That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition, by said City, of the following described water works, situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California to-wit:

main pumping station and wells at Old Town, in the City of San Diego, California, situated on Lot Three in Block Four Hundred and Twenty, and on Block Four Hundred and Forty of said Old Town, and Pueblo Lot Eleven Hundred and Two of the Pueblo Lands of said City, and part of the street condemned in the case of the San Diego and Coronado Water Company vs. Santee, et al., December 17th 1886, in the Superior Court of the County of San Diego, State of California; said main pumping station at Old Town consisting, among other property, of the following described property, to-wit:







Also a water pipe line on Twenty-eighth street, running from Logan Avenue to Webster Avenue, consisting of twenty-six hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch cast iron water pipe; seventeen hundred and eighty-four pounds of lead; and eighty-four pounds of hemp.

Also a water pipe line on Beardsley street running from Logan Avenue to Julian Avenue, consisting of seven hundred and eighty linear feet

of six inch east iron water pipe; five hundred and seventy-four pounds of lead; twenty-seven pounds of hemp; one twelve inch by six-inch cross; one six-inch gate, and one gate box;

Also a water pipe line on Sixteenth street running from Logan avenue to Milton avenue, consisting of three hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch east iron water pipe; three hundred and ten pounds of lead; fifteen pounds of hemp; one twelve-inch by six-inch tee; one six-inch gate, and one gate box;

Also a water pipe line on "O" street, running from Twelfth street to Fifteenth street, and from Eighteenth street to twenty-fifth street, consisting of three thousand and three hundred and forty linear feet of six-inch east iron water pipe; three thousand and three hundred and eighty-one pounds of lead; one hundred and sixty-one pounds of hemp; one twelve-inch by six-inch tee; four six-inch by four-inch tees; two four-inch tees; one eight-inch by six-inch cross; seven six-inch by four-inch crosses; three six-inch crosses; ten six-inch gates; nineteen four-inch gates; twenty-nine gate boxes, and four single nozzle hydrants.

Also a water pipe line on "N" street, running from Sixteenth street to Twenty-fifth street, consisting of twenty-nine hundred linear feet of six-inch east iron water pipe; three thousand one hundred and four pounds of lead; one hundred and forty-seven pounds of hemp; one four-inch bend; one twelve-inch by six-inch cross; one six-inch by four-inch cross; two six-inch by four-inch y's; one six-inch by six-inch tee; seven six-inch by four-inch tees; two four-inch tees; three six-inch gates; twelve four-inch gates; fifteen gate boxes, and three single nozzle hydrants.

Also a water pipe line on Campus avenue running from University Boulevard to Adams avenue, consisting of forty hundred and fifty linear feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe; fourteen hundred and forty-eight pounds of lead;

Also a water pipe line on Cleveland avenue running from University avenue to Jackson avenue, consisting of four thousand linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; nineteen hundred and twenty-one pounds of lead; ninety-six pounds of hemp; one four-inch bend; four four-inch tees; one six-inch by four-inch cross; six four-inch gates; six gate boxes, and four single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Vermont street running from University avenue to Cyprus avenue, consisting of fifteen hundred linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; thirteen hundred and forty-nine pounds of lead; eighty-one pounds of hemp; four six-inch by four-inch crosses; three four-inch tees; seven four-inch gates; seven gate boxes, and three single nozzle hydrants.

Also a water pipe line on Richmond street running from Thornton avenue to Cypress avenue, consisting of four hundred linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; two hundred and twenty pounds of lead; eleven pounds of hemp; one four-inch cross; one four-inch tee; one four-inch gate; one gate box, and one single nozzle hydrant.

Also a water pipe line on "A" street running from Twenty-fourth street to Thirtieth street, consisting of four thousand linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; nineteen hundred and eighty-nine pounds of lead; one hundred pounds of hemp; seven four-inch tees; one fifteen-inch by four-inch cross; eight four-inch gates; eight gate boxes; and six single nozzle hydrants.

Also a water pipe line on Franklin avenue running from "D" street to Twenty-eighth street, consisting of sixteen hundred and thirty

linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; thirteen hundred and forty-nine pounds of lead; eighty-one pounds of hemp; two four-inch gates; two four-inch tees; two gate boxes; two single nozzle hydrants; and one six-inch by four-inch cross;

Also a water pipe line on Irving avenue running from "N" street to Twenty-eighth street, consisting of thirty-nine hundred and eighty linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; nineteen hundred and eighty-seven pounds of lead; one hundred pounds of hemp; six four-inch tees; one four-inch bend; two six-inch by four-inch crosses; nine four-inch gates; nine gate boxes, and five single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Julian avenue running from Beardsley street to Marecy avenue, consisting of thirty-eight hundred and forty linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; eighteen hundred and eighty-one pounds of lead; ninety-four pounds of hemp; three six-inch by four-inch crosses; one six-inch by four-inch tee; three four-inch tees; one four-inch y; seven four-inch gates; seven gate boxes, and four single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Milton avenue running from Sixteenth street to Twenty-sixth street, consisting of forty-nine hundred and forty linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; twenty-three hundred and fifty-seven pounds of lead; one hundred and eighteen pounds of hemp; one four-inch bend; six four-inch tees; one twelve-inch by twelve-inch by four-inch by six-inch cross; three six-inch by four-inch crosses; one four-inch cross; six four-inch gates; six gate boxes, and six single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Thirteenth street running from "H" street to "A" street, consisting of twenty-six hundred and seventy linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; also eleven hundred and five pounds of lead, and fifty-six pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on Sixteenth street

running from "H" street to "P" street, consisting of twenty-six hundred and seventy linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; eleven hundred and five pounds of lead, and fifty-six pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on Nineteenth street running from "O" street to "N" street, consisting of forty-two hundred linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; seventeen hundred and forty pounds of lead, and eighty-seven pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on Twenty-first street running from "B" street to "M" street, consisting of forty-seven hundred and eighty linear feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe; nineteen hundred and ten pounds of lead, and ninety-six pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on Twenty-second street running from "B" street to "O" street and from "G" street to "M" street, consisting of thirty-four hundred and thirty linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; fourteen hundred and forty pounds of lead, and seventy-two pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on Tenth street running from "A" street to Cedar street, and thence on Cedar street to Ninth street, consisting of fourteen hundred and thirty linear feet of four inch cast iron water pipe; five hundred and fifty pounds of lead; thirty pounds of hemp; one twelve inch by four inch tee; one four-inch cross; two four-inch tees; three four-inch gates; three gate boxes, and one four-inch single nozzle hydrant;

Also a water pipe line on "L" street running from Twenty-fifth street to Thirty-second street, consisting of forty-six hundred linear feet of four-inch cast iron water pipe; twenty-two hundred and eighty-nine pounds of lead; one hundred and fifteen pounds of hemp; six four-inch tees; one ten-inch by four inch cross; three four-inch crosses; nine four-inch gates; nine gate boxes, and seven single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Grand avenue

running from Twenty-sixth street to Thirty-second street, consisting of thirty-nine hundred and fifty linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; twenty hundred and fifty-seven pounds of lead; one hundred and three pounds of hemp; one six-inch by four-inch tee; seven four-inch tees; one six-inch by four-inch cross; one four-inch cross; ten four-inch gates; ten gate boxes, and seven single nozzle hydrants;

Also a water pipe line on Marcey avenue running from Julian avenue to Twenty-eighth street, consisting of three hundred linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; two hundred and twenty pounds of lead; eleven pounds of hemp; one four-inch tee; one four-inch gate, and one six-inch by four-inch cross;

Also a water pipe line on "A" street running from Fifteenth street to Eighteenth street, consisting of eight hundred and fifty linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; three hundred and fifty pounds of lead; and eighteen pounds of hemp;

Also a water pipe line on "J" street running from Twelfth street to Sixteenth street, and from Seventeenth street to Twentieth street, consisting of twenty-two hundred linear feet of four-inch east iron water pipe; eleven hundred and fifty pounds of lead; sixty-one pounds of hemp; one six-inch cross; six four-inch crosses; three four-inch tees; six four-inch gates; six gate boxes, and three single nozzle hydrants;

The construction of said improvements and extensions of the said system of water works includes the furnishing of all labor and material, in making all excavations and trenches, and laying and putting in place all of said water pipe, special castings, hydrants, and other material, back-filling the trenches and excavations, constructing the bustling, and completing the whole work in every particular so that the same will be ready for use in fur-

nishing water to the said City of San Diego and the inhabitants thereof; that the estimated cost of said improvements and extensions, when so completed and finished, is the sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the improvements and extensions by said City of said system of water works of said City is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of such improvements and extensions of said system of water works will be one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, and that the said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that it is the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the construction and making of said improvements and extensions of said system of water works at the cost and for the sum of one hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purpose.

Section Two. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by the said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of certain improvements and extensions of the system of sewers of the said City of San Diego, for the collection and disposition of the sewerage of said City, said system of sewers and said improvements and

extensions of said system of sewers being situated in the said City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and described as follows, to wit:

A main sewer commencing at the south line of the intersection of Atlantic and Ash streets; running thence on Ash street to Union street; running thence on Union street to Albatross street; running thence on Albatross street to Laurel street; running thence on Laurel street to Fourth street; running thence on Fourth street to Walnut avenue; running thence on Walnut avenue to Fifth street; running thence on Fifth street to University avenue, consisting of ten thousand eight hundred and eighty linear feet of twelve-inch sewer pipe, twenty-seven hundred and fifty linear feet of ten inch sewer pipe, three hundred and thirty-four twelve-inch y's, ninety-one ten inch y's, thirty-eight manholes, and one flush tank located at the intersection of Laurel Street and Albatross street;

Also one set of pneumatic ejectors located at the intersection of University Avenue and Fifth street;

Also a main sewer running from the intersection of University Avenue and Fifth Street to University Boulevard; thence along University Boulevard and the intersection of University Boulevard and Park Boulevard to El Cajon Avenue, consisting of twenty-one hundred linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe, thirty-seven hundred and eighty linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe, six ten-inch y's; fifty-two eight-inch y's, seventeen manholes, and one flush tank located at the intersection of Park Boulevard and El Cajon Avenue;

Also a sewer in Sixth street running from the center line of University Avenue thirteen hundred and ten feet south, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; fifty-eight six-inch y's, four manholes, and one flush

tank located in said Sixth street at the south end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Thornton Avenue one hundred and seventy six feet long, running from the center line of Sixth street east, consisting of one hundred and seventy-six linear feet of six inch sewer pipe, four six-inch y's, and one manhole;

Also a sewer running from the center of line of University Avenue along Tenth street, south, for a distance of eight hundred and forty linear feet, consisting of eight hundred and forty linear feet of eight inch sewer pipe, eighteen eight-inch y's, one hundred and ninety linear feet of trestling, and five manholes;

Also a sewer in the alley between Essex Avenue and University Avenue, running from the center line of Tenth street to the west line of Richmond Street, consisting of twelve hundred and fifteen linear feet of six inch sewer pipe, forty-four six-inch y's, one hundred and fifty linear feet of trestling, three manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Essex Avenue and Robinson Avenue, running from the center line of Tenth Street to the west line of Richmond street, consisting of twelve hundred and fifteen linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-four six-inch y's, three manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Robinson Avenue and Thornton Avenue, running from the center line of Tenth Street to a point two hundred and thirty feet east of the east line of Richmond Street, consisting of fifteen hundred and fifty linear feet of six inch sewer pipe, fifty-four six-inch y's, four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer on University Avenue running

from the west line of University Boulevard to the alley between Park Boulevard and Georgia street, consisting of thirteen hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-three six-inch y's, four hundred and ten linear feet of trestling, and five manholes;

Also a sewer running from the center line of University Avenue through the alley between Park Boulevard and Georgia Street to Howard Avenue, consisting of two thousand and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, seventy-two six-inch y's, five manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Center Street and Park Boulevard, extending from the center line of University Avenue to Lincoln Avenue, consisting of seven hundred and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-four six-inch y's, two manholes, one hundred and seventy linear feet of trestling, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Center street running from the center line of Lincoln Avenue to the west line of Park Boulevard, consisting of six hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, eighteen six-inch y's, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the northeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between University Boulevard and Center Street, running from the center line of University Avenue to Campus Avenue, consisting of sixteen hundred and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty-six six-inch y's, four manholes, and one flush tank located at the northeasterly end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Campus Avenue and Cleveland Avenue, running from the center line of Lincoln Avenue to Mead Avenue, consisting of twenty-two hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, seventy-eight six-inch y's, fifty linear feet of trestling, five manholes, and one flush

tank located at the north end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Cleveland Avenue and Maryland Street, running from the center line of the alley running southeast and northwest and parallel to Lincoln Avenue and extending to Mead Avenue, consisting of eighteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, sixty-eight six-inch r/s, one hundred and ninety-two linear feet of trussing, five manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley north of and parallel to Lincoln Avenue, extending five hundred feet northwesterly from the center line of Cleveland Avenue, consisting of five hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, ten six-inch r/s, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Cleveland Avenue running from the center line of Vermont Street to the alley running from the west line of Cleveland Avenue to Maryland Street, and parallel to Lincoln Avenue, consisting of eighteen hundred and fifty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty-eight six-inch r/s, and five manholes;

Also a sewer in Vermont Street running from the center line of University Avenue to the center line of Cleveland Avenue, consisting of two hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and one manhole;

Also a sewer running from the center line of University Avenue along the center line of Tenth Street to the alley between Hendricks Avenue and University Avenue; thence running along said alley to Vermont Street, consisting of seven hundred and seventy linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-two six-inch r/s, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the northeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer commencing in the center of the alley running east and west between Ninth and Tenth streets, and between Monterey Avenue

and University Avenue, thence running north through the alley running north and south two hundred and twenty-six feet, consisting of two hundred and twenty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, ten six-inch y's, and one manhole;

Also a sewer commencing at a point in the center line of the alley running east and west from Eighth Street to Ninth Street, and between Monterey Avenue and University Avenue; thence running north through the alley parallel to Eighth Street and Ninth Street, to Monterey Avenue, consisting of six hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, eighteen six-inch y's, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from Eighth Street through the alley between University Avenue and Monterey Avenue to Tenth Street, consisting of six hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twelve six-inch y's, two flush tanks, one located at the east end of said line of sewer, and one at the west end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Ninth Street, running from the center line of University Avenue north to the alley running east and west between Monterey Avenue and University Avenue, consisting of one hundred and seventy-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and one manhole;

Also one flush tank at the intersection of Walnut Avenue and Fifth Street;

Also a sewer in Front Street, extending from the center line of Laurel Street to Walnut Avenue, consisting of thirty-six hundred and thirty linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe, seventy-nine eight-inch y's, six manholes, ^{four hand holes} and fourteen hundred and eighty-five linear feet of trestle;

Also a sewer in Walnut Avenue extending from the center line of Front Street to the center line of the alley between First and Second Streets

consisting of two hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe;

Also a sewer in Walnut Avenue, extending from the center line of Front Street to the center line of the alley between First Street and Albatross Street, consisting of two hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe;

Also a sewer in the alley between First Street and Albatross Street running from Walnut Avenue to Robinson Avenue, consisting of nineteen hundred and seventy linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-eight six-inch y's, four manholes, two handholes, six hundred and fifty linear feet of trestling, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between First and Second Streets, running from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-four six-inch y's, two manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in Brookes Avenue extending from the alley between First Street and Albatross Street to the alley between Second and Third Streets, consisting of seven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and two manholes;

Also a sewer in the alley between First and Second streets, extending from Brookes Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of seventeen hundred and sixty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty six-inch y's, four manholes, one handhole, and one flush tank located at the extreme north end of said line of sewer; and four hundred and ten linear feet of trestle between Brookes Avenue and Thornton Avenue;

Also a sewer in the alley between Second and Third streets, extending from Brookes

Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of seventeen hundred and seventy-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, sixty-four six-inch γ 's, five manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer; also one hundred linear feet of trisling;

Also a sewer in the alley between Second and Third streets, extending from the center line of Brookes Avenue southerly one hundred and sixty-six feet, consisting of one hundred and sixty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, six six-inch γ 's, and one manhole;

Also a sewer in the alley between Fourth and Fifth Streets, extending from a point one hundred and fifty feet north of Brookes Avenue to University Avenue, consisting of fifteen hundred and sixty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, sixty-four six-inch γ 's, four manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Fourth and Fifth Streets, extending from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and eight linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-four six-inch γ 's, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the south end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Third and Fourth streets, extending from Walnut Avenue to Brookes Avenue, consisting of six hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-four six-inch γ 's, one manhole, and one flush tank located at the south end of said line of sewer;

Also an outfall sewer commencing at a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue, thence running in a southwesterly direction four hundred and seventy-five feet, consisting of four hundred and seventy-five linear feet of twenty-inch sewer pipe, and three manholes;

Also an outfall sewer commencing at a point four hundred and seventy-five feet southwest of a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue; thence running in a south-westerly direction for a distance of eight hundred feet into the Bay of San Diego, to be supported by one hundred and eighty-five piles, and to consist of eight hundred linear feet of twenty-inch cast iron pipe, seven handholes, one twenty-inch gate and one cast iron bend;

Also a main sewer running from a point on Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue thence running through the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue to Digbee Street; thence running in a straight line to a point in the alley between Main Street and Pierce Avenue two hundred and fifty feet northwest of the northwest line of Digbee Street; thence running in a straight line northeasterly to the northeasterly line of Main Street; thence running in a straight line to a point where the north line of Mannasse & Deheller's Addition intersects the southwest line of Logan Avenue; thence running in a straight line east to the northwest end of the alley in the block between Everett Avenue and Twenty-eighth Street; thence running southeasterly through said alley to the center line of Twenty-eighth Street; thence running south along Twenty-eighth Street to a point on the center line of Twenty-eighth Street fifty feet south of the alley between Franklin Avenue and Grant Avenue consisting of twenty-three hundred and forty linear feet of sixteen-inch sewer pipe, thirty-two hundred and ten linear feet of fourteen-inch sewer pipe, eight hundred and fifty linear feet of twelve-inch sewer pipe, six hundred and twenty linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe, five hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe.

and eight hundred and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe; twenty-four sixteen inch y's, twelve fourteen-inch y's, ten twelve inch y's, eight ten-inch y's, ten eight-inch y's, two six-inch y's, twenty-eight manholes, and two large flush tanks, one of said flush tanks to be located at the end of the said sewer line on Twenty-eighth Street, and one to be located at the south end of Twentieth Street:

Also a main sewer running from a point on the center line of Beardsley Street twenty feet south of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Dixie Avenue in a straight line to a point on the center line of Beard Street, opposite the alley between Dixie Avenue and Railroad Avenue; thence running along Beard Street to the center line of Twenty-sixth Street; thence running along Twenty-sixth Street to Marey Avenue; thence running along Marey Avenue to Twenty-eighth Street; thence running north to the southeasterly line of Dixie Street, consisting of four thousand and ten linear feet of twelve-inch sewer pipe; sixteen hundred linear feet of ten-inch sewer pipe, nine hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe, eleven hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty-eight twelve-inch y's, forty-eight eight-inch y's, three six-inch y's, twenty-two manholes, and two large flush tanks, one of said flush tanks to be located at the north end of said line of sewer, and one at the intersection of Beard Street and Milton Avenue:

Also a sewer in the alley between Newton Avenue and Main Street, running from Evans Street to a point in the said alley three hundred feet northwest of the northwest line of Bigsby Street consisting of three thousand linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and twelve six-inch y's, nine manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Melton Avenue and Newton Avenue, running from Dampson Street to a point in said alley one hundred and eighty feet southeast of the southeast line of Sixteenth Street, consisting of thirty-six hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and thirty-six six-inch r. s., eleven manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and Milton Avenue, running from a point one hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Evans Street to a point in said alley seventy feet southeast of the southeast line of Sixteenth Street, consisting of twenty-nine hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and ten six-inch r. s., ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, running from Evans Street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of twenty-four hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, ninety-two six-inch r. s., eight manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Avenue and Irving Avenue, commencing at Evans Street and running in a straight line to a point sixty-five feet west of the south end of the west line of Twenty-second Street, consisting of two thousand and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, seventy-four six-inch r. s., six manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Harrison Avenue and Irving Avenue, running in a straight line from a point one hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson Street to a point five

feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of twenty-one hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, eighty six-inch y.p. seven manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Grant Avenue and Harrison Avenue, running in a straight line from a point two hundred feet southeast of the southeast line of Evans Street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of thirteen hundred and ninety linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty four six-inch y.p. four manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Franklin Avenue and Grant Avenue, running in a straight line from Twenty eighth Street to a point on the west line of Dewey Street one hundred and forty feet northeast of the northeast line of Grant Avenue, consisting of seventeen hundred and twenty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, sixty-four six-inch y.p. five manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Everett Avenue and Franklin Avenue, running from Dampson Street to a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of said alley, consisting of eight hundred and forty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, thirty-four six-inch y.p. two manholes, and one flush tank located at the southeast end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between "N" street and Webster Avenue, running from a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of the alley in block three hundred and seventy-two of the San Diego Land and Town Company's Addition, to Thirty second Street, consisting of twenty-eight hundred linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe, one hundred eight-inch y.p. nine manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of the said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Webster Ave

now and Clay Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-eighth Street to Thirtieth Street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-eight six-inch y.s. four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Clay Avenue and Franklin Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-eighth Street to Thirtieth Street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-eight six-inch y.s. four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley in blocks three hundred and seventeen and three hundred and twenty-four of Reed and Daley's Addition, running from the center line of Twenty-eighth Street to a point one hundred and twenty-five feet west of the west line of Thirtieth Street, consisting of thirteen hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-eight six-inch y.s. four manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer running through the alley in blocks one and two of Reed and Hubbell's Addition, and running from the west line of Twenty-eighth Street to a point one hundred feet west of the west line of Thirty-first Street, consisting of nineteen hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, sixty six-inch y.s. five manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and National Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth Street to a point one hundred and fifty feet east of the east line of Thirty-first Street, consisting of thirty five hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and twenty-four six-inch y.s. ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer:

Also a sewer in the alley between National

Avenue and Grand Avenue, running from the west line of Twenty-sixth Street to a point one hundred and fifty feet west of the west line of Thirty-second Street, consisting of four thousand and forty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and thirty-four six-inch y's, twelve manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer the alley between Grand Avenue and Boston Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth Street to a point one hundred and fifty feet west of the west line of Thirty-second Street, consisting of thirty-seven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and twenty-eight six-inch y's, eleven manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Boston Avenue and Main Street, running from the center line of Main Street to a point three hundred feet west of the west line of Thirty-second Street, consisting of thirty-six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, one hundred and twenty-six six-inch y's, ten manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Milton Avenue and Newton Avenue, running from the center line of Picard Street to Dampson Street, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-four six-inch y's, two manholes, and one flush tank located at the north west end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Logan Avenue and Milton Avenue, running from the center line of Twenty-sixth Street to a point sixty-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Evans Street, consisting of fourteen hundred and fifty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty six-inch y's, four manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer.

Also a sewer in the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, running from the center line of Marcey Avenue, along Decard Street to the alley between Julian Avenue and Kearney Avenue, and thence along said alley to the south east line of Evans Street, consisting of fifteen hundred and seventy linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-eight six-inch y.o., five manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Irving Avenue and Julian Avenue, running from the intersection of Twenty-eighth Street and Marcey Avenue to Evans Street, consisting of two thousand and twenty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, seventy-eight six-inch y.o., six manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Harrison Avenue and Irving Avenue, running from Twenty-eighth Street to a point sixty-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson Street, consisting of twelve hundred linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, forty-two six-inch y.o., three manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer in the alley between Grant Avenue and Harrison Avenue, running from Twenty-eighth Street to a point in said alley two hundred and seventy-five feet northwest of the northwest line of Dampson Street, consisting of eleven hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, fifty-two six-inch y.o., three manholes, and one flush tank located at the northwest end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from the southeast end of the alley between Railroad Avenue and Pierce Avenue, thence along Dehley Street to Twenty-sixth Street; thence along Twenty-sixth Street to the alley between Grant Avenue and Boston Avenue, consisting of ten hundred and thirty linear feet of eight-inch sewer pipe, twenty

six-inch y's, six hundred and fifty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, and five manholes;

Also a sewer running from a point on Fourth street fifty feet south of the south line of Juniper Street along Fourth Street to the south line of Laurel Street, consisting of eight hundred and ten linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, twenty-six six-inch y's, two manholes, and one flush tank located at the north end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from a point on Twenty-third street thirty feet south of the south line of "B" street, east along "B" street to Twenty-fourth street, thence running north on Twenty-fourth street to "A" street; thence running east on "A" street to a point twenty-five feet west of the west line of Twenty-fifth street, consisting of twelve hundred and thirty-six linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, thirty-two six-inch y's, five manholes, and one flush tank located at the east end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from the west end of the alley in block twenty-eight of Deaman and Choate's Addition to the center line of Thirtieth street, thence running south along the center line of Thirtieth street to the center line of the alley between "N" street and Webster Avenue, consisting of thirteen hundred and eighty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, three manholes, twenty-four y's, and one flush tank located at the west end of said line of sewer;

Also a sewer running from the west end of the alley in block seventy-seven of Deaman and Choate's Addition east through the said alley to the center line of Thirtieth street, consisting of six hundred and thirty linear feet of six-inch sewer pipe, two manholes, twenty-four y's, and one flush tank located at the west end of said line of sewer;

Also the removal of six hundred and

forty linear feet of old sewer pipe in Fifth street, running north from the center line of Walnut Avenue; also the removal of two hundred and eighty linear feet of old sewer pipe in Walnut Avenue between Fourth and Fifth streets; and also the removal of three thousand linear feet of old sewer pipe in Union street and in Albatross street, running from the center line of Ash street north for a distance of three thousand feet, first along Union street to Albatross Street, and thence along Albatross street; also the removal and relaying of two hundred and fifty linear feet of cast iron sewer pipe, commencing at a point five feet northwest of the northwest end of the alley between Logan Avenue and Kearney Avenue; thence running in a south easterly direction two hundred and fifty feet.

That said sewers follow the center line of all streets and alleys, except at the intersections of streets and alleys. All sewer pipe will consist of vitrified iron stone salt-glazed sewer pipe, except where pipe is placed on trestles, where it will consist of kalamain pipe. There being no sewers over any portion of said routes except that which will be so removed.

The construction of the said improvements and extensions to said system of sewers to include the furnishing of labor and material in removing said old sewer pipe, and in making all excavations for trenches, laying and putting in place all sewer pipe and y's, backfilling the trenches and excavations, constructing all trestles, manholes, handholes, and flush tanks, and completing the same in every particular ready for use, the estimated cost of which is one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the said improvements and extensions of the said system of sewers in said City, as above described, is necessary and convenient

to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of such improvements and extensions of said system of sewers will be one hundred and forty thousand dollars, in lawful money of the United States, and that said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared to be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the construction of the said improvements and extensions of said system of sewers, at the cost and for the sum of one hundred and forty thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purpose.

Section Three. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the said City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by the said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction of certain street work in said City, situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and described as follows, to-wit:

The grading of a driveway twenty feet in width and coating the surface thereof with crude petroleum, the center line of which driveway is described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of the unnamed street on the southwest boundary of Old Town with the northwesterly line of Witherby street; thence running five hundred and eighteen and five tenths feet to the center of the intersection of First street and Gouts street in Middletown, thence running along the center line of First street eleven hundred and forty and five tenths

feet to the center line of Estudillo street; thence running along the center line of Estudillo street two hundred and seventy-four and five tenths feet to the center line of Second street; thence running along the center line of Second street eleven hundred and forty-one and three tenths feet to the center line of Clayton street; thence running along the center line of Clayton street four hundred and thirty-five and seven tenths feet to the center of California street; that there will also be constructed, in constructing said street work over said lines, three small wooden culverts, the estimated cost of which completed is seventy-two dollars in lawful money of the United States.

Also beginning at a point on the westerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and two, two hundred and sixty feet from the United States Military Reservation line; thence running south seventy-seven degrees and twenty minutes east two hundred and fifty-eight and eight tenths feet; thence running south twelve degrees and fifty-five minutes west one hundred and sixty and two tenths feet; thence running east forty feet from and parallel to the United States Military Reservation line seven hundred and five and three tenths feet to the easterly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and two; thence running north twelve degrees and fifty-two minutes east along the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and two, one hundred and five, one hundred and four, one hundred and twenty nine, and one hundred and forty-two, sixteen hundred and fifty-two and five tenths feet to the north easterly corner of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and four; thence running north thirteen degrees and twenty-two minutes east along the division line between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and forty-two, one hundred and forty-three, one hundred and forty-eight, one thousand and two tenths feet to the north-

westerly corner of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-eight; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-eight minutes east along the northerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-eight six hundred and sixty and seven tenths feet to the northeasterly corner thereof; thence running north thirteen degrees and thirty-one minutes east between Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and forty-nine and one hundred and seventy, eighty-five and eight tenths feet; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-five minutes east through Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and forty-nine forty feet from and parallel to the southerly line of Pueblo Lot numbered one hundred and sixty-nine, five hundred and five feet; thence running through blocks numbered one hundred and sixty, one hundred and sixty-eight and one hundred and sixty-seven of La Playa, and Pueblo Lots numbered one hundred and seventy-three, one hundred and seventy-four, and one hundred and seventy-eight, and through blocks numbered three, four, and five of Bronton, as follows: North twenty-seven degrees and thirty-one minutes east three hundred and thirty-eight and seven tenths feet; thence running south eighty-seven degrees and thirty-five minutes east two hundred and forty-seven and three tenths feet; thence running north seventy-two degrees and fifty-six minutes east forty-nine and seven tenths feet; thence running north forty-eight degrees and fifteen minutes east fifty feet; thence running north twenty-seven degrees and forty-one minutes east two hundred feet; thence running north fifty-five degrees and thirty-one minutes east two hundred and thirty-one and six tenths feet; thence running north forty degrees and twenty-seven minutes east one hundred and twenty-five and seven tenths feet; thence running north twenty

four degrees and thirty-five minutes east one hundred and eighty-five and five tenths feet; thence running north forty degrees and three minutes east two hundred and nine and five tenths feet; thence running north twenty-one degrees and two minutes east one hundred and seventy-six feet; thence running north forty-six degrees and forty-four minutes east three hundred and forty-seven and five tenths feet; thence running north thirty-nine degrees and forty-four minutes east eight hundred and seventy-two feet to the center line of Magnetic Avenue in Branton; thence running south seventy-six degrees and forty-two minutes east along the center line of Magnetic Avenue four hundred and twenty-four and three tenths feet to the center line of Main Street, New Roseville; that there will also be constructed, in constructing said street work over said line, twenty-two small ~~sub~~ culverts, the estimated cost of which completed is four hundred and twenty-two dollars in lawful money of the United States.

Also beginning at the intersection of a line forty feet north of the south line of University Avenue with the center line of Fifth Street; thence running north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-eight minutes west, parallel to the south line of University Avenue seven hundred and fifteen feet to the center line of Third Street; thence running through Pueblo Lot "A" north six hundred and twelve and two tenths feet; thence running north eighty-nine degrees and fifty-five minutes west, twelve hundred and sixty-two and eight tenths feet; thence running south seventeen degrees and forty-one minutes west one hundred and eighty-three feet; thence running south eighty-two degrees and thirty-seven minutes west one hundred and two feet; thence running north fifty-one degrees and forty-nine minutes west three

hundred and four feet to the center line of
 Washington street on the easterly boundary
 of Arnold and Choate's Addition; thence run-
 ning along the center line of Washington

fifty-nine, at which point over said ravine there will be constructed a wooden bridge sixteen feet wide and thirty-two feet long; also excepting that portion of said line where it crosses a ravine in said course "north seven degrees and twenty-six minutes east" in Pueblo Lot numbered twelve hundred and sixty-two near the south line of La Jolla Park, at which point there will be constructed a wooden bridge over said ravine sixteen feet wide and forty-eight feet long; also excepting that portion of said line where it crosses the bed of the Rose Canyon Creek in said course "south seventy-four degrees and forty-eight minutes west" near the north line of Pueblo Lot numbered seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, at which point over the bed of said creek there will be constructed a wooden bridge sixteen feet wide and one hundred and sixty feet long; that the estimated cost of the construction of said four wooden bridges is twenty-two hundred and forty-one dollars in lawful money of the United States; that there will also be constructed, in constructing said street work over said line, twenty-two small wooden culverts, the estimated cost of which completed is five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

 which point over said ravine there will be con-
 structed a wooden bridge sixteen feet wide and
 forty-eight feet long; also excepting that portion
 of said line where it crosses a ravine in said
 course "north eighty degrees and twenty-seven
 minutes east" being in the northeast quarter
 of Pueblo Lot numbered two hundred and eleven,
 at which point over said ravine there will
 be constructed a wooden bridge sixteen feet
 wide and thirty-two feet long; that the esti-
 mated cost of the construction of said three
 bridges completed is seven hundred and eighty-
 five dollars in lawful money of the United
 States; that there will also be constructed, in
 constructing said street work over said line,
 twenty-four small wooden culverts, the estimated
 cost of which completed is six hundred and
 ninety-eight dollars in lawful money of the
 United States.

That the construction of said street work
 will include the furnishing of all labor and
 material necessary in completing and finishing the

grading of said driveway and coating the same with four thousand barrels of crude petroleum; furnishing all labor and material necessary in completing and finishing said culverts and bridges ready for use; that the estimated cost of said street work, when so completed and ready for use in every particular, is the sum of thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that there is now no graded driveway over said line and route.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the construction of said street work by the said City is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of the construction of said street work will be thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby declared to be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the construction of said street work in said City, at the cost and for the sum of thirty-nine thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for that purpose.

Action Four. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition by the said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition of certain land and the construction of certain buildings by the said City of San Diego, for the use of the Fire Department of said City; said land being located in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California; that

the acquisition of said land and the construction of said improvements are more particularly described as follows, to wit:

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, within that district bounded on the north by "B" street, on the east by Eighth street, on the south by "D" street, and on the west by Seventh street. The estimated cost of said lot or piece of land being three thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number One, being a brick building with a pressed brick front, two stories high and ninety feet long and fifty feet wide. The lower story walls will be eight inches thick, and the upper story walls will be twelve inches thick. The lower story ceiling will be twelve feet high, and the upper story ceiling will be ten feet high. The lower story floor will consist of six inches of concrete with a two inch wearing surface of bitumen. The upper floor joists will be two inches thick and four turn inches wide, the upper ceiling joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The roof joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The building will have a flat tin roof with skylight. The walls and ceilings upstairs will be lathed and plastered, the walls and ceilings downstairs will be finished in wood. All framing lumber will be Oregon Pine, and all finishing lumber will be redwood. The estimated cost of said building completed is ten thousand five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows: "Document No. 3085. Filed Mar. 2, 1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk. Plans and Estimates of cost for Fire Engine House No 1," to which reference is hereby made for further

particulars.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep within that district bounded by "D" street on the north, Third street on the east, "F" street on the south, and Second street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is three thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Two. This building will be built on the same plan as said Fire Engine House Number One, except that the front will be constructed of common brick, and the ground floor walls and the lower floor will be finished in lumber. The estimated cost of said building completed is eighty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep within that district bounded by "I" street on the north, Eighth street on the east, "K" street on the south, and Seventh street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is eight hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Three, being a frame building two stories high, and sixty feet long by thirty feet wide. The lower story ceiling will be eleven feet six inches high, and the second story ceiling will be nine feet high. The building will be finished in rustic with a hip roof, eaved down stairs, and lathed and plastered up stairs. The joists of the lower floor will be two inches thick and twelve inches wide; the joists of the upper floor will be two inches thick and fourteen inches wide. The studding for the second floor outside will be two inches thick and four inches wide and on the inside two inches thick and three inches wide. The studding will be sixteen inches apart and all joists will be sixteen inches apart.

All rafters will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All ceiling joists will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All framing lumber will be Oregon Pine, and all finishing lumber redwood. Building will be painted inside and out with three coats of paint. The estimated cost of said building completed is thirty-two hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows:

"Document No. 3087, Filed Mar. 2, 1903. Geo. O. Goldman, City Clerk. Plans & Estimates of Cost of Fire Engine House No. 3. + 4. Presented to Council, and adopted March 2d, 1903." to which reference is hereby made for further particulars.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep, within that district bounded by Palm street on the north, Third street on the east, Nutmeg street on the south, and Second street on the west. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is nine hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Four. The estimated cost of said building completed is thirty-two hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. This building will be a frame building and constructed according to the same plan for the said Fire Engine House Number Three.

The acquisition of one building lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred and thirty-five deep, lo-

located on University Avenue between Seventh Street and Ninth Street. The estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is six hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. The construction upon this lot or piece of land of Fire Engine House Number Two. This building will be a frame building one story high, and sixty-one feet long by thirty-seven feet wide. It will be twelve feet from the ground floor to the ceiling. The floor joists will be two inches thick and twelve inches wide. The ceiling joists will be two inches thick and six inches wide. The studding will be two inches thick and four inches wide. The rafters will be two inches thick and four inches wide. All joists will be set sixteen inches apart, and all rafters will be set twenty-four inches apart. The building will be finished in rustic with a hip roof and will be lathed and plastered inside. The estimated cost of said building completed is twenty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States. Said building to be constructed according to the plan therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows:

"Document No. 3088. Filed Mar. 2 1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk. Plans & Estimates of Cost of Fire Engine House No 5. Presented to the Council, and adopted March 2d, 1903." to which reference is hereby made for further particulars.

The acquisition of one lot or piece of land fifty feet wide by one hundred feet deep located within that district bounded on the north by "H" street, on the east by Thirteenth street, on the south by "I" street, and on the west by Twelfth street. That the estimated cost of said lot or piece of land is eight hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That said City does not own any land within any one of said districts, nor any buildings, except one old building which is in a dilapidated condition and unfit for the use of said Fire Department.

ment.

That the estimated cost of the acquisition of said land and the furnishing of all labor and material for the construction of said buildings completed and ready for the use of the said Fire Department of said City is thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the acquisition of the said land and the construction of said buildings, for the use of the Fire Department of the said City of San Diego, is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of the acquisition of said land and the construction of the said buildings for the use of the said Fire Department will be thirty-seven thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared to be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the acquisition of the said land, and for the construction of said buildings at the cost and for the sum of thirty-seven thousand and dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purposes.

Section Five. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by the said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction by said City of a storm sewer for the collection and disposition of storm and surface water, consisting of an expanded metal covered conduit, commencing at a point where the west end of "B" street intersects the easterly shore line of the Bay of San Diego; thence running easterly along "B" street to Tenth street; thence

along Tenth street to Ash street; thence to the south line of the City Park, being on the same alignment as the B-Street Flume now in place. Said conduit, at the north end thereof, being six feet six inches deep and four feet ten inches wide on the inside; at Fourth street said conduit will be six feet six inches deep and six feet ten inches wide on the inside; and at the outlet at the west end of said conduit it will be twelve feet four inches wide and four feet deep on the inside. Said conduit will be constructed according to the plan therefor as shown by that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows:

"Communication City Engineer Estimate of Cost and Plans of "B" Street Conduit, Document No. 1054. Filed Dec. 11th 1902, Geo. L. Goldman, City Clerk. Presented to the Council and ordered filed, March 7th, 1903" to which reference is hereby made for further particulars. The construction of said storm sewer to include the furnishing of all labor and material in making all excavations and trenches, and laying and putting in place all concrete and other material, back filling the trenches and excavations, and completing the whole work in every particular so that the same will be ready for use in carrying the storm and surface water. That the estimated cost of said storm sewer, when so completed and finished is the sum of sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States. That there is now no storm sewer over said route, except an old wooden one which is in a dilapidated condition and unfit for the purpose of carrying said storm and surface water.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the construction of the said storm sewer, consisting of the said expanded metal concrete conduit, for the purpose of carrying off the surface and storm water, is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of the construction of the said conduit will be sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that

said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego: that it be and is hereby determined and declared to be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the construction of the said conduit at the cost and for the sum of sixty-six thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purpose.

Section Six. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the construction by said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the construction by said City of two frame bridges on "B" street, situated in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Two wooden bridges upon a driven pile foundation, each of which bridges will be one hundred and twelve feet long and twenty-four feet wide. The first bridge will extend across a ravine from a point on the said "B" street three hundred and seventy feet east of the east line of Twenty-seventh street to a point four hundred and eighty-two feet east of the said east line of Twenty-seventh street. The second bridge will extend across a ravine from a point four hundred and twenty-eight feet east of the east line of Twenty-eighth street to a point five hundred and forty feet east of the said east line of Twenty-eighth street. The center line of each of said bridges will be coincident with the center line of the said "B" street. That there are now no bridges at either of said points. Said bridges to be constructed according to the plans and specifications therefor set forth in that certain instrument on file in the office of the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, endorsed as follows:

"Document No. 2955. Filed Feb. 12-1903. Geo. D. Goldman, City Clerk, By N. W. Vincent, Deputy. Communication City Engineer Plans, Estimates, etc., for the grading of

"B" Street from 22d to 30th st. Presented to The Council and ordered filed February 16th, 1903." To which reference is hereby made for further particulars. That the estimated cost of the construction of each of said bridges completed and ready for use is twenty-five hundred dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that the estimated cost of both of said bridges completed and ready for use is five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the construction of both of said bridges is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of the construction of the said bridges will be five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and that said sum is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared to be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the construction of said bridges at the cost and for the sum of five thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purpose.

Section Seven. That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of the City of San Diego, California, and of the inhabitants thereof, demand the acquisition by the said City of San Diego of a certain municipal improvement, that is to say, the acquisition of that certain building, and the land upon which the same is constructed, located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Fifth street and "G" street in the City of San Diego, California, being the east northerly part of lot lettered "L" in block numbered eighty-eight of Norton's Addition in the City of San Diego, California, and the building constructed thereon, for the municipal purposes and use of a City Hall;

said building being a four story brick building, and now occupied by said City for the municipal purposes and uses of a City Hall in the said City of San Diego.

That the said City does not now own a City Hall, but has a written contract with the owner of said land and building whereby the said City may acquire the title in and to said land and building by paying the sum of five hundred dollars per month for the use of said building until the month of June, Nineteen Hundred and Four, and then paying the sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States for the title to said property; that the said sum of five hundred dollars per month for the use of said land and building can be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City until the month of June, Nineteen Hundred and Four, but the said sum of fourteen thousand dollars cannot be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City; that the estimated cost of the acquisition of the said building by the said City of San Diego is the sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States.

That it be and is hereby determined and declared that the acquisition of said real property and said building thereon for the use of the said City of San Diego as a City Hall, and for the chambers of the Board of Aldermen and the Board of Delegates of the Common Council of said City, and for the offices of the municipal officers of said City, is necessary and convenient to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of the municipality of ~~said~~ said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared that the cost of such municipal improvement, viz., the acquisition of said real property and the building constructed thereon, will be fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States; that said sum will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said City of San Diego; that it be and is hereby determined and declared to

be the intention of the legislative branch of the government of the said City of San Diego to take proceedings for the acquisition of said real property and the building constructed thereon at the cost and for the sum of fourteen thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States, and to incur an indebtedness in said sum by the issuance of bonds for said purpose.

Section Eight. That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by the said Common Council, and its approval by the Mayor of said City.

Section Nine. That the City Clerk of the said City of San Diego, California, be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, immediately after the approval of this Resolution, to publish or cause the same to be published three times in the city official newspaper of said City, to-wit: the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

Section Ten. That the said City Clerk of said City shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution by a vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Board of Aldermen of the Common Council of the said City of San Diego, and by a vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Board of Delegates of the Common Council of the said City of San Diego.

Passed and adopted by the Board of Delegates of the City of San Diego, California, this 16th day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Three, and signed in open session thereof by the President of said Board March 16th Nineteen Hundred and Three.

That the City Engineer of the City of San Diego, California, be and she is hereby authorized and directed to furnish to this Common Council a careful estimate of the number of cubic yards of excavation and the number of cubic yards of embankment necessary to bring Twenty fourth Street in the City of San Diego, California, from the South line of "K" Street to the North line of "N" Street, including the sidewalks thereof, to its official grade and cross section including all intersections of streets between said points not already graded to the official grade thereof, excepting such portion of the said Twenty fourth Street and the said intersections of streets between said points required by law, to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon.

Said estimate to be for each block separately. That said estimate shall be made in duplicate, one copy of which shall be kept on file in the office of the said City Engineer and shall, during office hours, be accessible for inspection to any person who may desire to inspect the same; that the said estimate shall include plans and specifications and estimates of the cost of any and all culverts which it may be necessary to construct in doing said work.

That the Superintendent of Streets of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish to this Common Council a description of the place or places where the surplus earth to be removed in doing said work shall be placed and deposited.

Joint Resolution No. 1767

Be It Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

That it be and is hereby determined by this Common Council that Front Street from the North Curb line of Grape Street to the South line of Laurel Street, be improved between said points by the construction of sidewalks and curbs thereon, in accordance with the specifications for such work as contained in Ordinance No. 1140, approved June 17th, 1902.

That the owners of property fronting upon said Street between said points shall have until the 1st day of August 1904, within which to construct sidewalks and curbs thereon at private contract.

That the City Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a profile of the sidewalk of said Street between said points, and furnish to any person applying therefor an estimate of the number of cubic yards of excavation or embankment necessary to bring any portion of the sidewalk of said Street to its official grade.

That on said 1st day of August 1904 said City Engineer shall furnish this Council a detailed report showing the amount of sidewalking and curbing yet to be done on said Street between said points.

That the City Clerk advertise the fact that said improvement has been decided upon, and that property owners desiring to construct sidewalks and curbs by private contract must complete said work on or before the said 1st day of August, 1904.
