#### RESOLUTION NO. 2759.

On the 29th day of July, 1846, Captain (afterwards General) John C. Fremont landed at San Diego from the United States Ship Cyana with a battalion of volunteers and raised our national ensign at a point within the present corporate limits of the city, known locally as "Old Town". This act of sovereignty was accomplished without any resistance on the part of the people or forces found there, and was one among the last steps taken in bringing Alta California into the dominion of the United States of America.

The importance of this event will be more greatly appreciated when we remember that by the treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, concluding our War with Mexico, the international boundary was fixed only about twenty miles south of the point where the stars and stripes were first planted by Fremont and along a line which was deflected quite considerably to the southward from the mouth of the Gila River in order to carry it so far south from San Diego.

In commemoration of that act, so important to the people of Southern California, and especially to the people of this city, it is recommended by the Common Council of the City of San Diego that the sixtieth anniversary of this auspicious event be celebrated by the people of the city in a becoming manner;

And, further, that in order to permanently fix the point where the flag of our country was first raised in San Diego, a suitable monument of granite be placed on the site, the expense thereof to be met by popular subscription of the citizens of San Diego.

Be it Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of San Diego:

That the Hon. Mayor of said City, be and he is hereby authorized to appoint such committee as he may deem advisable to take charge of the arrangements for the celebration of the 60th anniversary on the 29th day of July, 1906, being the 60th anniversary of the raising of the United States Flag in the City of San Diego. And that said Committee so appointed shall have authority to appoint sub committees as it may seem necessary to the end that a celebration be held on said date, commending in a substantial manner the patriotic spirit and plans of the Associated Veterans of the Mexican War.

That the old Fort known as Fort Stockton be restored as near as possible, to its original appearance and condition, and a suitable plat of land on which it stands be set apart for the purpose of commemorating the event, and for the further purpose of being made into a small Park, beautified and attractive, as an object of interest commensurate with the sentiment worthy of the spot so sacred to every citizen of San Diego and Southern California.

That University Avenue in the City of San Diego, California, including the sidewalks thereof, from the east line of University Boulevard to the east line of said city including all intersections of streets between said points and the sidewalks of such intersections (excepting such portions of the said University avenue and the said intersections of streets, betweem said points, required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon and excepting the intersections of cross-streets already graded or ordered graded intersecting said University avenue between said points) be graded to the official grade thereof according to the specifications therefor contained in Ordinance No. 2061 of the ordinances of the said City of San Diego, entitled, "An Ordinance Providing Specifications for the Grading of Streets in the City of San Diego, California,"

approved on the 6th day of June, 1905.

Also, that as a part of said work there be constructed upon said \*University avenue between the points thereon hereinbefore mentioned, the following bridges and culverts, towit:

- (a) A combination bridge across said avenue at Georgia street;

Estimate: of yardage Drawings and Specifications for bridges and culverts in grading of University avenue, from University Blvd. to City Limits", and copies of which plans, drawings and specifications are on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City, and the said plans, drawings and specifications for the construction of said bridges and culverts and all the appertaining structures as shown thereby, and, by reference thereto, said plans, drawings and specifications are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

That the contractor or contractors to whom a contract shall be awarded for doing said work shall take and remove from the streets to be graded all surplus dirt and material which may result from the doing of said work.

That all said work shall be done under the direction and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets of said City, and the materials used shall be to the satisfaction of said Superintendent of streets.

That the work of improvement hereinbefore mentioned is, in the opinion of said City Council, of more tham local and ordinary public benefit, and the expense of said work or improvement is made chargeable upon the district hereinafter described, and said Common Council does hereby declare said district to be the district benefited by said work or improvement and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. Said district is described as follows, to-wit: All that real property lying and being in the said City of San Diego, and included within the exterior boundary lines described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the southwest corner of Block 190 in University Heights, thence southerly in a straight line to the northwest corner of lot 8 in that certain Block lying to the south of said Block 190 and shown upon the map of University Heights hereinafter referred to, as Block 6, thence easterly, following the courses of the northerly lines
