For the third or more tables or banks, Fifteen dollars per month, each so kept and exhibited in one room or apartment,- and that the Section so amended shall read, "All persons or properties keeping or desiring to keep a Monte bank, Faro Bank, Roulette Table or other table at which any game of hazard, chance, or skill are or shall be played or exhibited with cards, dice or any other invention, device or instrument whatsoever shall pay for the first table or bank, thirty dollars per month; for the Second table or bank, twenty dollars per month; and for the third or more ^{tables} or banks, Fifteen dollars per month each so kept and exhibited in one room or apartment."

(#5) Sec. 1st. That the words "within 200 yards of the flag staff" be inserted after the words "pistols or otherwise" in the 1st Sec. of Ordinance relative to the peace of the City, passed Sept. 30th 1850: and strike out the words "fifty," and insert the word "five" in same Sec. of said Ordinance - So that the section shall read as follows - "Sec. 1st. If any person or persons shall be guilty of making any riotous or disorderly noise by firing guns, pistols or otherwise, with 200 yards of the flag staff, or shall ring the bell or bells belonging to the church in this City, or in any other manner shall disturb the public peace, each and every person so offending shall forfeit and pay to the City a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars and not less than five dollars for each offense, at the discretion of the Mayor of the City."

ORDINANCE NO 10.

[Adopted March 1st, 1851.]

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of San Diego do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The City Marshal is hereby authorized to receive from the City Assessor the duplicate of taxes for the year A. D. 1850, at any time prior to the 3d day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

Sec. 2. Immediately upon receiving such duplicate the Marshal shall proceed to collect said taxes and for that purpose shall attend on the 13th day of March A. D. 1851, at the Playa, on the 14th day of said March at New San Diego, and after the said 14th day of March he shall for the same purpose attend at his office in the City of San Diego.

Sec. 3. He shall cause notices to be posted up at the Playa, at New San Diego, and at the court-house in the City of San Diego, stating where he will attend to receive taxes at places in such notices, to be designated at least ten days before the time set forth in said notices, stating therein the amount of tax charged for city purposes on each one hundred dollars valuation and the penalty for failing to pay the same within the time prescribed by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. In case any person not being the owner of real estate shall neglect or refuse to pay the tax imposed against him the City Marshal shall on the 24th day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, proceed to collect the same, together with ten per cent damages and the costs and

charges that may accrue by seizure and sale of the goods and chattels of such person as ought to pay the same. Five days' notice of such sale shall be given in like manner as notice is required to be given of sales of personal property under execution; and no more of such property shall be sold if susceptible of division than will pay the taxes, costs and damages chargeable against the owner.

Sec. 5. The Marshal shall receive the same fees for making distress and sale of goods and chattels for taxes as are allowed to constables for levy and sale of property on execution.

Sec. 6. In case the owner or owners of any real estate liable to taxation shall fail or refuse to pay the amount of taxes assessed against him on or before the 1st day of April next the City Marshal shall on that day expose to sale said real estate, or so much thereof as will pay the full amount of taxes due and five dollars added thereto as a compensation to the Marshal for making a deed to the land thus sold for taxes and continued from day to day until all the lands are sold.

Sec. 7. Before making such sale the City Marshal shall cause to be posted up written notices at the court house door at least ten days prior to the day fixed for sale, announcing in general terms that on a given day set forth in said notice he will sell at the court house door between 10 o'clock a. m. and 4 o'clock p. m. on said day such part or portion of all real estate in the city on which taxes were unsettled as will pay and liquidate the taxes remaining due and unpaid at the day of sale, together with ten per cent damages thereon and costs of making deeds.

Sec. 8. In selling real estate the owner, or in default thereof, the Marshal shall designate the part to be sold, describing the same by some boundaries or definite starting point or other description, so that the land can be identified and properly described, or in case of the sale of lots or blocks in any surveyed portion of said city then said lots and blocks shall be described and sold as they are indicated upon the respective surveys, and in all cases the person who will pay the taxes and charges thereon for the least amount of real estate shall be the purchaser.

Sec. 9. Whenever any real estate is sold for the non-payment of taxes under the provisions of this ordinance it shall be the duty of the Marshal as soon thereafter as practicable to execute a deed or conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers thereof and acknowledge the same before some person authorized by law to take acknowledgments of deeds and file the same in the office of the Clerk of the Common Council.

Sec. 10. Any person being the owner or interested in any land may, by himself or his agent, redeem the same within one year from the day of sale by paying the amount of tax and charges charged thereon, together with 100 per cent. damages to the purchaser; provided, however, that minors shall have two years within which to redeem any lands or lots thus sold by refunding the taxes for which the same was sold to the purchaser thereof, with like damages, or in either of the above cases by depositing the said sums and damages in the Clerk's office within the time required by law.

Sec. 11. After the expiration of one year from the day of sale, when the real estate of any adult person has been sold for taxes, and within one year from the time of obtaining his, her or their majority in cases when the lands of minors have been sold, the title to the purchaser or purchasers shall become absolute, and the deed or deeds so filed in the office of the Clerk of the Common Council shall be delivered to the respective purchasers, and Indians shall have the power of redeeming within two years after the sale thereof, and all sales and conveyances of land exempted by law from taxation shall be void.

Sec. 12. There shall be a penalty assessed of twenty per cent. upon the amount of all returned delinquents, which the person or personal property assessed shall be liable to pay, together with ten per cent. interest per annum thereon until collected and paid.

Sec. 13. Whenever any tax is paid the Marshal shall note the same on his duplicate and shall give to the person paying the same a receipt specifying the amount paid, what paid for, the description of the property assessed and the owner's name.

Sec. 14. After deducting the amount of taxes returned delinquent and the collection fees allowed the Marshal from the several taxes charged on the duplicate in a just and rateable proportion, the Marshal shall be held liable for the balance, which sum he shall pay over to the City Treasurer within ten

days after the sale by him of the real estate for taxes, and deliver to the City Treasurer the duplicate for taxes with the delinquent tax noted thereon.

Sec. 15. The City Marshal shall be allowed for the collection of taxes as follows: Ten per centum on the first thousand dollars, eight per centum on any sum between one thousand and two thousand dollars, six per centum on any sum between two thousand and five thousand dollars, and three per cent. on all sums above five thousand dollars, which percentage shall include all compensation for the collection of the same.

Sec. 16. Delinquent taxes may at any time before the land is sold therefor, with the penalty, interest and damages thereon, be paid into the City Treasury at any time after the delinquent list is returned, as herein provided, and the person so paying taxes shall receive a receipt therefor from the City Treasurer for the amount so paid.

Sec. 17. The delinquent list not paid on or before the day of the commencement of the assessment for the year A. D. 1851 shall be, with all costs, interest, charges and damages, be entered upon the duplicate of taxes for said year.

Sec. 18. The Marshal may appoint one or more deputies to aid him in the collection of the taxes, and shall be entitled to receive all damages levied and collected, as well upon goods and chattels as upon real estate sold by him for the taxes as aforesaid.

Sec. 19. The Marshal shall receive in payment of taxes any order drawn by the President of the Common Council upon the City Treasurer, and in case the order presented exceeds the amount due for taxes the Marshal shall endorse on said order the amount so due by said person for his said taxes.

ORDINANCE No.24.

The Common Council of the City of San Diego do ordain as follows,viz:

Sect. 1st. That no person shall pursue any calling or transact any business hereinafter provided for without a license under a penalty of Fifty dollars (\$50) and,any person refusing to exhibit such license,when required to do so by the City Marshal or other person duly authorized by him,shall pay a fine of twenty-five dollars.

Sect. 2nd. Any person desiring a license to pursue any of the callings or transact any branch of business enumerated in the third (3rd) section of this ordinance shall state to the City Marshal or his Deputy under oath to which of the classes hereinafter enumerated,in his opinion,the extent of his business will probably attach him.

The Marshal thereupon give him a receipt in duplicate of the amount paid. The business or calling to be pursued,the place where located,the class to which he belongs,and the time for which he has paid,which shall not (except in the cases of theatrical or other amusements) be for less time than one month. Upon the presentation of one of these receipts to the Clerk of the Common Council,he shall file the same,and issue to the party,a license in accordance with the specifications in the receipt. For each license so issued the Clerk shall receive on the delivery thereof the fee of one dollar. A license may be received by the person or persons in whose name it was originally issued,on paying the tax (taking a duplicate receipt) and making oath before the City Marshal,that there has been no change in his business,which should cause him to be rated under another class,than that for which the original license was granted. The Clerk of the Common Council shall on the presentation of one of the duplicate receipts as provided in the first part of this section,endorse a renewal on the back of the original,license,for which he shall receive fifty cents.

Sec. 3rd. The following are the kinds of business, or callings for which licenses may be granted, viz: Merchants or traders, auctioneers, butchers, bakers, hotel or tavern keepers, restaurants, vending, selling, bartering, or otherwise disposing of spirituous or malt liquors, wines or cider, in any quantity less than one quart, keeping monte banks, faro banks, roulette or any other table, at which games of hazard, chance or skill may be played or exhibited with cards, dice or any other device or invention or instrument whatsoever; keeping billiard tables, or bowling saloons or alleys, and the keeping and using of drays, carts, wagons, stage coaches, or other vehicle for the transportation of goods or passengers for hire.

Sec. 4th. All persons pursuing the trade or calling of merchants or Traders, druggists and apothecaries, bakers or butchers shall be classed in proportion to the business transacted by each as per the following schedule. Class number one, shall include all those whose monthly receipts or sales amount to two thousand dollars.

No. (2) Two. Those whose receipts or sales amount to fifteen hundred dollars.

No. (3) Three. Those whose receipts or sales amount to eight hundred dollars.

No. (4) Four. Those whose receipts or sales amount to five hundred dollars or less. The first class shall pay per quarter, seven dollars and fifty cents; the second class shall pay six dollars per quarter; the third class shall pay four dollars and fifty cents per quarter; the fourth class shall pay three dollars per quarter.

Sect. 5th. The keepers or proprietors of billiard tables and bowling alleys shall pay five dollars per month for each table or alley so kept.

Sect. 6th. Liquor dealers or keepers of bar rooms where spirituous or malt liquors are sold in quantities of less than one

quart, to be drank on the premises where sold shall be divided into two classes, those who have a capital invested in stock and fixtures of one thousand dollars or more shall constitute the first class and shall pay a tax of ten dollars per month, and those who have a like investment of less than one thousand dollars shall constitute the second class and pay five dollars per month.

Sect. 7th. All persons keeping hotels, taverns, public boarding houses, restaurants, shall pay five dollars per month.


Sect. 8th. Every person or company being the proprietor of or exhibiting a circus, theatrical or other performance or giving any entertainment for public amusement shall pay the sum of ten dollars for each and every exhibition or performance so given.

Sect. 9th. All persons owning drays, carts, stages, wagons or other public vehicles for transportation of goods or passengers, shall pay for each and every one so used the sum of fifty cents per month.

Sect. 10th. All taxes provided for by this ordinance shall be paid invariably in advance.

Sect. 11th. All ordinances which shall in any manner conflict with this, with the exception of Ordinance No. 12, dated March 13th, 1851, and approved March 15th, 1851, are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall take effect from the first day of September instant.




