue for the purpose of constructing said bridges, at an election held for that purpose in said City, on the 25th day of April, 1903, have been sold and the proceeds therefor paid into the bridge improvement fund, in the City Treasurer's office in said City of San Diego; and said Board authorized by an Ordinance duly adopted by the said Common Council within twenty days after said bids have been received, to accept the lowest regular bid received, said bridge bonds being described in Ordinance No. 1340, of the Ordinances of said City entitled an Ordinance providing for the issuance of

Ordinance No. 1482,

An Ordinance providing for the execution of a Contract extending the time of the Southern California Mountain Water Company within which to complete its pipe line and commence the furnishing of water to the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, a contract has been formulated and agreed upon between the City of San Diego, California, and the Southern California Mountain Water Company, wherein and whereby an extension of time is granted by the said City of San Diego, to the said Southern California Mountain Water Company for the completion of the pipe line from the Lower Otay Dam in the County of San Diego, State of California, to the University Reservoir located on Block numbered One hundred and twenty-two (122) of University Heights in said City, which Contract is endorsed, "Second Agreement between the Southern California Mountain Water Company and the City of San Diego for an extension of time for the completion of pipe line and the commencement of furnishing water to the City of San Diego, California, now in the possession of the City Clerk of said City; and

Whereas, the said City of San Diego, is desirous of entering into and executing said Contract and agreement.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of San Diego, California hereby gives and grants to the Southern California Mountain Water Company fifteen months' additional time from and after the first day of February, 1904, viz: to the first day of May, 1905, within which to complete the construction of said pipe line from the said Lower Otay Dam to the said University Heights Reservoir, and within which to commence selling, furnishing, and delivering water to the said City of San Diego, according to the provisions of said Contract dated March 12th, 1901; and that the term of ten (10) years, as specified in said Contract dated, March 12th, 1901, shall commence on the completion of said pipe line and the first delivery of water through and by means thereof, and that said Contract shall be and remain in force for ten (10) years thereafter;

Ordinance No. 1483.

An Ordinance prescribing certain regulations for the keeping of dogs, in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to own, keep or harbor any fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog in the City of San Diego, California, except such dog be so kept within the premises of such person, that such dog cannot do injury to any person in the pursuit of lawful business.

Section 2. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to own, keep, or harbor any dog in the City of San Diego, California, which disturbs the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person within the said City of San Diego.

Section 3. That any person violating any of the provisions of either Section 1. or Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for a period not exceeding fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful and a nuisance for any fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog to run at large in the said City of San Diego, or for any dog to disturb the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person in said City, and the police officers, of said City are hereby authorized and directed to kill or otherwise dispose of such fierce, vicious, mischievous, or dangerous dog running at large in said City, and to kill or otherwise dispose of any dog which disturbs the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or person in said City.

Section 5. That Ordinance No 42, of the Ordinances of said City, approved on the 26th day of November 1889, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 6. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 7. That the City Clerk of said City of



Ordinance No. 1484.

An Ordinance declaring the grade of Twenty-fifth Street in the City of San Diego, California, to be changed, and establishing the grade of the same at certain points thereon, between the South line of "F" Street and the North line of "J" Street.

Be It Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. Whereas the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, on the Sixteenth day of November Nineteen Hundred and Three, duly passed and adopted a resolution of Intention to change and establish the grade of that portion of Twenty-fifth Street in said City, at certain points specified, and specifically described in said resolution of Intention, and

Whereas, the said resolution of intention was approved by the Mayor of said City on the Seventeenth day of November, Nineteen Hundred and Three, which resolution described the proposed change of grade, and

Whereas said Common Council, in and by said resolution designated and described the district to be benefitted by said change of grade and to be assessed to pay the cost of the same, and

Whereas said resolution of intention was duly published for ten days in the newspapers of said City, in which official notices of the Common Council of the said City are usually printed and published, to wit: "The San Diego Union and Daily Bee" in every regular issue of said newspaper during the said period of ten days as directed by the said resolution of Intention and in the manner and by the persons required by law and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Streets of said City within five days after the first publication of the said resolution of Intention duly caused notices of the passage of said Resolution of Intention to be conspicuously posted within said district in the manner and form required by law, and

Whereas, more than thirty days have elapsed from the time of the first publication of said Resolution of Intention, in said Newspaper aforesaid, and no objection or objections to said proposed change of grade have been filed with the Clerk of the said Common Council, and no objection has been made to said proposed change

of grade, and

Whereas, a petition of the owners of a majority of the property affected by said proposed change of grade has been duly filed with the Clerk of said Common Council presented to this Common Council as required by law,

Therefore, be it further ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

That the grade of the said Twenty fifth Street at the points herein after described be, and the same is hereby changed and established and declared to be in conformity with said resolution of Intention as follows:

At a point on the West line of Twenty fifth Street One hundred and fifty feet South of the South west Corner of "F" and Twenty fifth Streets, the grade elevation shall be, and is hereby changed from One hundred and seventy-five and twenty-five hundredths feet above the datum line of levels as fixed by Ordinance number three, of the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, entitled "An Ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by Ordinance" Approved on the thirtieth day of June, 1886, to One hundred and seventy-six and seventy-five hundredths feet above said datum line of levels. At a point on the East line of said Twenty fifth Street one hundred and fifty feet South of the South east Corner of "F" and Twenty fifth Streets, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and seventy-five and twenty-five hundredths feet above said datum line of levels to one hundred and seventy-six and seventy-five hundredths feet above said datum line of levels.

At the Northwest Corner of Twenty fifth and "G" Streets to grade elevation shall be and the same is hereby changed from one hundred and seventy-one feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and seventy-two and twenty-five hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Northeast Corner of Twenty fifth and "G" Streets, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and seventy-one feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and seventy-two and twenty-five hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Northeast Corner of twenty fifth and "G" Streets the grade elevation shall be and the same is hereby changed from one hundred and seventy one feet above the said datum line of levels, to one hundred and seventy two and twenty five hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the West line of said Twenty fifth Street, One hundred and fifty feet South of the South West Corner of Twenty fifth and "H" Streets, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and forty two and fifty hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels, to one hundred and forty three and fifty hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At a point on the east line of said Twenty fifth Street, one hundred and fifty feet South of the Southeast Corner of Twenty fifth and "H" Streets, the grade elevation shall be, and is hereby changed from one hundred and forty two and fifty hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and forty three and fifty hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Northwest Corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" Streets—the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and thirty feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and thirty and seventy hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Southwest Corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" Streets, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and twenty-eight feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and twenty-eight and seventy hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Northeast Corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" Streets, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from one hundred and thirty feet above the said datum line of levels to one hundred and thirty and seventy hundredths feet above the said datum line of levels.

At the Southeast Corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" Streets, the grade elevation shall be changed and is hereby changed from one hundred and twenty-eight feet above the said datum line of levels, to one hundred and twenty-eight and seventy hundredths feet above said datum line of levels.

At a point on the west line of the said Twenty-fifth Street, one hundred and fifty feet South of the Southwest Corner of Twenty-fifth and "I" Streets, the grade elevation shall be changed and is hereby changed from one hundred and fifteen feet above the said datum line of levels, to one hundred and sixteen feet above the said datum line of levels.

and established by this Ordinance.

An Ordinance providing for the purchase of fuel oil for the use of the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, California, be, and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and let a Contract for furnishing to the said City of San Diego, Six thousand barrels of crude oil, and Twenty Six Thousand gallons of engine distillate of fifty degrees gravity, provided that the expense of said crude oil shall not exceed the sum of six thousand Dollars, and that the expense of said engine distillate shall not exceed the sum of Twentythree Hundred and Forty Dollars.

An Ordinance to prevent the Keeping and Maintaining of more than three Cows or Cattle within certain portions of the City of San Diego, California.

That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful and a nuisance for any person or persons to keep or cause to be kept more than three Cows or Cattle upon any premises belonging to him or them, or upon any premises over which he or they may have control, in that portion of the City of San Diego, California, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at a point where the Southeastern line of Upas Street, if extended Southwesterly, would intersect the northeasterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego, thence running along the said Southeastern line of Upas Street, first Northeasterly along the said Southeastern line of Upas Street and then easterly along the South line of said Upas Street, to a point where the said South line of Upas Street intersects the West line of the City Park; thence running South along the said West line of the said City Park to a point where the said West line of the said City Park intersects the North line of Carruthers' Addition; thence running east along the said North line of said Carruthers' Addition, thence running South along the east line of said Carruthers' Addition to the South line of the said City Park; Thence running east along the said South line of the said City Park, to a point where the said South line of the said City Park intersects the West line of Twenty fourth Street; thence running South along the said West line of the said Twenty fourth Street to the South line of "N" Street, thence running east along the said South line of said "N" Street to a point where the West line of Twenty Eighth Street, if extended from the Bay of San Diego, Northerly, would intersect the said South line of "N" Street; thence running South along the said West line of Twenty Eighth Street, if so extended, to the northeasterly shore line of the said Bay of San Diego, thence following the meanderings of the said shore line of the said Bay of San Diego; first in a Northwesterly direction, and then in a Northerly direction, and thence in a Northwesterly direction to the point of beginning. Also that portion of the said City

of San Diego known as "La Jolla Park" according to the map thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the said County of San Diego, State of California, on the 22nd day of March, 1887.

Section 2, That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful and a nuisance for any person to keep or cause to be kept more than three cows or cattle within that certain portion of the City of San Diego, California, described in Section One of this Ordinance.

Section 3, That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons in the said City of San Diego, to furnish or allow the premises where cows or cattle are kept by such person or persons to be or become in a condition dangerous to the public health, or offensive to any person or persons residing in the vicinity of such premises; that when such premises are in such condition, the Board of Health of said City shall notify, in writing, such person or persons keeping said cows or cattle to put such premises in a sanitary condition within two days from the service of such notice, and if such person fails to comply with such notice, such failure shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance.

Section 4, That the word "premises" for the purposes of this Ordinance, is hereby defined as any parcel of land that is held, kept, or used, in one body, whether or not the same contains one or more lots or blocks, or parcels of lots or blocks of land.

Section 5, That any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for a period not exceeding twenty-five (25) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Ordinance No. 1503

An Ordinance providing for the purchase, By the City of San Diego, of Certain Lands in Mission Valley in the County of San Diego, California,

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, demands the acquisition by the said City of San Diego, for the purpose of supplying said City of San Diego, and the inhabitants thereof with water, of those certain pieces or parcels of land situated in the County of San Diego, State of California, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Lot numbered thirty-five of the Rancho Mission of San Diego, as shown on the map filed in the office of the County Clerk of the County of San Diego, California, on January 14th, 1886, and marked "Partition of Rancho Mission of San Diego, San Diego Co. California, made under decree of Superior Court dated Jan. 7th, 1885, by Chas J. Fox, C. C., O. H. Borden, M. C. Woodson, referees," and containing one hundred and forty and forty-five hundredths acres.

Also that portion of lot numbered thirty two of the said Rancho Mission of San Diego, as shown by the said map thereof, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Ordinance No 1505.

An Ordinance granting a Telephone franchise to Arthur Wright in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That a franchise in the City of San Diego, California, be and is hereby granted to Arthur Wright, his successors or assigns, to construct, erect, maintain and operate a line or lines of telephone and telegraph wires by means of conduits and poles with wires attached thereto, upon, over, and along the streets and alleys in the said City together with certain appurtenances and incident rights herein after mentioned, upon the terms and conditions herein after mentioned, which franchise, terms, and conditions are more particularly described as follows:

A franchise to erect, maintain, and operate for a term of thirty years, poles and wires with all necessary and auxiliary fixtures, upon, over, and along the streets, alleys, lanes, highways, and public places of the said City of San Diego,

And to transmit sounds, signals, conversation, and intelligence through and over said wires by means of electricity, together with the right to construct, operate and maintain all necessary feeders, surface wires, house connections, and such other apparatus and appliances in connection therewith as may be necessary for the purpose of safely and efficiently operating and maintaining said system of poles, wires, and fixtures, and carrying on a general Telephone, Telegraph, District Messenger and Angular Alarm business by means thereof.

Provided, That the said City of San Diego, reserves the right to purchase for municipal ownership, at a fair valuation, at any time after ten (10) years after granting this franchise, any telephone or telegraph system constructed under this said franchise. Said franchise shall also be granted upon the following terms and conditions, viz:

First: That the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, shall in good faith layout and expend for material and labor used and performed in the construction of said system, the erection of said poles, and in the construction and installation in connection therewith of wires, switch boards and telephone apparatus and appliances, the following sums:

within the periods herein after mentioned, respectively:

Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) within eight months after the grant of said franchise; a further and additional sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) within twelve months after said grant; a further and additional sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) within eighteen months after said grant, and a further and additional sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) within twenty four months after said grant, making a total of one hundred and twenty thousand dollars, (\$120,000.00) to be expended within twenty four months after said grant, exclusive of the cost of any building or real estate.

And it shall be the duty of the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, to file with the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, before or within ten days after the expiration of each of said periods of eight, twelve, eighteen, and twenty-four months after the grant of said franchise, a statement, verified by the oath of said grantee, his successors or assigns, or by the oath of the manager or presiding officer of said grantee, its successors or assigns, showing the sums expended for said material and labor by said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, during the preceding period of eight, twelve, eighteen, or twenty four months, as the case may be, provided, that, if any or all of said sums are expended within a less time than the period above stated, that the filing of such affidavits shall not be delayed until the expiration of said respective periods, but said affidavits shall be filed within ten days after said respective sums have been so expended, provided that at least said respective sums must be expended within the respective periods above named.

And any failure or omission to pay out and expend for said labor and material, the full sum herein before required to be expended within either of the respective periods described or any omission or refusal to file within the time herein prescribed, any of said verified statements, may work a forfeiture of the said franchise, and of all rights thereunder, to the City of San Diego.

Second: That the poles to be erected and maintained under said franchise shall, as to size and height, and as to erection and location, conform to the reasonable rules and regulations of the Street Superintendent of the City of

San Diego, and to the Ordinances of the ^{said} City of San Diego,

Provided, That all poles shall be set in the alleys in blocks which have alleys in all residence parts of the City and through the center of blocks without alleys in the residence parts of the City, where the consent of the property owners therefor can be obtained,

Third, That the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, shall, within thirty days from the date of the Commencement of the operation of said telephone business, furnish to the City of San Diego, twenty-five telephones and connect the same with the telephone system of said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, and thereafter maintain and keep the same in good repair and working order during the term of said franchise without expense or charge to the City of San Diego; and that said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, shall, if required by said City, furnish and allow to it, during the term of said franchise, the free use of four pins in the top cross arm of each of the poles erected and maintained under said franchise during the whole term thereof, for the purpose of carrying or stringing wires used by said City for telegraph, telephone, or police or fire alarm purposes, provided, however, the said City shall in its use and maintenance of its conductors on such cross arms, comply with the reasonable plans and rules of said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, so that there shall be a minimum danger of contact between the said conductors and the wires or cables of the said grantee, his or its successors or assigns,

Fourth; That ^{consent} in the said Council of the City of San Diego, by general Ordinance, applicable to all telephone, telegraph, district messenger, fire alarm, electric light, and other companies of like nature, shall direct that over head wires shall be placed in conduits, it shall be the duty of the grantee of this franchise, his or its successors or assigns, to conform with the regulations and provisions of said ordinance,

Provided, That in the construction of any and all lines under this franchise, all wires shall be placed in conduits under ground in the business sections of the City, as fixed by the Common Council of said City.

Fifth; That all telephone lines constructed or operated under said franchise shall have full metallic circuits.

That the rent or charge for unlimited independent metallic circuit telephone service in the system established or maintained under said franchise, so long as said system does not connect and exchange with more than two thousand (2,000) telephones, shall not exceed fifty-four dollars (\$54.00) per annum for a telephone installed in any business office or premises within a radius of one and one half miles from the intersection of Fifth and "D" Streets, and an additional charge of six dollars (\$6.00) per annum for each additional mile or fraction thereof; or twenty-seven dollars (\$27.00) per annum for a telephone installed in private residence for residence use, within a radius of one and one half miles from the intersection of Fifth and "D" Streets, and for each additional mile or fraction thereof, an additional charge of six dollars (\$6.00) per annum; and that when said system shall comprise more than two thousand (2,000) telephones the annual rent or charge for the aforesaid services shall not be increased by more than a sum equal to six dollars (\$6.00) per annum for each one thousand (1,000) telephones in said City connected with said system in excess of two thousand (2,000).

Sixth: That except as hereinafter provided, said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, shall not, without the consent of the City, evidenced by ordinance, sell or transfer the conduits, poles, wires, and appliances of any kind or description, or sell, lease assign, or transfer any of the rights or privileges therein authorized or granted to any person, company, trust or corporation, now or hereafter engaged in the telephone, telegraph, district messenger, burglar alarm or conduit business, and shall not at any time enter, ^{into} any combination, directly or indirectly, with any person or persons, or any corporations, concerning the rate to be charged for telephone, telegraph, district messenger or burglar alarm services, nor with any officers or officers employees or managers of any conduit, telephone, telegraph, district messenger and burglar alarm system, constructed or being operated in this City; provided, however, that said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, may assign this franchise to a corporation organized by him or them under the laws of the State of California, or some other state of the United States for the purpose of carrying on a general telephone

telegraph, district messenger and burglar alarm business, and of owning, constructing, maintaining, and operating, lines, conduits, cables, wires, and other electrical conductors together with all necessary feeders, service wires and house connections, to be used for the transmission of sounds, signals, and intelligence by the means of electricity, in the City of San Diego: And provided further, that notice of said assignment shall be filed with the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, within sixty days after the execution of said assignment.

Seventh: That the person, partnership or corporation to whom said franchise is granted or awarded, his or its successors or assigns, shall, during the life of said franchise, pay to the City of San Diego, in lawful money of the United States, two per cent. of the gross annual receipts of such grantee, and his or its successors and assigns, arising from the use, operation, or possession of said franchise. No percentage shall be paid for the first five years succeeding the date of the franchise, but thereafter such percentage shall be payable annually.

And it shall be the duty of the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, to file with the said City Clerk of the City of San Diego, at the expiration of six years from the date of granting of said franchise, and at the expiration of each and every year thereafter, a statement, verified by the oath of said grantee, his successors or assigns, or by the oath of the manager or presiding officer of said grantee, or by its successors or assigns, showing the total gross receipts and gross earnings—collected or received, or in any manner gained or derived by the said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, during the preceding twelve months, from telephone, telegraph, district messenger and burglar alarm charges and rentals, and from the leasing or letting of lines or poles or conduits. And within ten days after the time for filing the aforesaid statement, it shall be the duty of said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, to pay to the ^{City} Treasurer of the said City of San Diego, the aggregate sum of the said percentage upon the amount of the gross annual receipts arising from the use, operation or possession of said franchise, determined and computed in the manner herein before provided.

And any neglect, omission or refusal by said grantee, or his, or its successors or assigns, to file said verified statement, or to pay said percentage of the said

gross annual receipts, at the time or in the manner therein before provided, shall work a forfeiture of said franchise, and of all rights thereunder, to the said City of San Diego.

Eighth: That the grant of said franchise, rights, and privileges is subject to the right of the said Common Council to fix a reasonable rate of compensation to be charged and collected by any person, company, or corporation for the use of a telephone or telephones under such franchise, and also subject to all the provisions of the law and Charter of the said City of San Diego, relative to the granting of such franchise, rights, and privileges.

That any neglect, failure or refusal to comply with any of the conditions of said franchise shall thereupon work a forfeiture thereof, and the said City, by its Common Council, may thereupon declare said franchise forfeited, and may exclude said grantee, his or its successors and assigns, from further use of the streets of said City under said franchise.

Ninth: The grant of this franchise is subject to the right of the said Common Council at any time hereafter to repeal, amend, or modify this ordinance.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, he and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City - to wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1506.

An Ordinance prescribing specifications for the oiling of graded streets in the City of San Diego, California.
Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the oiling with crude oil of the graded streets in the City of San Diego, California, shall be hereafter done in accordance with the following specifications, viz:

1. The street to be oiled shall be first brought to its official grade and cross-section.

2. The entire surface of the roadway, between the gutter lines if there be gutters, or between curb lines if there be no gutters, shall be thoroughly moistened with water, and shall then be rolled with a roller weighing not less than two hundred and fifty (250) pounds to the inch width of tire. All depressions must be promptly filled, moistened, and again rolled.

3. The entire surface of the roadway shall be raked free from all stones larger than one (1) inch in greatest diameter.

4. The entire surface between the curb lines or between the gutter lines, as the case may be, which shall have been rendered perfectly smooth and hard by the process above specified, shall then be broken to a depth of not less than two (2) inches, by a fine-tooth harrow, or some similar apparatus, dragged in every direction over it until no part remains untouched.

5. Oil shall then be evenly distributed over the entire surface in a volume equal to, but not exceeding the amount the surface of the street will absorb, in such manner that no oil shall remain on the surface, and the surface shall then be harrowed, with a disc harrow or mixer or rolled with a spike roller, capable of doing work equal to the work done by the Fitzgerald spike roller.

6. After a lapse of not less than twelve (12) hours the surface shall be again harrowed and shall receive a second application of oil. Any part of the roadway upon which a portion of the oil or the residue thereof may be seen, shall then be sprinkled with sufficient sharp sand

to absorb the same, and any portions that appear too dry shall receive a further light application of oil.

7. The roadway shall then be harnomed or rolled with a spike roller, Capable of doing work equal to the work done by the Fitzgerald spike roller, until the oil becomes thoroughly incorporated with the surface material.

8. The entire surface of the roadway shall then receive a light covering of sand, and shall be thoroughly rolled and tamped until no evidence of oil remains except the coloring of the material and until sufficiently compacted to withstand ordinary traffic without rutting.

9. The total amount of oil used shall be as follows:

For the first application, One (1) gallon per square yard of the surface of the roadway oiled.

For the second application one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) gallon per square yard of the surface of the roadway oiled.

10. When accepted the roadway shall be on the official grade and cross-section, having a true and even surface and crown.

11. The oil used shall be of a density between eleven (11) and fourteen (14) degrees (Baume Scale) gravity, asphaltum base, and heated to a temperature of not less than two hundred (200) degrees, Fahrenheit, when being applied.

12. The oil shall not contain more than two (2) per cent of water. The percentage of water shall be determined by a twenty-four (24) hours test of each shipment of oil delivered, and the necessary deduction for all water contained in the oil in excess of two (2) per cent shall be made.

13. The Contractor shall notify the Superintendent of Streets of the arrival of the oil, that the necessary tests may be made, and no oil shall be used until it has been tested as hereinbefore provided for.

14. The Contractor shall furnish all labor, material and appliances necessary for the prosecution of the work to completion in a thorough and workmanlike manner.

15. Bids shall state the price per barrel (42) gallons of oil applied on the roadway, according to the method prescribed in these specifications, and the price per barrel so bid shall include the cost of sprinkling, rolling, tamping, sanding—

and harrowing as required in these specifications, and all labor and material, and all expenses direct or indirect, connected with the proper execution of the work, and of maintaining it in perfect condition until it shall have been finally accepted by the Superintendent of Streets.

16. The Contractor shall, when required to do so by the said Superintendent of Streets, remove from the work any overseer, Superintendent, laborer, or other person employed in the work, who shall refuse or neglect to obey the said Superintendent of Streets in any way relating to the work, or who shall perform his work in a manner contrary to these specifications, or who shall be found to be incompetent or unfaithful.

17. All loss or damage arising from the nature of the work to be done under these specifications, during the progress of the work, and before the acceptance thereof, or from any act or omission on the part of the Contractor, or any agent or person employed by him, occurring in the course of the work, not authorized by these specifications, shall be sustained and borne by the Contractor.

18. No work which may be defective in its construction or deficient in any of the requirements of these specifications will be considered as accepted in consequence of the failure of any officer of the City or Inspector connected with the work, to point out said defects or deficiency during construction, and the Contractor shall be required to correct any imperfect work whenever discovered, before the final acceptance of the work.

19. The Contractor shall erect and keep erected, by day and night, a fence or proper barrier along the line of the work and across the ends of same, in order to prevent travel over that portion of the street upon which operations, incident to the carrying on of the work herein contemplated, are being carried on, and he shall post all proper notices and signals to the public of the state of the street while the work is in progress.

20. No more than two (2) consecutive blocks, and no more than one cross street, shall be closed at any one time.

21. The Contractor shall maintain a red light at night at each end of the barriers, from sunset until sunrise.

22. The Contractor shall remove all surplus material and rubbish from the work after its completion, and before he makes application for the acceptance of the work.

23. All the work herein provided for must in all cases be done under the direction and to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Streets, and the materials used shall comply with the specifications herein contained, and be to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Streets. No materials of any kind shall be used until they have been examined and approved by the said Superintendent of Streets, who shall have full power to condemn any work or material not in accordance with these specifications, and to require the Contractor to immediately remove any work or material so condemned, and the Contractor, at his own expense, shall replace said work or materials to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Streets. The decision of the said Superintendent of Streets shall be final as to the quality of the work and materials used, unless the Common Council shall determine otherwise upon an appeal.

24. The Contractor shall notify the said Superintendent of Streets when he desires a final inspection of the work, when the latter shall as soon as possible, make the necessary examination, and if the work is found to be in compliance with the above specifications, the said Superintendent of Streets shall furnish the Contractor with a certificate to that effect.

25. Whenever the word "Contractor" is used in these specifications, it shall be understood to refer to the party or parties to whom the Contract has been awarded for the construction of the work herein specified.

26. Whenever the words "Superintendent of Streets" are used in these specifications, they shall be understood to refer to the Superintendent of Streets of the City of San Diego, California.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and

approval.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published—once in the City official newspapers of said City, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Ordinance No. 1507.

An Ordinance providing for the oiling of certain streets, avenues, and boulevards in the City of San Diego, California.

Whereas, John H. Gay has made to the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, a proposition in writing, dated on the 6th day of February, 1904, to furnish crude oil for oiling those certain streets, avenues, and boulevards, hereinafter described; provided, that the same shall be prepared and put in good condition for receiving such oil, and said oil shall be put thereon by the said City of San Diego, said work to be completed by May first, 1904, and

Whereas, the said Common Council is desirous of accepting said proposition and providing for the doing of said work.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the offer of the said John H. Gay, to furnish crude oil for oiling those certain streets, avenues, and boulevards in the City of San Diego, California, hereinafter described, be and the same is hereby accepted, which streets, avenues, and boulevards are described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the south line of the intersection of "D" Street with Sixth Street, thence running north along Sixth Street to the south line of the Fourteen Hundred - Acre Public Park; thence running along the boulevard now being graded by the Chamber of Commerce of said City through said Park to a point where the east end of Upas Street terminates at the west line of said Park; thence running west along Upas Street to Fifth Street; thence running north along Fifth Street to University Avenue; thence running east along University Avenue to University boulevard; thence running northeast along University boulevard to the north end of the intersection of University boulevard and Park boulevard; thence running south along Park boulevard to the north line of the Fourteen Hundred - Acre Public Park; thence running through the said Fourteen Hundred - Acre Public Park along the boulevard to be graded by the said Chamber of Commerce, to a point where the north end of Twelfth Street terminates, at the south

line of said Park; provided, that said streets, avenues, and boulevards shall be put in good condition to receive said Oil, ^{and said Oil} put upon said streets without any expense to the said John St. Gay, other than furnishing said Oil.

That the Board of Public Works of the said City of San Diego, be and it is hereby authorized and directed to put all of said streets, avenues, and boulevards (except that portion thereof inside of said Public Park) in good condition to receive said Oil, and to also place said crude oil upon said streets, avenues, and boulevards outside of the said Public Park, when the same shall have been put in good condition therefor. The said work of putting said Oil on said streets, avenues, and boulevards, and the preparing of the said streets, avenues, and boulevards (outside of the Public Park) to be done with the street force of said City. That that portion of said streets, avenues, and boulevards outside of said Public Park, to be prepared for said Oil, shall be at least twenty four feet in width, except the said Fifth Street shall be oiled from curb line, to curb line, except that portion thereof required by law to be kept in order or repair by any railroad Company having railroad tracks thereon. Said work to be done according to specifications to be prepared by the said Board of Public Works.

The Park Committee of the said Chamber of Commerce having agreed to put said boulevards in said Public Park in condition to receive said Oil, and to put said Oil on the same; said work shall be done by the said Park Committee without any expense to the said City of San Diego.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance providing for the construction of certain bridges on "D" Street in the City of San Diego, California,

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1, of Ordinance No. 294, of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, California, entitled "An Ordinance in relation to dogs and licensing the same", approved February 23rd, 1895, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1, That it be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person owning or having Control of any dog to suffer, allow, or permit the same to run at large upon any street, lane, alley, park, or other public place within that portion of the corporate limits of the City of San Diego, California, herein after described, who permit, or allow any dog to be kept or to remain upon any premises under his immediate Control within that portion of the said City of San Diego, California, described as follows, to wit;

Commencing at a point where the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego, intersects the south line of Ginece Street, thence running first northeasterly and then easterly along the said south line of Ginece Street to the west line of the City Park; thence running south along the said west line of the said City Park to the north line of Caruthers Addition; thence running east on the north line of Caruthers Addition to the northeast corner of the said Caruthers Addition; thence running south on the east line of said Caruthers Addition to the south line of the said City Park; thence running east on the south line of the said City Park to the west line of Thirty-first street; thence running south on the west line of the said Thirty first Street to a point where the said west line of the said Thirty first Street, if extended, southwesterly, would intersect the westerly shore line of the said Bay of San Diego; thence following the meanderings of the said shore line of the said Bay of San Diego, first in a northwesterly direction, thence in a northerly direction to the place of beginning, unless an annual license tax of one dollar (\$1.00) for a male dog and three dollars (\$3.00) for a female dog for each current year, or fractional part thereof,

(if either said male dog or female dog shall not be in the said portion of the said City of San Diego, for one full year) be so paid; and unless such dog has around its neck a collar having attached thereto a metallic tag or plate, issued by the Tax Collector of said City, having thereon the number of the license issued for said dog and figures indicating the year for which said license has been paid. Such annual license tax so paid shall expire on the 31st day of December of each year.

That it shall be the duty of any and all persons owning or harboring said dog or dogs in said-described limits to keep the same in such manner that the peace and quiet of the neighborhood and traveling public shall not be disturbed. That any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for a period not exceeding (5) days, or shall suffer both such fine and imprisonment.

4. Water Closets in private residences, 25 Cents per month for each water closet,
5. Water Closets, public, \$2.00 each per month, and for each urinal, 50 Cents per month,
6. Barber shops, single Chair, 75 cents per month; each additional Chair, 25 Cents per month,
7. Business offices, 75 Cents per month,
8. Rooms in second and third stories occupied as offices, for each room, per month, 20 Cents,
9. Rental rooms, \$2.00 per month
10. Drug Stores, \$3.00 per month,
11. Photograph galleries, \$5.00 per month,
12. Stores and business houses employing not to exceed three persons, \$1.00 per month, and for each additional person, 15 Cents per month,
13. Warehouses, \$3.00 per month,
14. Dwellings, tenements, flats, and other apartments, the same being occupied by not more than three persons, \$1.00 per month, and for each additional person, 15 Cents per month,
15. Boarding houses, in addition to family rates 15 Cents per month for each person,
16. Coffee houses, open and night, \$3.50 per month,
17. Hotels, in addition to family rates, 15 Cents per

month for each bed.

The Keepers of hotels, lodging houses, and boarding-houses shall furnish to the Board of Public Works of said City (under Oath if required) a correct list of the number of persons in his or their families, and the number of Lodgers.

18. Lodging houses, in addition to family rates, 10 cents per month for each bed.

19. Restaurants and eating houses, \$3.50 per month.

20. Saloons \$3.50 per month.

21. For water to be used for irrigating one half acre and under one acre, 10 cents per 1000 gallons; for one acre and under two acres, 8 cents per 1000 gallons; for two acres or more 6 cents per one 1000 gallons; to be measured by meter to be placed at the expense of the party to whom the water is furnished; such acreage to include town lots where there is sufficient number of lots in one body or tract collectively, to make one half acre or more; provided, that where meter rates are charged for irrigating under this section, no extra charge shall be made for domestic, family or household use; and provided further, that the rates herein specified shall apply only to the irrigation of lands, cultivated for the purpose of making a profit or livelihood, and not to irrigation for ornamental purposes; provided, further, that no person, Company, or Corporation shall be entitled to the above rates for irrigation unless the above quantities of land are actually being cultivated, and irrigated; provided, also, that the rate for water furnished for the irrigation of Cemeteries shall be six cents per 1000 gallons.

22. Irrigation of lawns, trees, shrubbery, etc, 1 cent per month for each and every month in the year, for every front foot, including the irrigation of a side walk in front of the lot, provided, that said rate of 1 cent per month for every front foot shall not apply to acre property, or to any property except to town lots.

And provided further, that said rate of 1 cent per month for every front foot shall not apply to acreage property, or to any property except to town lots not considered acreage.

23. Feed yards, \$5.00 per month.

24. Horse and Carriage, 35 cents per month, and

20 Cents per month for each additional horse.

25. Livery stables, including carriage washing, for each horse, 35 Cents per month.

26. Horses, mules, and cows, each 20 Cents per month.

27. The rate for water furnished to consumers, through meters, except as otherwise herein provided, is fixed as follows: 20 Cents per 1000 gallons.

28. Where water is furnished for steam engines, gas-machines or works wash-houses (Chinese or otherwise) or for any other purpose whatever, and no compensation is herein fixed therefor, and satisfactory rates cannot be agreed upon, meter rates shall be charged for the water so furnished, to be measured by a meter.

The said City shall be entitled to collect a minimum rate of \$1.00 per month where water is furnished, at meter rates, and an additional minimum sum of 25 Cents for each additional house, whether occupied or not, and each flat, whether occupied or not, supplied with water through the same meter.

Provided, that such minimum charge shall entitle the consumer to use no more than 5000 gallons per month for one house or flat, and 1250 gallons more for each additional house or flat.

That said City shall be entitled to collect a minimum meter rate of \$1.00 per month where water is furnished at meter rates for each meter supplying any business block or business building, and 25 cents for each additional ground floor store or business room or place, in any business block or business building, supplied from the same meter, whether occupied or not. Provided that such minimum charge shall entitle the consumer to use no more than 5000 gallons per month, for one business block, and 1250 gallons more for each additional store or business room.

29. Water shall be furnished and delivered by meter measurement to shipping lying alongside of any of the wharves on the water front, where water pipes or mains are laid, upon application being made therefor, at the following rates: 50 Cents per 1000 gallons. Water shall be supplied and delivered to water supply boats at any of the wharves on the water front above mentioned, for the purpose of supplying and shipping in the bay of San Diego, upon application being made therefor, at the rate of 50 cents per 1000 gallons.

No Water boat furnishing and supplying water to the shipping lying at anchor within the limits of the waters of the City of San Diego, shall charge a rate to exceed \$3.00 per 1000 gallons.

30. Bakeries, for each 25 barrels of flour, \$2.00 per month,

31. Water for hydraulic elevators and motors in hotels and stores, 10 cents per 1000 gallons, to be measured by a meter.

32. The regular Charge for making and placing taps and laying pipe shall be made for any taps placed or pipe laid or connected with the mains for fire apparatus, which shall be used only in case of fire, but no other charge shall be made for such fire apparatus if used only in case of fire; provided, that if any person shall at any time use such fire apparatus for other than fire purposes, the said Board of Public Works shall have the right to charge and collect from such person the sum of \$50.00 for such fire apparatus connection for said year.

33. Horseshoeing only, \$1.50 per month,

34. Soda fountains, 50 cents per month each; — each jet, 50 cents per month; each tumbler washer, 50 cents per month,

35. Persons slackening lime, 15 cents per barrel; and Cement, 10 cents per barrel; for wetting brick, 15 cents per 1000.

36. Wagon and blacksmith shops, including horse-shoeing, \$2.50 per month,

37. Breweries, ice manufacturing plants, and cold-storage plants, 12 cents per 1000 gallons.

38. That water furnished to all charitable institutions, such as "The Helping Hand" "Knights Daughters Boating Club" "Seaman's Rest" and "Children's Home" shall be \$1.00 per annum; provided, that if water is wasted by any such institution, meter rates shall thereafter be charged. Provided, that this provision shall not apply to hospitals and sanitariums.

39. Parks on private land, but open to the public and maintained by private subscriptions, such as the "H" Street Park "K" Street Park" and "Park" at South west corner of Twenty-second and "K" Streets, 10-cents per 1000 gallons.

40. Public Schools of the San Diego School District

and the "Academy of our Lady of Peace", 10 cents per 1000 gallons.

Section 2. Any water rate payer shall have the right to demand a meter and pay a meter rate upon tendering the said Board of Public Works the sum of \$5.00 for placing and connecting the meter with the supply pipe of such water rate payer; upon such demand or payment or the tender of such sum by any water rate payer, it shall be the duty of the said Board of Public Works to furnish, place, and maintain a meter; provided, that the said charge of five dollars shall not apply to any meter the supply pipe of which exceeds three quarters of an inch in diameter, and that if a larger meter is demanded by any water rate payer, under any provisions of this Ordinance, such water rate payer shall pay to the said Board of Public Works, for the purpose of placing, connecting, and maintaining such meter, a sum equal to the cost of the meter demanded; provided that any rate payer who has heretofore paid for placing and maintaining a meter shall not be obliged to pay an additional sum therefor.

The said Board of Public Works shall have the right at any time to place a meter on the service pipe of any water consumer and charge meter rates for water used through it; provided, that such meter shall be placed and maintained at the expense of the said City.

Upon the demand of any consumer and the payment or tender of payment of the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) the said Board of Public Works shall place and maintain on the said consumer's supply pipe an air valve, in connection with the meter, of the latest and most improved pattern.

Section 3. That all flat rate payers must pay their water bills for the current month on or before the 20th day of each month; that all meter rate payers shall pay their water bills on or before the 20th day of each month for water furnished for the preceding month, and unless so paid, an additional sum of five per cent (5%) shall be added thereto; that the said Board of Public Works be and said Board of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to shut off the water from the premises

unless such bills are so paid; And not to turn the same on again until the payment of all arrears and amounts due, and the sum of one dollar for turning on the water; that no water tap or service pipe connected with said system of water works shall be placed nearer than two feet from any sewer pipe ditch in said City.

Section 4. Any employee of the Water Department of said City, when directed by the said Board of Public Works, under this Ordinance, shall be allowed free access to make personal examination of the premises of any applicant for or consumer of water for the purpose of designating the rate established and for the inspection of water pipes and apparatus.

Section 5. When water is furnished by meter the meter shall be read at monthly intervals, or as near monthly intervals as the ordinary course of business will permit.

Section 6. That all water rates shall be paid by the owners of the property upon which water is used, or upon a written guaranty to be signed by the owner of the property, that the water furnished upon said property shall be paid for at the rates fixed by this ordinance; that in the event that the owner of the property refuses to agree to pay for the water and refuses to execute such guaranty, then the said Board of Public Works shall have the right to demand, as security for the payment of the monthly water bills when the same is not paid in advance, a sum sufficient to pay the water bill for water used on said property for any month during the year.

Section 7. That this Ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 8. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, be and he is hereby authorized and directed immediately after the approval of this ordinance to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

An Ordinance granting certain privileges to Charles E. Sumner,

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby granted to Charles E. Sumner, and to his successors or assigns, the right and privilege to lay down gas pipes and conduits in the public streets and thorough fares, of the City of San Diego, in the County of San Diego, State of California, and to make, connection with such pipes and conduits, so far as may be necessary or convenient for introducing into and supplying such City and its inhabitants with gas or other illuminating agent, for the purposes of artificial lighting and for fuel and power purposes, and to repair and maintain such pipes and conduits and the necessary appurtenances to the same.

Section 2. There is also granted to the said Charles E. Sumner and to his successors or assigns, the right and privilege to construct and maintain, under and along the public thorough fares, roads, streets, lanes and alleys, of the said City of San Diego, underground conduits for the purpose of containing wires, and to erect and maintain poles and to string wires thereon, for supplying such City and the inhabitants thereof with electric light and electricity, for such other beneficial uses as may be desired by the said City, or any of its inhabitants.

Section 3. The rights and privileges hereby granted shall be exercised under and subject to the general ordinances and regulations now in force, concerning the laying and maintenance of pipes, and the erection and maintenance of poles and stringing wires thereon in the streets of said City; in so far as such ordinances and regulations apply to the construction, maintenance and operation of gas and electric light system in the said City of San Diego, Provided that such pipes and conduits shall be laid and constructed according to such reasonable rules and regulations as may be provided by the Street Superintendent of the City of San Diego, and provided further that all the poles to be erected and maintained under this franchise, shall as to size and height, and as to erection and location

Conform to the reasonable rules and regulations of the Street Superintendent of the said City of San Diego, and to the Ordinances of said City of San Diego.

Section 4. That the grantee herein, his successors or assigns, shall not assign, sell or transfer any of the rights and privileges herein authorized or granted to any person, Company, trust, or Corporation now or hereafter engaged in the business of selling light, heat, and power, except that notice of said assignment, sale or transfer shall be filed with the City Clerk of said City of San Diego, within five days after the execution of said assignment, sale or transfer, and said notice, after being so filed, with said City Clerk, shall be constructive notice of said assignment, sale and transfer.

Section 5. That the maximum amount which the grantee of this franchise, his successors or assigns, shall charge for illuminating gas shall be the sum of \$1.50, per 1000 Cubic feet.

Section 6. The Common Council of the City of San Diego, reserves the right to repeal, amend, or modify this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance declaring the Grade of "A" Street in the City of San Diego, California, at the Southeast Corner of "A" Street and Second Street to be changed, and establishing the grade of the same at said point.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, on the 18th day of January, 1904, duly passed and adopted a resolution of Intention to Change and establish the grade of that portion of "A" Street in the City of San Diego, California, at the Southeast Corner of the intersection of the said "A" Street with Second Street and,

Whereas, the said resolution of Intention was approved by the Mayor of said City on the 19th day of January, 1904, which resolution described the proposed Change of grade; and

Whereas, the said Common Council in and by said resolution designated and described the district to be benefitted by said Change of grade, and to be assessed to pay the Cost of the same; and

Whereas, said resolution of Intention was duly published for ten days in the newspaper of said City in which the official notices of the Common Council of said City are usually printed and published, to-wit, the San Diego Union and Daily Bee, in every regular issue of said newspaper, during said period of ten days, as directed by said resolution of Intention, and in the manner and by the persons required by law, and

Whereas, more than thirty days have elapsed from the time of the first publication of said resolution of Intention, in said newspaper as aforesaid, and no objection or objections to said proposed Change of grade have been filed with the Clerk of the said Common Council, and no objection has been made to said proposed Change of grade; and

Whereas, the petition of the owners of a majority of the property affected by the said proposed Change of grade has been duly filed with the Clerk of the said Common Council, and presented to this Common Council as required by law,

Therefore, Be It further Ordained by the Common Council of the said City of San Diego, that the grade of the said "A" Street at the Southeast Corner of the intersection of "A" Street and Second Street, be and the same is hereby changed and established and declared, to be in conformity with the said resolution of intention as follows:

At a point where the east line of Second Street intersects the south line of "A" Street, the grade elevation shall be and is hereby changed from fifty-three feet above the datum line of levels as fixed by ordinance No. 3, of the Ordinances of the said City of San Diego, entitled "An Ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by Ordinance" approved on the 30th day of June, 1886, to fifty-five feet above said datum line of levels.

That the grade of all points heretofore fixed by the ordinances of said City shall be and remain as they now are on the said "A" Street, except as herein changed.

That there shall be a uniform ascent and descent between all points at which the grade elevations have been or are hereby established on the said "A" Street; provided, that the center line of the said "A" Street shall have an average elevation of the opposite curb grades.

Ordinance No. 1541.

An Ordinance imposing Municipal Licenses in the City of San Diego, California, and providing the manner of issuing and collecting the same, Regulating the manufacture, sale, and giving away Intoxicating Liquors in said City, Prescribing the Duties of Certain officers of said City, and fixing a penalty for its violation.

Be It Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to keep a saloon, bar, bar-room, tippling house, dram shop, store or other place where any spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors are manufactured, sold, or given away, or to manufacture, sell, or give away any such spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors, without first having obtained a license therefor, as provided ^{Provided that this Ordinance} in this ordinance. ~~Provided that this Ordinance~~ shall not apply to the sale of liquors by the owners and proprietors of drug stores, or by their registered assistants, upon the prescription of a regular practicing physician, or for medical and mechanical purposes.

Section 2. That the City Auditor shall issue all licenses provided for by this Ordinance; but no license shall be issued except upon Consent of the Common Council made and entered upon the minutes, nor without the payment of the amount hereinafter required to be paid therefor.

Section 3. Said license shall be substantially in the following form.

Section 4. All licenses shall be signed by the Auditor and the amount to be paid therefor, shall be paid to the City Tax Collector, and his receipt therefor endorsed thereon before the delivery thereof.

Section 5. No license shall be ordered issued by the Common Council except upon a petition from the applicant therefor, signed by five respectable tax

payers of said City, residing or doing business in the immediate vicinity where said liquors are to be sold, and stating that the applicant is a sober and suitable person to keep and conduct said place of business, and describing the place where such business is to be carried on. That all such petitions for said license shall be accompanied by the amount of money required by this Ordinance as the rate to be paid therefor, and no petition shall be presented to the Common Council unless ^{the} required amount of money has been deposited with the City Clerk before said petition is presented to the Common Council. Should said license be refused, the amount so deposited shall be returned to the applicant. Upon the presentation of such application for a license, said Common Council shall fully investigate the question of whether the person making such application is a sober, suitable or proper person to carry on and conduct the business for which he requests a license, and whether the place described in said application is a proper or suitable place for such business. Unless it shall appear to the satisfaction of said Common Council that the applicant for such license is a sober and suitable and proper person to carry on and conduct such business, and that such place is a proper and suitable place for such business, said application shall be denied; and said Common Council shall have the absolute power to deny said application for any other reason which it may deem sufficient. Said Common Council shall also have the power, for cause, to revoke at any time, any license granted or issued under the provisions of this Ordinance; and in case of such revocation, the City Clerk shall give notice thereof, stating the cause, to the person whose license has been revoked. All licenses herein provided for shall be due and payable on the 10th day of each month, and in advance, at the office of the Tax Collector of said City, as herein before provided. That said Tax Collector must, on the 12th day of each month, furnish to the Chief of Police of said City a complete list of all persons to whom licenses have been issued for the preceding month, with the place of business of such persons who may have not paid the license required to be paid on the 10th day of each month, as herein provided. And in addition to all other duties, imposed by this Ordinance on said Chief of Police, he shall visit immediately the places of the persons

named in the list furnished him by said Tax Collector and arrest the person or persons found at said place selling or giving away any ~~any~~ spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquor without the license required by this Ordinance.

Section 6. The rate of license shall be as follows:
First - For every hotel, restaurant, or eating house where wines, ale, or beer, but not distilled liquors, are sold or furnished, with and as a part of bona fide meals, and where no bar is kept, and no wine, ale or beer is sold, furnished, or given away, except with bona fide meals, the sum of \$25.00 per month.

Second - For every place of business where said liquors or any of them are sold at wholesale, in quantities of not less than one fifth of a gallon at a time, the sum of \$25.00 per month.

Third - For every distillery, brewery, or place where spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors are manufactured, the sum of \$25.00 per month.

Fourth. For every saloon, bar, bar-room, tippling house, or any other place where any wine, ale, or beer, or any other spirituous, vinous, malt, or intoxicating liquors are to be sold in quantities of less than one fifth of a gallon at a time, or to be drunk on the premises where sold, except the place mentioned in subdivision I of this section, the sum of \$50.00 per month or \$10.00 per day.

Provided, that no person, holding a license to carry on and conduct the business of a retail liquor dealer, shall be required to take out an additional license to carry on and conduct the business of a ^{wholesale} ~~retail~~ liquor dealer, (~~shall be required to take out an additional license to carry on and conduct the business of a wholesale liquor dealer~~) at the same place.

Section 7. That every place where spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors are sold or given away, under the provisions of this Ordinance, except restaurants, hotels, eating houses, and drug stores, shall close at 12 O'clock and 5 minutes A.M. of each day, and not reopen until five O'clock A.M. of the same day. And it shall be unlawful for any person to sell, furnish or give away any such spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors, in such places, during the time such places are hereby required to be closed.

And every such place, excepting wholesale liquor establishments, which do not sell liquors at retail, and the bar and sideboard of every wholesale liquor establishment which does sell liquor at retail, shall be and remain closed on the day of every election held within the said City of San Diego, except school elections.

Section 8. That every owner, keeper, and proprietor, of every saloon, bar, bar-room, or any other place where intoxicating liquors are kept for sale at retail in said City, except restaurants, hotels, and eating houses, shall so arrange, keep and maintain, between the hours of twelve O'clock and five minutes, A.M., and five O'clock, A.M., of every day, in that portion of said place fronting upon the street, a space of at least twelve inches square not less than five feet nor more than six feet above the sidewalk, through which persons, walking along the sidewalk in front thereof, can plainly see the bar and the place where such liquors are sold.

Section 9. That no person engaged in selling spirits, malt, or fermented liquors in quantities less than one fifth of a gallon in any bar room or saloon in the City of San Diego, California, shall sell any liquors to be delivered or used, or that shall be delivered or used in any side room, back room, upper room, or other apartment in the same or any adjoining building. Connected or used with such bar room or saloon, excepting only alcoves or booths, without doors, curtains or other obstructions to the view, forming a part of such bar room or saloon, the entrance to and inside of which said alcoves and booths shall be within plain view from the bar of such bar room or saloon; or shall have or maintain any private or separate entrance for any particular class of customers, or shall have or maintain any place of entrance to or exit from such booths or alcoves except from the main apartment of such bar room or saloon; or shall have or maintain a private entrance to any apartment used in connection with said bar room or saloon; or shall have or maintain any place of entrance or exit, except place of entrance or exit opening into the main apartment of such bar room or saloon; or any words or signs upon any entrance signifying that such entrance is for ladies -

or families, or for any particular class of persons, or is a private entrance to such bar-room or saloon, or to any other apartment used in connection therewith; provided that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the maintenance of a place of entrance to any water closet, which said place of entrance shall not be used as a private entrance to any bar-room or saloon; and that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the serving of such liquors to guests in a hotel having a valid license to sell the same, provided, however, no restaurant shall have a bar, bar-room or saloon connected therewith. Nor shall the person keeping any restaurant sell or give away any liquors of any kind, other than wine, ale, or beer.

Section 10. That no person engaged in selling, wine, ale, or beer, or any other spirituous, vinous, malt, or other intoxicating liquors, in quantities less than one fifth of a gallon, in any restaurant in said City of San Diego, shall sell any such liquors to be delivered or used, or that shall be delivered or used in any side room, back-room, upper-room, or other apartment in the same or any adjoining building connected or used with such restaurant, excepting only alcoves or booths, without doors, curtains, or other obstructions to the view.

Section 11. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons engaged in the business of selling liquors under the provisions of this ordinance to conduct or engage in or permit any one else to conduct or engage in any banking game or any game of percentage, skill or chance, for money or any substitute for money within the room or place described in his or their liquor license; provided, that this provision shall not apply to shaking dice for cigars or drinks, or to harbor, admit, receive, or permit to be or remain within such room or place any known lewd or dissolute female or any common prostitute, Indian, minor or common drunkard.

Section 12. It shall be unlawful for any physician or person claiming to be a physician to give a prescription to a druggist, or any other person, for any intoxicating liquors, except for medical purposes, and in cases of necessity, or to give any such prescription for the purpose of evading or assisting to evade the provisions of this

Ordinance.

Section 13. No license issued under this ordinance shall be assigned or transferred, except by permission of the Common Council, and any person other than the licensee doing business under any license without the permission of the Common Council first obtained, shall be guilty of a violation of this Ordinance.

Section 14. Upon the conviction of any person for a violation of this Ordinance, a certified copy of the judgment of conviction shall be filed with the said City Auditor, and the license of such person shall then and there stand and be revoked, and the said City Auditor shall not again issue a license to the person so convicted and whose license shall have been so revoked, until authorized to do so by a two thirds vote of all the members of each board of said Common Council.

Section 15. That it is hereby made the duty of the City Tax Collector to collect all licenses provided for by this ordinance. He shall receipt for all moneys received for each license on the back ^{thereof} and shall return under oath, on the first day of each month the amount collected by him for the preceding month, and shall pay the same to the City Treasurer.

Section 16. It is made the duty of the Chief of Police to see that all the keepers of the places of business named in section 7 of this ordinance close their places of business and keep them closed ^{as} in said section provided, and to forthwith arrest any person whose place of business shall be or remain open during said time, and to cause complaint to be filed against him, and to see that every requirement of this ordinance is fully complied with.

Section 17. Prosecutions under this Ordinance may be in the name of the People of the State of California, and it is hereby made the duty of the City Attorney to prosecute all cases arising under this Ordinance.

Section 18. That any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment in the City jail of said City for a period not exceeding one hundred and fifty (150) days, or

by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 19. That Ordinance No. 19, approved August 10th, 1889, and Ordinance No. 64, approved February 25th 1890, and Ordinance No. 307, approved July 31st 1895, and Ordinance No. 443, approved June 24th, 1897, and Ordinance No. 741, approved April 24th, 1900, and all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

Section 20. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty days after its passage and approval.

An Ordinance prescribing specifications for the construction of sidewalks over excavations in the City of San Diego, California.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California,
as follows:

Section 1. That all sidewalks to be constructed over excavations in the City of San Diego, California, shall be hereafter constructed in accordance with the following specifications, viz:-

1. The construction of sidewalks over cellars or vaults, shall comprise the erection of a sufficient concrete, natural stone or brick wall, with brick, concrete or natural stone arches between steel "I" beams, to retain the roadway of the street; the side end wall of the building fronting the cellar or vault shall extend under the sidewalk to the outside retaining wall, whether said material shall be of brick, natural stone or concrete shall be determined by the Resolution of Intention.
2. The height of the area retaining or embankment walls shall be computed from the top of the ground, which they are built to retain, and shall not be less than seventeen (17) inches thick for the first four (4) feet below the ground, and the thickness of such wall shall be increased four (4) inches in thickness for every additional four (4) feet in depth.
3. Embankment or retaining walls which do not have sidewalks or buildings to support must be twelve (12) inches in thickness.
4. No wooden bulkhead shall be erected, constructed or used except where it is necessary to retain the soil in making excavation for the purpose of construction.
5. All works supporting the sidewalk shall rest upon and be of incombustible material, as hereinafter more particularly specified.
6. All openings in sidewalks for the admission of coal or light, or for manholes, or for any other purpose, if placed outside the property line, shall be covered with lens lights set in iron or cement frames or with iron covers having a rough surface, and rabbeted flush with the sidewalk.
7. No plane or surface of glass or iron more than four (4) inches in diameter shall be placed in any sidewalk.
8. All cement used on this work shall be hydraulic cement.
9. All cement will be inspected, and that rejected shall be immediately removed by the contractor. The contractor must submit the cement and afford every facility for inspection and testing before it is used.
10. No cement will be inspected or allowed to be used unless delivered in tight, paper lined barrels or packages, properly branded. The contractor shall provide a suitable place for storing the cement. Accepted cement, if not used immediately, must be thoroughly protected from the weather.
11. The acceptance of any cement will be based upon the requirements hereinafter mentioned.
12. Tests of the cement will, unless otherwise specified, be made at a temperature

of from sixty (60) to seventy (70) degrees Farenheit.

13. Samples for tests may be taken from any and every package in each shipment of cement and unless they meet the requirements herein specified the whole shipment from which the samples were taken will be rejected.

14. The sieves used for testing cement for fineness and for guaging the sand to be used in making briquettes for tests shall be as follows:

No. 20 seive shall have four hundred (400) meshes to the square inch and shall be made of wire cloth, No. 28 wire, Stubb's guage.

No. 30 sieve shall have nine hundred (900) meshes to the square inch and shall be made of wire cloth, No. 31 wire, Stubb's guage.

No. 50 sieve shall have two thousand five hundred (2500) meshes to the square inch and shall be made of wire cloth, No. 35 wire, Stubb's guage.

No. 100 sieve shall have ten thousand (10,000) meshes to the square inch and shall be made of wire cloth, No. 40 wire, Stubb's guage.

15. Briquettes for testing the tensile strength of cement will be made both of neat cement and cement and sand in the proportions hereinafter specified, with only enough water added to thoroughly moisten the mixture and make it coherent.

16. After being thoroughly mixed on a glass plate the mortar shall be firmly pressed into the moulds by hand, and the briquettes so formed placed upon a glass plate and kept there until put in water.

17. The sand used in preparing briquettes shall be, unless otherwise specified, clean, sharp, crushed quartz, crushed so that the whole of it will pass through a No. 20 sieve and be retained on a No. 30 sieve.

18. Round pats of neat cement about three (3) inches in diameter, one-half (1/2) of an inch at the center and tapering to a feather edge, mixed in the same manner as the neat cemeny briquettes and placed on a glass plate, shall not show any signs of warping or cracking after twenty-eight days in either air or water.

19. Any cement which shows signs of swelling, after being mixed, will be rejected.

20. Portland cement shall be ground to such a degree of fineness that not less than ninety-eight (98) per cent by weight will pass a No. 50 sieve, and not less than ninety (90) per cent by weight will pass a No. 100 sieve.

21. The ultimate strength of briquettes, one square inch in cross-section made of neat Portland cement, shall be as follows:

One (1) day in air and six (6) days in water, three hundred seventy-five (375) pounds.

One (1) day in air and twenty-seven (27) days in water, five hundred ten (510) pounds.

22. The ultimate tensile strength of briquettes one (1) square inch in cross-section made of one (1) part by weight of Portland cement and three (3) parts of sand shall be as follows:

One (1) day in air and six (6) days in water, one hundred twenty (120) pounds.

One (1) day in air and twenty-seven days in water, one hundred ninety (190) pounds.

23. All steel used shall be that manufactured by the open-hearth process, and the amount of phosphorous shall never exceed eight one-hundredths (8-100) Of one per cent of an

ultimate tensile strength of 64,000 pounds per square inch.

24. All test pieces must have a tensile strength within four thousand (4000) pounds per square inch of that specified; and for medium steel an elastic limit not less than one-half of the tensile strength of the test bar, a percentage of elongation not less than 1,500,000 divided by the tensile strength in pounds per square inch, and a percentage of reduction of area not less than 3,000,600 divided by the tensile strength in pounds per square inch. In determining the ductility, the elongation shall be measured after breaking on an original length of eight (8) inches, in which length must occur the curve of reduction from stretch on both sides of the point of fracture.

25. All broken samples must show a silky fracture of uniform color.

26. Specimens of medium steel, when heated to a cherry red and cooled in water at seventy (70) degrees Fahrenheit; shall be capable of bending one hundred eighty (180) degrees around a circle whose diameter is equal to the thickness of the test piece, without showing signs of cracking on the convex side of the bend.

27. Punched holes in medium steel, pitched two (2) diameters from a sheared edge, must stand drifting until their diameters are fifty (50) per cent greater than those of the original holes, and must show no signs of cracking the metal.

28. The sand shall be silicious, clean, sharp grained and coarse, and free from dirt and all organic matter.

29. Broken stone used in Concrete Masonry, shall be good, hard stone, not affected by the weather and must be small enough in its largest dimensions to pass through a ring two (2) inches in diameter. It shall be thoroughly cleaned from all foreign substance.

30. Gravel used for concrete masonry shall be of such size that the greatest diameter of any pebble shall not exceed two (2) inches, nor the latest dimensions of any pebble be less than one-fourth ($1/4$) of an inch. It shall be thoroughly cleaned from all foreign substances.

31. Bricks must be of the best quality for the purpose for which they are intended, uniform in quality, sound and burned hard entirely through, free from lime and cracks, whole, with true surfaces and edges full and square, and of standard dimensions. All defective bricks will be rejected. They must have a crushing strength of not less than four thousand (4000) pounds per square inch. After being thoroughly dried and immersed in water for twenty-four (24) hours, they shall not absorb more than ten (10) per cent by weight, of water. Samples taken from the brick, as delivered on the ground, will be subject to such other tests as the Superintendent of streets may order.

32. Water for mixing mortar shall be fresh and free from earth, dirt or sewerage.

33. Concrete shall be of two (2) classes.

34. The first class shall be composed of one part of Portland cement, three parts of sand, and five parts of broken stone.

35. The second class shall be composed of one part of Portland cement, three parts of sand, and six parts of gravel.

36. Concrete of the "First Class" shall be used for all arches between steel "I" Beams.

37. Concrete of the "Second Class" shall be used in the construction of area retaining walls.

38. The proportions given above shall be by measure, and the materials shall be accurately measured for each batch, the cement being measured loose. The Contractor shall furnish the necessary measuring boxes. The mixing may be by hand or by machinery, but in either case it must be thorough.

39. The cement and sand shall first be thoroughly mixed dry on a tight platform to be provided by the contractor. The proper quantity of clean water shall then be mixed in and the clean moistened stone or gravel (as the case may be) shall then be added to the mass and the whole thoroughly mixed. The amount of water added shall be such that no sign of water shall appear until the ramming of the concrete, as hereinafter specified, is nearly finished.

40. Concrete shall not be mixed in larger quantities than required for immediate use. It shall not be used after it has begun to show evidence of setting, and no concrete which has once set shall be used as material for mixing a new batch. Concrete shall not be thrown or dumped from a height, and must be carefully placed so that uniformity in the distribution of the constituents may not be disturbed.

41. Concrete shall be spread in horizontal layers, not exceeding six (6) inches in thickness, and shall at once be thoroughly compacted by ramming. One course shall follow another as rapidly as possible. Where fresh concrete is to be placed in contact with that already set or partly set, all loose stones or concrete not thoroughly compacted shall be removed from the surface of the latter, which shall then be washed clean of dirt and slushed with neat cement. When concrete is in place, all wheeling, working or walking on it must be prevented until it is firmly set, and until such time it shall be kept damp and protected from the sun.

42. Such forms and centers as may be necessary to give the finished concrete the desired form shall be used. Special care must be taken to make the forms true and smooth. They shall be sufficiently stiff and substantial to retain the concrete firmly in place, and shall not be withdrawn until the same has set.

43. Portland cement mortar shall, unless otherwise specified, be composed of one part in volume of Portland cement to three parts of sand. The cement to be measured loose.

44. The sand and cement in the specified proportions shall be thoroughly mixed dry, on a tight platform, with shovels or hoes until no streaks of cement are visible.

45. Water shall then be added in sufficient quantity to produce a mortar of the desired consistency, and the whole thoroughly mixed with shovels or hoes until a homogeneous mass is produced.

46. The bricks must be clean and thoroughly wet by immersion before using, and those with the smoothest faces are to be laid in the inside courses, the smoothest edge to face out. Every course shall be laid true to line.

47. Every brick must be laid in full Portland Cement mortar joints which, for each brick, must be formed in one operation, and no working in of the mortar will be allowed.

48. No joints shall exceed three-eighth ($3/8$) of an inch in thickness. All joints on the face are to be trowel struck.

49. All unfinished brick work is to be raked back in courses, and when new work is to be joined to it, the surface of the brick must be cleaned and moistened.

50. The area retaining walls, built of either brick, concrete or natural stone will be carried to a height below the official grade of the street equal to the depth of the steel beam, plus the rise of the arch above the top of the beam, plus the thickness of the sidewalk

pavement.

51. Upon the walls so constructed there shall be laid steel "I" beams placed four (4) feet between centers, connected by means of steel tie rods seven-eighths (7/8) of an inch in diameter, placed not more than three (3) feet six (6) inches apart. The end rods shall not be more than six (6) inches from the end of the beams. Each end of the rod to be provided with upset screw ends three (3) inches in length, with all necessary cast-iron washers and nuts.

52. The size of the beams shall be as follows:

For sidewalks fourteen (14) feet in width

the beams shall be seven (7) inches in depth, and shall weigh

and shall weigh not less than fifteen (15)

pounds to the linear foot.

For sidewalks sixteen (16) feet in width the

beams shall be eight (8) inches in depth

and shall weigh not less than

eighteen (18) pounds to the linear foot.

53. For sidewalks twenty (20) feet in width the beams shall be ten (10) inches in depth, and shall weigh not less than twenty-five (25) pounds to the linear foot.

54. The surface of all steel work shall be carefully cleaned and all rust removed, and shall receive one coat of Dixon's Silica Graphite Paint.

55. The arches between beams shall be constructed as hereinbefore specified of concrete or brick masonry.

56. There shall then be laid on top of the arches so constructed a concrete sidewalk and concrete curb in accordance with the specifications contained in the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, Prescribing specifications for sidewalking and curbing in the said City of San Diego, in force at the time such work is done.

57. The contractor shall give twelve (12) hours notice in writing when he shall require the services of the City Engineer for laying out any portion of the work. He shall preserve all stakes set for lines, levels, or measurements of the work by the City Engineer, in their proper places. Any expense in replacing said stakes which the contractor or his agents or employees may have failed to preserve, shall be borne by the contractor. The contractor shall dig all stake holes necessary to give lines and levels. The contractor shall, when required to do so by the said Superintendent of Streets, remove from the work any overseer, superintendent, laborer, or other person employed on the work, who shall refuse or neglect to obey the said Superintendent of Streets in any way relating to the work, or who shall perform his work in a manner contrary to these specifications, or who shall be found to be incompetent or unfaithful.

58. All loss or damage arising from the nature of the work to be done under these specifications, during the progress of the work, and before the acceptance thereof, or from any act or omission on the part of the contractor, or any agent or person employed by him, occurring in the course of the work not authorized by these specifications, shall be sustained and borne by the contractor. The contractor shall remove all obstructions in a careful manner and replace the same when necessary that the same should be replaced, in

in as good a condition as found, and to the proper grade, and all projecting stone or other walks shall be neatly cut on the inside of the curb, and such cutting and resetting of curbing and replacing of paving shall be done as shall be necessary to make proper connections with the work already done on the streets. The contractor shall keep good and sufficient guards around said improvements, by fence or otherwise, to prevent accident, and shall hang thereon lights to burn from dusk to daylight, and the Contractor shall hold the City harmless from any and all suits for damages arising from or out of and during the performance of said work, or any portion thereof, and before the same has been accepted.

59. All the work provided for herein must in all cases be done under the direction and to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Streets, and the material used shall comply with the specifications herein contained, and be to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Streets. No materials of any kind shall be used until they have been examined and approved by the said Superintendent of Streets, who shall have full power to condemn any work or material not in accordance with the specifications, and to require the contractor to immediately remove any work or material so condemned, and the contractor shall, at his own expense replace said work, or materials to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets. The decisions of the Superintendent of Streets shall be final as to the quality of the work and materials used, unless the Common Council shall determine otherwise upon an appeal.

60. Whenever the word "Contractor" is used in these specifications it refers to the party or parties to whom the contract has been awarded for the construction of the work herein specified.

61. Whenever the words "City Engineer" or "Street Superintendent" are used in these specifications, they refer, respectively, to the City Engineer and the Street Superintendent of the City of San Diego, California.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

ORDINANCE No. 1558.

An Ordinance prohibiting the use of explosive canes in the City of San Diego, California.

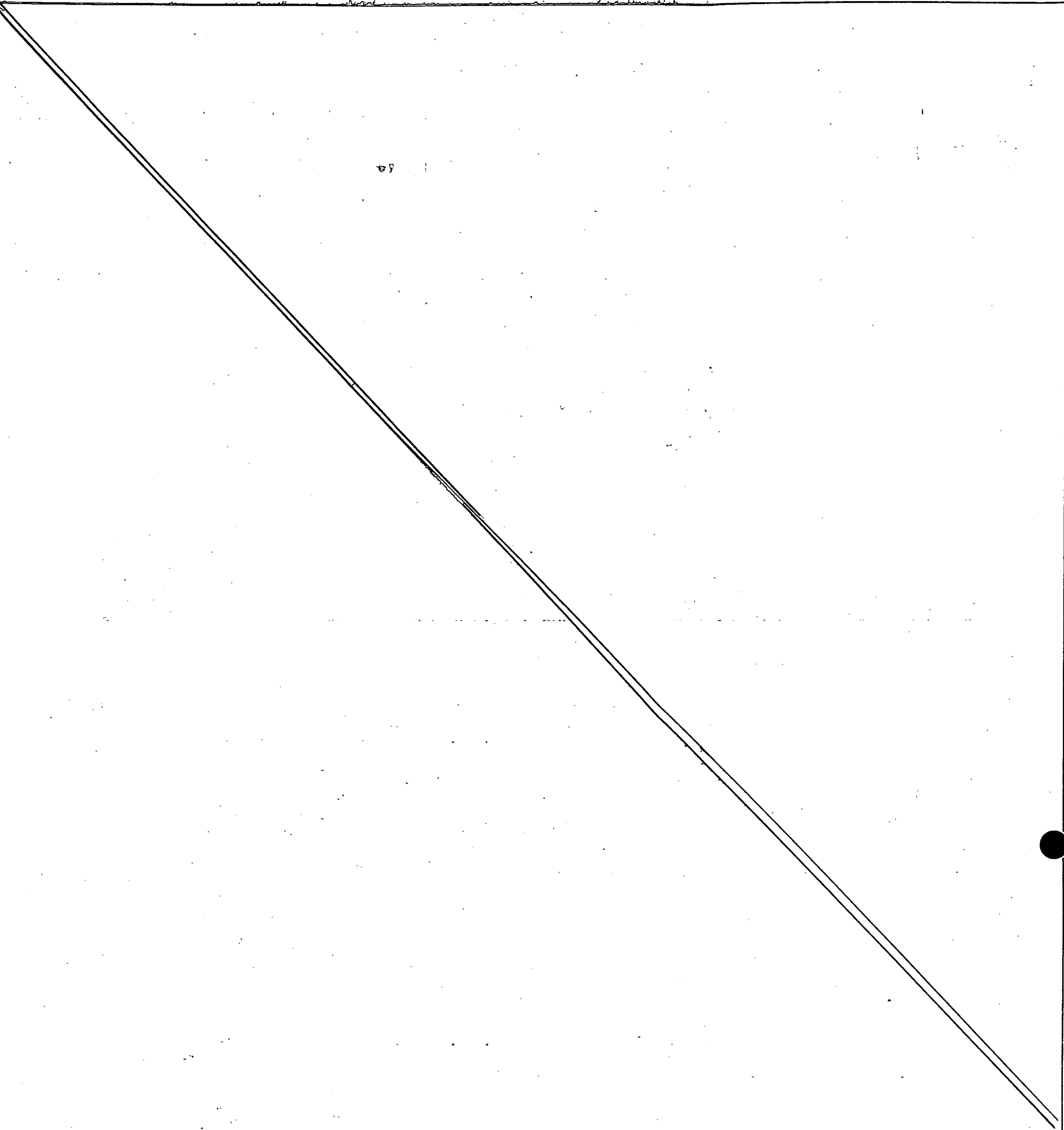

An Ordinance to prevent painting signs or advertisements upon, or defacing in any way any paved street or streets, or any part thereof in the City of San Diego, California, between the curb line of said streets, including all paved intersections of streets.

Ordinance No. 1614.

An Ordinance granting a street railway franchise to E. S. Babcock in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it ordained, By the common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That E. S. Babcock be, and is hereby, granted a franchise to construct and, maintain and operate, for the period of twenty-five years, a double-track ^{street} railway along and upon the following described property and streets in the City of San Diego, California, namely:

Commencing at a point where the center of Arctic street would be intersected by a line extending west from the center of "C" street; thence east to the center of "C" street, and thence along and over "C" street to the intersection of "C" and Sixth streets; thence south along and over Sixth street to the right-of-way of the California Southern Railroad; thence southeasterly to a connection with the San Diego, Guaymas and Eastern Railroad, at the intersection of Ninth and "N" streets, upon the following conditions and limitations, viz:

I.

That the cars upon said railway shall be propelled by electricity, used through the overhead system, but if at any time the said railway cannot be operated by said power owing to accident to the machinery or appurtenances or other causes, horses or mules may be used to propel cars thereon during the time the same cannot be operated by said power.

II.

That the grantee or its assigns shall plank, pave, or macadamize, as the council may direct, the entire length of that portion of said streets used by said railway tracks, between the rails and for two feet on each side thereof, and between the tracks, and keep the same constantly in repair, flush with the street and with good crossings.

III.

That the track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches within the rails, and shall have a space between them and between side tracks, turnouts and switches, of not less than five feet three inches, being sufficient to allow the cars to pass each other freely.

IV.

That the right to grade, sewer, pave, macadamize or otherwise improve or alter or repair the said streets shall be reserved to the City of San Diego; such work to be done so as to obstruct the said railway as little as possible. The grantee or its assigns shall shift and reshift its rails so as to avoid the obstruction created

thereby.

V

That the laying of said tracks, and all sidetracks, turnouts, switches, or crossovers, shall conform in all cases with the grade of said streets, where the same have been graded, and in all other cases as near to the natural grades as practicable. And when at any time any part of said route shall be graded, or the grade thereof altered or changed by the said Common Council, the bed of the road and the tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith by the grantee or its assigns. The tracks shall be so constructed and laid, that each of them shall be of equal distance from the curb line of said street.

VI

No switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches and all turnouts shall be changed at the expense of the grantee or its assigns whenever so ordered by said Common Council.

VII

That the City Engineer shall, under the directions of the said Common Council, give the established grades of the streets along the line of construction of said railway, and set stakes indicating the said grade; he shall see that the said railway is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of the franchise, and for his services as herein required he shall receive such fees as are provided therefor, and the same shall be paid by the grantee or its assigns.

VIII

That the cars to be operated upon said railway shall be used for passenger traffic exclusively.

IX

That the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, is hereby allowed eight months in which to commence the work of constructing said street railway. Said work must be prosecuted diligently, and must be completed within four months after the same is begun.

X

That in case the grantee of said franchise, his or its successors or assigns, ceases to operate such road for ten days, this franchise shall be and is declared to be forfeited, and said grantee, his or its successors or assigns, shall remove the tracks of said railway, and put the portion of the streets covered by such franchise in as good condition as the balance of the streets is at the time said franchise is forfeited.

XI

That the failure to comply with any of the conditions of this franchise shall work forfeiture of the rights and privileges thereby.

XII

That the right to repeal, amend or modify this ordinance, granting this franchise shall be and is hereby reserved to the said Common Council.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No. 1617.

An Ordinance regulating the use of water for irrigation in the City of San Diego, California.

Be it Ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the use of water for irrigation from the system of water works of the City of San Diego, California, through standing irrigators, automatic sprinklers, and through hose not held in hand, is hereby prohibited during the months of June, July, August, September, October, and November of every year, except between the hours of six O'clock A.M. and eight O'clock A.M., and between the hours of five O'clock P.M. and seven O'clock P.M. and in case of a violation of this rule the water may be shut off from the premises of the consumer or consumers so violating, and not turned on again until the fee of one dollar is paid for the first offense, and double this amount for each subsequent offense; the said fee to be collected by the Board of Public Works of said City; provided, that this section shall not apply to those to whom water is furnished at meter rates for the irrigation of one-half acre or more, nor to consumers of water in that portion of said City where the water pipes are inadequate to supply such portion of said City with water.



Ordinance No. 1637.

An ordinance establishing the grade of Dartmouth street in the City of San Diego, California, from and including the east line of Twenty-eighth street to and including the west line of Thirty-first Street in said City.

Be it ordained, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the grade of Dartmouth street in the City of San Diego, California, from and including the east line of Twenty-eighth street to and including the west line of Thirty-first street in said city, be and the same is hereby established as follows.

The elevations of the points herein named to be above the datum of levels as fixed by Ordinance No. 3, of the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, entitled, "An ordinance establishing a datum line for the grading of streets in the City of San Diego, State of California, and providing for the manner of establishing grades by ordinance," approved June 30th 1886, shall be and the same are hereby fixed as follows:

At the southeast corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Twenty-eighth street, two hundred and sixteen feet;

At the northeast corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Twenty-eighth street, two hundred and sixteen and fifty hundredths feet;

At the southwest corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Bean street, two hundred and eight and fifty hundredths feet;

At the northwest corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Bean street, two hundred and eight and fifty hundredths feet;

At the southeast corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Bean street, two hundred and seven feet;

At the northeast corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Bean street, two hundred and seven feet;

At the southwest corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Twenty-ninth street, two hundred and five feet;

At the northwest corner of the intersection of Dartmouth street and Twenty-ninth street, two hundred and six feet;

That at all points between said designated points the grade is hereby established so as to conform to a straight line drawn between said designated points, provided that the grade of said Dartmouth street from and including the east line of Twenty eighth street to and including the west line of Thirty-first street shall conform to the grade elevations of the said points herein fixed, and, shall be in accord with said Ordinance No. 3, provided also that the centerline of the said portion of Dartmouth street shall have an average elevation of the opposite curb grades.

That the grades of the intersections of said Dartmouth street with cross streets shall conform to the grades of such portions of said streets adjoining said intersections.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this ordinance, to publish or cause the same to be published once in the City official newspaper of said City, to-wit,

the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.
